President's Column . . . Claren Kotrla **INCREMENTALISM**

Beware the gentle embrace of incrementalism. It can be so very subtle

that we aren't even aware it is happening. Many of vou have heard of the story about the frog that was cooked. He was sitting in a pot of water while the flame underneath was gradually increased. He didn't detect the change and was eventu-

ally boiled (since frogs are cold blooded this can actually happen). The frog didn't sense any change in the temperature because he became accustomed to the incremental increase in temperature. We as individuals, as a denomination, and as a nation need to be aware of this phenomenon.

When we observe things over time we see a lot of examples of how we have accepted incremental changes that we would never have accepted if those changes had all happened at once. A prime example is what we

observe on television. In the name of free speech and fairness there is gra-

tuitous violence, sex, and foul language today. That didn't happen overnight. It occurred in small incremental steps and today is accepted.

The marginalization of Christianity is happening the same way. In the name of fairness to other

religions and those who don't believe in anything, Christian practices in public are being reduced through political correctness as well as intimidation. The spirit of "in place of Christ" is growing incrementally in America. A complaint by even one individual can cause recognition of Christianity to be squashed, usually because of fear of a lawsuit. When I was growing up none of this would have been tolerated, but because the change has been gradual, and in some cases carefully orchestrated, we accept it today.

In incremental ways by trying to be fair or for safety reasons we accept small changes that in the back of our mind we know to be wrong but just aren't worth dealing with. Then, when too many incremental changes have taken place, it is too late to do what is right. We are sometimes lulled or intimidated into accepting false choices, a red herring if you will. We are told that if we don't recognize something as ok we are not reasonable or are mean spirited, racist, or hypocrites or worse. We respond to the false choice by accepting what we believe is a little wrong, but don't want to look bad at that moment. We fail to realize that the choice we are being asked to make isn't as simple as presented. There can be many ways to accomplish a particular goal. It is seldom that we have to do anything only one way. Eventually, through incremental steps, we accept what we know to be false and become part of the problem rather than part of the solution.

Another story of how people accept things incrementally that they would never accept if the whole truth were known involves a camel in the

desert. There were a group of Bedouins in their tent in the desert waiting for a very rare rain storm to stop. The camel that was standing outside in the rain stuck his head into the tent and asked if he could keep his nose in the tent since he didn't want to catch cold and be sick when they needed him. Of course the answer was yes. Shortly the camel asked if he could put his whole head in since the rain was getting into his ears and it could cause him to lose balance when they rode him. Of course the answer was yes. Later the camel noted that his hump was getting soggy and he didn't want them to have to ride on a soggy hump. He asked if he could put his hump inside the tent. Since they had come this far they said why not. Once again they said yes. The final request from the camel was to allow his small tail into the tent. It was getting wet and that would make it difficult for him to swat the flies off while they were traveling. He didn't want to accidentally knock one of them off with his heavy wet tail. Of course they said yes. The tent was crowded so the Bedouins went outside in the rain and the camel was nice and dry in

the tent. Both the Bedouins and the camel were happy. Are we sometimes like the Bedouins in this story? When we give up our Christian beliefs to accommodate others, that is exactly what we are like.

Reviewing cases of people who get lost shows a series of choices that were made caused it to happen rather than one major mistake. In incremental steps, usually starting even before entering the wilderness, the stage is set. The individual through ignorance or over confidence starts out ill prepared. Then as they get further and further along they continue to make incrementally poor choices. All of a sudden, they realize they are lost and panic sets in. At that point things can and often get really bad.

Once we start down the incremental path, we then have to compensate for our earlier choices by making adjustments and excuses. Then we have to justify those choices as they

become more obviously wrong. At an intellectual level we rationalize those choices by "putting ourselves in their shoes" or excusing our own poor actions. We may simply go into a state of denial and believe that it wasn't a series of bad choices that got us into the predicament in which we find ourselves.

