President's Column . . . Claren Kotrla GOING WITH THE FLOW

We have each heard these or similar words telling us not to complain or

fuss. It isn't worth it, just go along for now. We usually hear this after we hear our conscience questioning what is happening and our raising the question. Sometime we go along and sometimes we don't.

Going along with the

flow while rafting or canoeing down a river is one place where it is important to pay attention to 'going with the flow'. The following example will illustrate the risks of going with the flow. This example is when I and several others were on a one-week rafting trip down the Grand Canyon. We were on the river during a major water release from upstream. The water level was high and the current was flowing fast, making for an exciting trip. As we looked downstream, we noticed that there was a large whirlpool on the right. Large here means big enough to swallow a boxcar. I

noticed a tree floating into it and not resurfacing.

Throughout the trip the guide was operating the small motor looking downstream and watching how the current was flowing. The reason is that the flow doesn't always take you down a river by the safest route. It often takes you into a

whirlpool or against a ledge next to the bank or under old downed trees that can trap you and even drown you. You counter these risks by making adjustments far ahead of where the current becomes too strong to avoid the dangers. If you wait until you are pulled into the current, it may be too late. You need to make adjustments before you are going with the flow and before it becomes too strong for you to fight it. Our guide began early on getting out of the main flow as far to the left of the whirlpool as he could. He opened the throttle on the small outboard all the way about a

half mile before we got to the whirlpool. At first that might seem a bit radical or the wrong thing to do, but he wanted as much momentum to pass the whirlpool as possible.

As we approached the whirlpool, its strength became even more noticeable and the flow was pulling us in its direction. The guide maintained his course away from the pull and as close as he could safely go to the other side. As we came parallel to the large whirlpool we could feel the tug of the current pulling us into the whirlpool, and even as we passed it we could feel our raft slowing, but still fighting the pull to the whirlpool.

Thanks to our guide's ability to look far downstream and maintain a safe course, we went past the danger. Had the guide gone with the flow or waited until we were in imminent danger, we would not have been able to escape the grasp of the whirlpool. Had he not been looking downstream and noticing the increasing pull of the current toward danger, we could have been drowned. He didn't wait until danger was imminent. He made corrections to our course on the river while he still had the ability to do so.

Life is like this raft trip down the

river in the Grand Canyon. As we journey down the river of life, we as Christians can't wait until the danger to us is imminent. Doing so may mean that it is too late to maintain or to change course.

In life the current of ideas and words can quickly or gently pull us into the danger if we simply go with the flow. Good words such as "fair", "equal", "inclusiveness", "diverse", "acceptance", and, "peace" are just some of the words that can be used in everyday life to slowly pull us into going with the flow of leaving Christianity and Christ. In religious circles the good sounding words like "pluralism" and "ecumenicalism", or other "isms" can be used the same way to pull us from our Biblical teachings into allowing non-Christian beliefs to be accepted by Christians. Like the river example, we need to look down our river of life and take what might be seen as a radical move to chart a course that avoids the whirlpools that can take our eternal life, regardless of the ease of simply "going with the flow".

In John, Christ makes it clear we have one way to salvation. In verse 10:9 Christ says "I am the gate; whoever enters through Me will be saved."

In verse 14:6 it is clarified further when Christ says, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me." Today we hear that this may not be true, or that if we read the Bible correctly we will find that there are many ways to salvation. 2 Peter 2:1 and 2 warns us of false teachers and their destruction. It says: But there were also false prophets among the people, just as there will be false teachers among you. They will secretly introduce destructive heresies. even denying the sovereign Lord who brought them - bringing swift destruction on themselves".

Being a Christian doesn't mean we have to accept everything everyone else says or does just to be nice. Christ said in Mathew 10:34 while speaking to the 12 apostles, "Do not suppose that I have come to bring peace to the earth. I did not come to bring peace, but a sword." Strong words, but they convey the importance of Christ as The Savior. He wanted the disciples to stand for Him and not be weak.

In "The Theology of the Czech Brethren from Hus to Comenius" by Craig D. Atwood in 2009, on pages

363 and 364 he quotes Fouesk. Fouesk stated that the Unity was already on the road to extinction before the battle of White Mountain (1620), and the ease with which the Brethren joined Reformed Churches was evidence that their church had lost its distinction. Without arguing the specifics of how or why Fouske drew this conclusion, it is worth noting that by trying to blend in we sometimes lose our core beliefs. Today we are faced with Christians losing their distinction as Christians by allowing themselves to go with the flow in many ways as individuals, as churches, and as a denomination. We counter that risk by keeping our beliefs based in the Bible, continuing to be prayerful, spiritually focused, and Christ centered.

visit with them. I asked Bro. Larry Koslovsky to join me for a visit.

We had the opportunity to visit with members of this group ranging in age from teens to a couple in their 80s. The people we met were teachers, other professionals, craftsmen, students, and retired individuals. The members were from several communities in the area, and had previously been members of several different Moravian Churches. Some had long ancestral relationships within the Moravian Denomination. In all, we met with over two dozen individuals, individually and in small groups.

We also met with their covering pastor, Rev. B. Moorefield, who is a licensed minister in North Carolina. He has extensive experience with startup churches and is respected within this group of Christians.

