CHRISTMAS 2008

This Christmas is filled with concern, doubt, and even fear by many

people. We either know or have heard of people who are experiencing difficult times now. Many are concerned about the economic and political future of the country. Others are more immediately concerned or fearful about keeping their

jobs, paying bills, or paying ever increasing taxes at all governmental levels. These concerns are taking away some of the joy that should be experienced during this time of celebration.

Before letting today's uncertainty overtake our celebrating the birth of Christ, let's put things into perspective by looking at the story of Christ's birth.


What was the reason for Joseph and Mary going to Bethlehem? It was a requirement made by Emperor Augustus to have everyone listed in record books. It was a census, and we can assume the census was certain to

have tax consequences. This wasn't a simple act. The people had to go to

their ancestral hometown and couldn't register simply where they lived at that time. Since Joseph was from the family of David, they had to travel to Bethlehem, where David had lived. This was no easy task. The roads were little more than trails by

today's standards, and the whole country was on the move to meet the ruler's decree. The fact that Mary was expecting was not an excuse to not go. The stress and uncertainty they experienced just with the travel and lodging issues had to be tremendous.

Many people envisioned a different kind of King, one whose arrival would be told to the priests first. That wasn't the case. It was lowly shepherds who were first told of His birth. He wasn't born in a palace, but a stable where animals were fed. Christ's family was not the elite political or religious leaders. They were humble

people of great faith. They would be considered to be on the lower end of the socio-economic ladder or, at best, in the lower middle income by today's standards. Their normal everyday life was one of uncertainty on a daily basis.

These weren't the only stresses and uncertainty in their lives. As we read in the second verse of Matthew, Magi's from another country come to worship the new King. Herod was made aware of this and was fearful of losing his political power to this new king, so the king applied the tried and true technique of political deception by telling the Magi's he, too, wanted to worship the child. He asked that the Magi's return and tell him where the child could be found. In Matthew verse 2:12 it states, "And having been warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, they returned to their country by another route." There was uncertainty, doubt, and fear that followed not only the immediate family of Jesus, but those who came to worship Him.

They were further instructed to stay there because Herod was planning to kill the child. Imagine having the joy of a newborn and being told you had to flee your home to save the life of your child. The fear and uncertainty the parents of Jesus experienced as they left their country to a different country with literally only the clothes on their backs was enormous.

It gets worse for those families still living in Bethlehem and the surrounding area with boys younger than 2. Herod had them killed in hopes of killing this new king who was a threat to his political power. The people who were subjected to the rule of Herod were living in constant uncertainty and fear that was indeed realized.

Today, although our concerns are real, those who lived in Bethlehem and the people who were associated with Christ's birth lived in a state of constant fear and uncertainty. Christ was born in uncertain and deadly