We as Christians are vulnerable to the same kind of incremental mistakes discussed here in our spiritual and daily life. By being prepared through prayer and knowledge of God's teaching we can stay on the correct path and avoid the fear and panic of being lost. A verse we are using this year at Austin Brethren Church may be helpful in avoiding incremental mistakes. It is Proverbs 3:4-6 and reads as follows: "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding, but in all your ways acknowledge Him and He shall direct your path."

Dr. Jiri Carda, Pastor Emeritus of the Protestant Church of the Czech Brethren, died after a long illness at the Diakonia home for the elderly in Krabcice, the Czech Republic. Dr. Carda had visited some of the congregations of the Brethren in Texas, including the historic Wesley Brethren Church. He and his wife, Marie, graciously hosted and served as guides for many Texas Brethren who traveled to the Czech Republic over the years.

Surviving Dr. Carda is his wife Marie, three children – Petr, Marta,

and Jan – and a sister and her children.

He went to be with his Lord on January 2nd of this year, and his memorial service was on January 10th from the Protestant Czech Brethren Church in Horni Cermna, when he had served as pastor for 40 years.




The theme for this month's section is LOVE. The Bible Verse is Matthew 22:39 "And the second is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself."

Parent's Lagoon





Is it okay to read the book Twilight and go to the movie?

Of course, the most important answer is, What do your parent say? It is a very popular movie and book series. (Twilight is the first in a series of four books and possibly 4 movies). But, here is what some trusted Christian advisers have to say about this book and movie.

It is difficult to write just a movie review about a movie that isn't just a movie, but rather part of a tall tale that doesn't end at twilight, or even the dark of night. It goes beyond into the realm of the eternal—something not really hinted at onscreen...yet. One Twilight t-shirt being sold proclaims, "Forbidden fruit tastes the best." And that's certainly one of the film's underlying themes. This isn't about me beating up Twilight for being about vampires, though. There are positives in it that bear repeating: The Cullens refuse to be party to murder even when it's their "nature" to kill and feed off humans. Edward consistently controls his own blood lust around his classmates and Bella. He cares for her. He protects her. Bella offers up her life for her mom. But there's enough negative undercurrent even in this first outing to justify some pretty serious conservations afterwards for those families that decide to defer their better judgment—which would normally push vampire movies out of bounds—and go ahead and see the show. The positivity of Edward and Bella's abstinence needs to be tempered with a discussion about what's so very wrong with them "sleeping" together and him sneaking in her room. There's an important life lesson lurking in Bella's obstinance. But don't look for Twilight to unpack it for you.

High school students may come to 1 week of senior high camp or to the 2-week Hus School program for leadership training OR they may come for all 3 weeks combined. The two events will be planned in conjunction with one another, so that topics studied at the camp will carry over into the Hus School program. The Hus School theme this year will be Missions and Ministries.

Remember as you discuss Hus School that students are encouraged to come for 3 summers to gain the full realm of study. One year we address Personal and Spiritual Development, one year Prayer and Worship, and one year Missions and Ministries. These are all aspects that were covered in the past when Hus School was 4-6 weeks long. As it has been scaled back to 2 weeks, we have tried to still cover the topics, but now over a 3-year experience. From various conversations, I understand that not all parents or all churches have understood this process in the past few years and have been reluctant to send youth to Hus School for more than one year. We encourage just that. To have the full realm of courses and leadership experiences, we want the students to come multiple years. Now, that's not to say it's a requirement in any way. If someone is available only one summer, then we encourage attendance for one year.

Dear friends.

