

SPIRITUAL

Christians often say that we should be more spiritual or that our Church

leaders need to be more spiritual or that today's service was spiritual. What are Christians saying when they make these statements?

When we say "God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, we seem to understand what Father means

and what Son means. This sense of understanding is probably because we have had fathers and have known fathers. We see in them a certain level of responsibility and authority. When it comes to Son, we know individuals that are sons or have brothers that are sons are we are a son ourselves. We have a basic understanding of their relationship to their father and to us. Therefore, we have a sense of identity with these terms. However, spiritual is something that is difficult to understand by many people. We don't have a life reference for the Holy

Spirit or the term Spiritual and how these two terms related.

For something that is somewhat difficult to get a handle on and wrap our brain around, it has a lot of power over us. Ralph Waldo Emerson said that the spiritual is more powerful than reason. So what is this phenomenon that we experience, yet don't

fully understand? In general, the Holy Spirit is the third person of the Trinity and it is referred to as the Counselor who stays with and is active in the lives of believers.

There are many examples of what people see or feel is spiritual. Some places feel spiritual. A church may be an example, or the giant redwoods, or a beautiful location such as a mountain or the seashore. Some events are considered spiritual, such as an Easter Sunrise Service, a reunion of people who participated in a great cause, or

simply a music venue. Some writings feel spiritual. These could be a verse from the Bible or a meaningful poem or a passage from a book. The sight of a beautiful sunset or the stars in the heavens can feel spiritual. Then there are life experiences that can feel spiritual. These often involve personal interactions, such as the return of a loved one, the birth of a child, or perhaps the death of a loved one.

An Old Testament example of the Spirit entering someone is found in Judges 14:19 which states: "Then the Spirit of the Lord came upon him in power." This is where Samson received his power. Samson ruled the Israelites when they needed a strong and confident leader. However, he had numerous weaknesses, including a temper and, of course, Delilah, but God used him for many great things. When you read of Samson, he doesn't sound very "spiritual" by today's standard. Spiritual may not be that "feeling" we believe it to be.

Timothy, on the other hand, lacked the spirit of power. In 2 Timothy 1:7 Paul admonishes Timothy by saying that God did not give us a spirit of timidity, but a spirit of power, of love and self-discipline. Paul's statement here is very powerful not only for Timothy, but for Christians today. We too often feel that to be a good Christian we need to be timid, and cautious in our words and actions. This timidity results in us not speaking out about where Christians are headed, the dangers that they face, or taking strong actions when needed. Paul says for us to act from a spirit of power, but in doing so we can still be loving, while having the self-discipline to be strong Christians.

1st John verse 4 also speaks to us today when he says for us not to believe every spirit, but to test the spirits to determine if they are from God. He tells us there are many false profits. The test to determine if the spirit is true is the one that acknowledges that Jesus Christ has come from the flesh and is from God. He warns that the spirit of the antichrist will not acknowledge Jesus. As we look at how some Christian churches are addressing Christ, it appears that those churches may not be in the spirit, and the warning in 1st John is strongly speaking to us today.

Turning inward to ourselves, how do we know when we are listening to the Spirit, are having a Spiritual experience or are working in the Spirit? How do we know what we are feeling is not simply an emotion to the beauty of the location, the culmination of our emotions, or the reaction to a situation based on our life experiences? It isn't as easy as it first seems. We all have emotions, thoughts, and experiences that influence our actions which may not be Spiritual, but may lead us to believe they are.

Reading John 4, where Christ is at Jacob's well talking with a Samaritan woman, provides us with several lessons, including guiding us toward understanding what a spiritual decision should be based upon. In John 4:23, 24 Christ says, "Yet a time is coming and is now come when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks.

God is spirit, and His worshipers must worship in spirit and truth." The guidance here is very clear where Christ is stating that, as worshipers our decisions and actions must be based on truth and facts rather than feelings and emotions.

After some reflection, we can identify how to make the determination that what we are doing is indeed spiritual. Accepting that the Holy Spirit is the Counselor that stays with and is active with the believer, we can look at three indicators that should be helpful in making that determination.

