President's Column . . . Claren Kotrla TIC TAC TOE

Are you a tic-tac-toe Christian? When we were young we learned how

to play a game called tictac-toe. It is a simple game where you have nine squares on a piece of paper. In playing the game you mark in the squares an "X" or an "O" in order to get three in a row. The opponent places their marks in an attempt to

block you from getting three in a row. After a while you figure out how to play the game to insure you don't lose and most of the games end in a tie.


Later you learn to play checkers, where there are many more squares creating many more options on a board with numerous pieces to play. You advance the checkers toward the opponent with the goal of jumping the other person's checkers and capturing them on your way to get a crown. With this game you have to plan and develop a more complex strategy to get across the board while

losing fewer checkers than your opponent and getting the crown. Once you get a piece crowned, that piece has more ability and you can gain the advantage. This game requires a lot more study, thought, and planning than playing tic-tac-toe. A clear

winner is determined at the end of the game.

Some people then learn to play chess. Although you use the same board you use for checkers, this is a game that is much more complicated than either checkers or tic-tac-toe. Each piece has specific moves it can make. The lowest ranking piece is a pawn, which can only move forward but captures on the diagonal. The knight can move one square forward or backward and two to the side or

two squares forward or backward and one to the side. The bishop can move only diagonally, but as far as needed, while the castle does the same vertically and parallel. The strongest piece is the queen, who can move in any direction and cross as many squares and desired. The object of the game is to place the opponent's king in check, which means he can't move without being captured. This move is called "checkmate". On the defense you must protect your king from being placed in check. The person who places their opponent's king in check is the winner. The strategy is complex, requiring the players to adjust to constantly moving pieces and planning several moves ahead. Some of the best players can determine they will win many moves ahead of their opponent.


Now back to 'tic-tac-toe'. Remember the verse that reminds us that as children we thought as children? Our lives as Christians are a lot like both the game and the verse. Some of us become so comfortable playing tictac-toe Christians we never move on to becoming checker-playing Christians, and certainly not chess-playing Christians. We learn the basic stories in the Bible, and might even be able to pick out a phrase or verse to justify our basic yet simple belief. As a Tic-Tac-Toe Christian we learn that we should love our neighbor as ourselves, but just as in The Parable of the Good Samaritan found in Luke 10:25-37, we don't understand who our neighbor really is. Tic-tac-toe Christians know they shouldn't murder, but use their tongue to inflict pain and unhappiness on others. They aren't aware of James 3, which talks about the need to tame the tongue. Gossip and boastful speech can be just and deadly. We all need to study and learn in our Christian growth so we can better understand what it is to be a true Christian. In many ways becoming that "true" Christian is more of a life-long journey than a final destination.

Not everyone is at the same stage in their Christian growth, and for some individuals being the tic-tac-toe Christian is to be celebrated. They are

beginning their first steps to becoming that chess-player Christian. Those who have advanced to being the checker-playing Christians and chessplayer Christians have the responsibility to encourage and help the tictac-toe Christians grow in their faith and understanding of the Gospel. Doing so isn't only good for those you nurture in Christian growth, but it is what the Bible encourages us to do. Hebrews 6:10 tells us that "God is not unjust; He will not forget your work and the love you have shown Him as you have helped His people and continue to help them." What better way to do this than to help others in their Christian growth?


As I took the vow to honor God, the Unity of the Brethren, and to

me that this life is not about me but about God and being His willing vessel to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ – to preach the Word.


Over the last five years my growing edge has been sharpened several times. I have studied, completed 4 units of Clinical Pastoral Education at St. Joseph Regional Health Center, a battle with cancer, and recently the illness of both my parents which resulted in hospital stays and then a skilled nursing facility, Lampstand, for both of them. It was at Lampstand that my mother died suddenly on the evening of November 6 shortly after a wonderful visit with her and my father. We made plans for them to come home with us soon, Mama never made it.

On the day of her funeral, my father moved in with us. Unfortu-

nately, he has recently been placed on Hospice Brazos Valley service due to severe Alzheimer's disease. Three days before my mother died, we ordered my Ordination robe and stole. She wanted the best for her daughter – her only child. It was a great disappointment that neither my mother nor my father were able to attend my ordination service in the flesh. But, I know without a doubt that everyone that I have loved deeply and are in heaven were dancing on that day. God continues to give me peace and comfort as I go through the process of grieving the death of my mother and my father's serious illness.

It is my prayer that each of us will remain committed to spreading the Good News that gives others hope. And, to our pastors, don't ever forget to "preach the Word!"

Well, the rain has finally stopped. Praise God. Our house and our clothes don't smell much like mold anymore. We are glad to be back in Puerto Cabezas again after a brief stay in Costa Rica. We have come back refreshed and ready to meet the challenges of the next six months.

During the last couple of weeks we have been working on a small business for our friends Exdel and Victoria. They have a small child, which we are her Godparents, and Victoria can't get away to work, so Eunice is going to help her work at home. They live right

near the church and people pass by all day long, so we are going to put a tortilla stand outside her house. Although, tortillas aren't as popular as in Mexico, they are a growing demand here. Eunice tried the idea out at our house first and we had moderate success. Our house is a little out of they way, and we know that with high foot traffic and visibility the business will take off. We are hoping it is enough for them to cover basic food costs and allow them to catch up on some debts. Last week Eunice and I went out with our neighbor to cut down posts to make the stand. Next week we are going out to collect the palm fronds for the roof. We are going to cook the tortillas on an old oil

barrel, like they do in Mexico. So, as you can see, there is very little upfront capital, and the profit margin is quite good.



Apart from the business, we are staying busy taking care of our plants and continuing to help out with our local church. This week our youth are going to visit the jail for the first time. A neighbor of ours accidently shot his ex-wife in the head (no joke) and we are going to visit him as well as the other inmates. Hopefully we can have an impact with our time there.

Eunice is staying busy working at the clinic three days a week. She has learned a lot about treating people in a non-city environment. Also, with limited medicine available we are trying to find out all we can about natural remedies.

I hope everyone enjoys their Thanksgiving, if we could find a turkey we would eat it. It will probably be a feast of ham, I mean spam, and the ever delicious rice and beans. Have an extra piece of pumpkin pie for us. We are very thankful for our marriage, our hot peppers in our garden (a little taste of Mexico), our friends at home and abroad, our families, and our spiritual partners. 

Report on Fall Youth Retreat