The Lord's Supper does not usually come with dessert, but today it did. Today, it came with a birthday cake. Today, 9 of us women squished into a car and drove 20 minutes out of town to celebrate the birthday of an old lady named Linda. Linda is not sure how old she is since her parents never filled out a birth certificate, but I place her somewhere near 90. She says definitely 74, but that's not the point. For years now, Linda has lived

prone on a straw mat in a little tin shack with cows tied outside her door and a goat pen across the yard. She has not sat upright for years. Shriveled and tiny, toothless and bedridden, she has a huge callous on her back and on her left elbow where she has scrunched herself around the shack keeping herself, her clothes, and her room clean and tidy. When you enter, there is no smell, no mess. She has a long bamboo stick that she uses to reach into the corners. This is some lady.

Each of us in turn kneels down on a piece of newspaper she keeps by her mat, and we greet her Mexican style, a hug and a kiss on the cheek. She is pleased to see us. It's her birthday.

Today she is going to be baptized. She has committed herself to God and wants to do all that she can do to show that she is serious about this. Aide, who has visited her nearly every week for over 4 years now, bringing her food, caring for her small needs, and leading her to God, lovingly kneels beside her, takes the bandana off her head (she has no hair), and with a simple prayer, pours water over her head. Teresa leads us in a song. We pray. Linda prays... "God, I can't see you. But I know you are always here..."

We share the Lord's Supper there together in that shack. Tears glisten. Linda blesses us with her quiet, chirpy voice. Her bright eyes cherish us. My friend Binisa says, "I've never experienced the Lord's Supper like this before." And that doesn't even include the cake.

Afterwards, we all take pictures with Linda. She wants lots of copies to give to all her relatives. She wants a picture of the cake, and of her eating it, too. We sing "Las Mañanitas" in our best voices and cheer at the end.

This is her day.

When we leave, Soledad kills a poisonous spider making its nest in one of the slats near the doorway. Death and life lurk so close, here in this place.

As Aide has hoped in bringing us here with her today, all of us in our minds are wondering how to serve this beautiful woman better. We are all proud of her. She has won us. Her name, "Lovely" in Spanish, suits her.

We file out past the cows and the goats to our car. The cake was good. The time was holy. Through a little square hole in the tin behind her bed she waves us all goodbye, and that is the final image I see, a little shriveled hand vigorously bidding me goodbye, like a final benediction, like the icing on the cake.

Happy Chinese New Year, it's the year of the bull and all of you born in '97,'85,'73,'61,'49,'37,'25,'13... it's your year! Last Sunday night was New Years Eve, and we were woke up at midnight by what sounded like a war zone roar of fireworks. Zach and Ian amazingly slept through it. We are getting pretty good at dealing with all the noise and smelly incense since this is our 5th time experiencing it.

Since we wrote you last we have continued to work on establishing an English training center. It will be a company, not a school. We praise the Lord that He has helped us to rent an office, make signs and business cards,

advertise, and even teach one week of classes. We had 6 students made up of 3-6 year olds. By the end of the week they could understand and sortof say things like: "The man is jumping, the duck is yellow, I'm 4 years old." Next week we will hold more classes for middle school youth and adults, too. We have been given permission to go ahead with our teaching, but the government paperwork is not vet finished. Our co-worker has gone to 2 of the 8 government offices that we need permission from. The government really seems to want to make it work for us as they feel this province is behind in English. We are currently praying for some of you to come teach English with us for a year or so. If interested, just let us know.



On the highway between here and our former city we have twice come upon a traffic accident that has just taken place between a young Dai man on a motorcycle with no helmet and a truck or car. The young boy is always dead in the street when we pass by. Drugs, AIDS, violence, prostitution, idol worship... it's all here, and people seem numb to it.

However, He is here, too! We feel Him in our family worship times, we feel Him calling us to pray, we feel Him telling us to seek Him, and we feel Him in the blessing of good neighbors and new friends. Hallelujah!

Today Samuel asked me when Jesus will come back. I told him that no one knows, but the Bible says that we must be ready. He asked what it means to be ready. What a great question. In this new year for China, please join us in seeking the Lord on behalf of the Dai people that they may be ready for the Lord's return, His glorious coming. May we all be ready, even so, come, Lord Jesus.