The first place we can look is in Scripture to determine if what we are doing has scriptural basis. This determination needs to be more that finding a verse that supports what we are doing, but does so in the context of

how we are applying the true meaning of the verse. We have all seen how some people take a verse from the Bible without looking at the context and underlying truth of the specific verse and having it mean something totally opposite of what is intended.

Secondly, we can make our own spiritual discernment on what we are doing. If that little voice in the back of our head has reservations, we are probably on the wrong path. If we hope someone doesn't know what we are doing, it probably isn't spiritually based. This self evaluation certainly doesn't mean that we can't take action that disagrees with someone else, or that the action we are considering shouldn't be forceful, just as Samson did, or Christ did when he ran the money changers out of the temple. It does mean that we have considered the action in the light of what would Christ have us do. Whatever the conclusion we reach in the discernment of our actions, it should be based on truth and clear thinking rather than reactions or emotions of the moment, and should include prayerful thought and reflection. Further, it should not be a case where we tell God what we want, but rather where

we ask for His guidance in taking the action we are considering.

Last, but not necessarily least, is affirmation. Once we reach a decision, we need to be at peace with that decision within ourselves. For example, can we sleep well the night after we reach our decision knowing that it is the correct action which is Christ centered. Affirmation also comes in the form of responses from respected people and not just those who will tell us things to make us feel good.

We should consider these thoughts as we go about our actions in our daily life, as we select our church and denominational leaders, our government leaders, and our friends. They will influence our lives, and their decisions and actions should be spiritually based, just as our decisions and actions should be spiritually based.

A Recent Moravian Archive Visit

During a recent visit to Winston-Salem, North Carolina, Rev. Larry Koslovsky and I were given the opportunity to view the Moravian archives. Thanks to Ms. Melanie Shamel contacting Rev. Daniel Crews, the archivist, we were able to visit the archive. He was gracious enough to allow us to visit the vault where two Czech hymnals from 1615 and 1618 are archived.

The 1618 Hymnal had notes in the margins identifying the authors of the individual hymns. They happened to open to page 113 to a hymn written by Jan Hus. The hymn was written in Old Czech. Rev. Crews, who reads old

Czech, translated the words to the hymn as saying, "Jesus the Great High Priest One God with the Father and Spirit has become our life and grace." Those are good words that speak to us today.

Our visit to the archives came at the conclusion of a visit with individuals interested in associating with the Unity of the Brethren.

Fayetteville Brethren Re-Dedicate Church Sanctuary with Special Service

The congregation of the Fayetteville Brethren Church re-dedicated the church sanctuary, which had been in the process of restoration since September of last year, with a special worship service on Saturday, April 2, 2011. The Fayette County Czech Singers, dressed in Kroj (authentic Czech dress), sang Czech songs during the prelude, accompanied by Elizabeth Ripple (church organist) on the piano, Scott Marshall on the trumpet, and Alvin Minarcik on the accordion and tenor saxophone. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Ann and Milton Heintschel, members of the church and U.S. Navy (retired). The Czech Singers sang "God Bless America"

("Buh Chran Ameriku") in Czech, followed by the congregation in English.

The invocation was given by Rev. Joseph Polasek, Pastor of Snook Brethren Church and President of the Mutual Aid Society of the Unity of the Brethren. The responsive reading was led by Rev. Milton Maly, Pastor of Fayetteville Brethren.

A special Key Bearing Ceremony was performed, with the youngest members of the church carrying a 3-foot wooden key made by Eugene Michalsky. The key was carried by Riley and Reese Longobardi and Casey and Avery Marshall. They presented the key to Joe Ripple, President of the Board of Elders. A ceremony of this

type was first performed in this church at the first dedication service in 1875. This ceremony was to symbolize the giving of the key to the church from one generation to the next. A passage was read from Deuteronomy 6: 4-9 by Rev. Maly.


The welcome by given by Joe Ripple, Jr. Greetings were given from Claren Kotrla, President of the Unity of the Brethren; Fayette County Judge, Edward Janecka; and Rev. Joseph Polasek. Letters of greetings and congratulations were read from Rev. Albert and Annie Michalik, Rev. Gordon and Pat Hejl, Linda Dennis, Chairperson of the Fayette County Historical Commission, and Tim Kleinschmidt, State Representative District 17. Several of the guests shared memories they had of the church.