The core reason that these people, who number between a couple dozen to several dozen, wish to join with the

When the Moravian Church signed the full communion agreement with the Episcopalian church, this group believes the Moravian Church is seen to agree with that position.

This group believes that only Christ is our Savior. After completing extensive research, they believe that the Unity of the Brethren holds their Christcentered belief, also. When I asked why they didn't simply start their own independent church as a standalone church, they had three simple reasons for wanting to join with us. The three reasons were historical foundation, free will, and the essential that Christ is the Savior. This was the central theme among the people we visited with regardless of their age or backgound. They are preparing documents and a formal request to join with the Unity of the Brethren at this year's Convention.

This is only a brief summary of the visit Bro. Larry and I had with these Christians from Friday afternoon, February 25, through Monday noon, February 28, 2011. Although there may be additional details and questions, the ones we have identified can readily be addressed. We found that this group, who identify themselves as Christ Covenant Church, are strong in their Christian beliefs, are spiritually focused, and Christ centered.

We find no reason that they wouldn't be able to be received by the Unity of the Brethren at our July 2011 Convention.

The Unity's Foreign Missions Conference – February 26, 2011


Participants at the Foreign Missions Conference, entitled T.E.A.M. ("Together Everybody Achieves

More"), was held on February 26. Information shared included the work in the Czech Republic, Moravian Disaster Relief Efforts, and updates on the work of the four missionary couples currently being supported by the Unity of the Brethren.

Pastor Linda Chandler served as facilitator of the event. David Miller, chairman of the Unity Missions Board, spoke about Missions and God's Word. He explained that when Jesus touched individual lives, those who believed in Him went on to share the knowledge with others. That is to say, they became missionaries.

Tom Prochazka, administrator for Fields of Faith Ministries, clearly stated the Gospel as "Christ died, was buried, rose from the dead, and individu-





als must believe this in order to be saved. Tom explained that the ultimate goal of Fields of Faith is to set up a church planting team in each of the 14 provinces of the Czech Republic. Such teams would be patterned after the work of Pastor Pavel and Stana Kozak, who began their work in Decin, Bohemia, with outdoor evangelism on the streets and in the parks of the city. As individuals were converted, a small leadership of a group church formed. After training some of these individuals to take over the leadership of the group at Decin, Pastor Pavel and Stana have now moved to Zlin, Moravia, to repeat the process of direct one-on-one evangelism and beginning another church group there. Once they have trained people to become leaders in Zlin, the Kozaks hope to move on to the larger city of Olomouc and repeat the process.

Mr. Prochazika thanked the Unity for support of the Kozaks, and encouraged continued support of them through emails, prayers, and finances. He suggested that perhaps the Unity could send short-term evangelistic teams to visit the Czech Republic. In fact, Tom is forming a five-member team now to go there in June. Anyone



interested in becoming part of that team should contact David Miller right away. Pastor Pavel Kozak is pictured above in his new robe. The Unity of the Brethren have come alongside the evangelistic work of Pavel and his wife, Stana, in the Moravian cities of Zlin and Olomouc. A mission trip for 5 participants is available for Unity of the Brethren members from any church for August 4-14 to the city of Olomouc. Fields of Faith is sponsoring this trip for the first five folks who contact them.

Estimated Cost: \$1100. Includes lodging, meals on ministry days, ground transportation, translator, literature, tour, and advertising. Does not include food for travel days or shopping. Plus airfare – varies from \$1000 to \$1400. For more information: Tom Prohaska, (214) 399-8550

Pastor Milton Maly gave a report on the work crew that recently returned from Ahuas, Honduras, where they completed installing the solar

panels at the clinic there. The solar panels, plus the batteries charged by them, now supply electricity around the clock to the clinic and its facilities.

Mark Ebert, Director of Moravian Disaster Relief, had been part of the work crew at Ahuas. He commented that the clinic would never be without needs. An endowment for the clinic would be extremely beneficial. Mark also voiced the hope that sawmills which Ray Griggs had worked with in Nicaragua (and now lie idle) could be moved to Ahuas so that the people there could make money for that area.

Mark described Moravian relief efforts in many hurricane-devasted areas. Since August 2005 when Katrina devasted the Gulf Coast, over 140

Moravian missions groups have responded graciously and traveled to Ocean Springs, Mississippi, to help repair homes and lives. In 2006, the Moravian Board of World Missions bought one of the damaged homes, restored it, and is using it for free housing to be used by volunteers who continue to go to Ocean Springs. It has been estimated that it will take at least 8-10 years to complete the rebuilding of that area. Mark provided printed information to conference participants about the ongoing "Mission in Mississippi". Anyone interested in this project can visit www.moravianmission.org, or contact David Miller.

The Antioch Project, another mission opportunity for young adults (ages 17-21), was explained in printed materials provided by Mr. Ebert. This short-term mission opportunity is carried on in many parts of the world. For more information, contact www.moravianantioch.org.

- 2) The week beginning June 3, 2011, will include orientation and working as part of the team which prepares the camp for summer use, including a deep cleaning of the buildings and premises.
- 3) Participate in training to be able to operate the camp's technological equipment to include, but not limited to, computers, projectors, sound equipment, duplicators, and copiers.

Duties During Summer Camps:

- 1) Assist directors with camper check-in.