Rev. Maly read scripture in Czech and gave a short message in Czech. A special Czech song, "Pojd k Spasiteli" ("Come to the Saviour"), was sung first in Czech by the Czech Singers, and the congregation joined in singing in English. The dedicatory sermon was given by Rev. James D. Hejl, Pastor of Taylor Brethren Church. Rev. Hejl served as the Pastor of Fayetteville Brethren from 1983 to 1985.

The act of dedication was led by Rev. Maly. Rev. Henry Beseda, Jr., supply pastor at Cy-Fair Community Church and former Pastor of Fayetteville Brethren (1951-1955), gave the closing prayer, benediction, and the blessing of the meal. Rev. Beseda is the oldest serving pastor in the Unity at the age of 91. The hymns chosen for this worship and the order of service were followed closely from another re-dedication service of the church sanctuary that was held on September 22, 1957, when the church was remodeled for the second time.

The oldest members of the church present at the service were presented with corsages and boutonnières, and





included Lillian Blinka, Leland Miller, Laddie Ripple, and Lee Roy Cervenka. Not present was Alma Urban, who at 97 is the oldest member of the church. Other special guests included Calvin Vojtek, grandson of Rev. Henry Juren. Rev. Juren was Pastor from 1876 to 1921, and is buried in the church cemetery. The church has a Texas Historical Commission marker celebrating the life of Rev. Juren.

A catered lunch of roast pork, sausage, barbequed chicken, and sauerkraut, with all the trimmings, was served in the church fellowship hall, with opportunities for fellowship and viewing the many history and record books of the church. A variety of desserts were enjoyed, including kolaches and a specially made cake in

the shape of the church with the steeple topping it off. Guests watched a Power-Point presentation of the restoration of the church and the steeple raising. The restoration was done by Minarcik Construction and took five months to complete.

The church was built in 1874 by the Czech-Moravian Protestant immigrants that settled in the area of Ross Prairie. The First Czech Protestant worship service in Texas was held in the homes of the immigrants in 1855 by Rev. John Zvolanek. The congregation organized in 1870, and has continued through many changes in the community around it. Services are held each Sunday at 10:30 A.M., with Sunday School at 9:30.

From the Thiessens...

April 10, 2011 Dear friends,

Three different aspects of what we do in Mexico came together today, and I think if I tell you the stories you'll understand better what we do here.

First, around 10:30 this morning we met with Tomas and Sofia, our landlords. They live next door, and we've been studying the Bible readings that the Catholic Church prescribes for Lenten Sundays. Since Ash Wednesday we've been getting together with them and other neighbors to read and pray. The readings are substantial: two Old Testament (one a Psalm), one Epistle, and one Gospel. During this season leading up to Christ's death and resurrection, the theme always points to Jesus. For example, today we looked at Samuel's anointing of David, then Psalm 22: "They divide my clothes among themselves and throw dice for my garments." Then Paul exhorts the Ephesians to live in the light because light shines on evil and makes it clear, and he quotes some poetry: "Awake, o sleeper, rise from the dead, and Christ will give you light." We finished with the story of the man born blind who was healed after washing Jesus' spittle-mud from his eyes, an action that angered the religious leaders so much that they berated the healed man and finally expelled him from their "church."

We are exploring these readings with neighbors, trusting that God Himself will show up for them as we pray and study.

Second, we went to a nearby church of about a hundred members, where we finished a series of teachings

based on Perspectives On The World Christian Movement. They've had a month to ponder our teaching, and today took concrete steps, planning together to put into action the impulses of the Holy Spirit stirring them to share the Gospel. Together with their pastoral couple, we discussed the indigenous areas they come from, the cultural backgrounds of their neighbors, the resources available in the city for missions, etc. We were pleased by their eagerness to find ways to do something. They chose mission leaders, and we committed to meet with them for the next year to help them plan and act in obedience to God.

Finally, we were able to go over to "our" house church, and there we took the Lord's Supper together. The teaching was done; this final touch remained. We moved into our circle of 30 close friends, listened to our apprentice Phil reflect on the meaning of this act, and then ate and drank together. These co-leaders of the church are capable of carrying on without us, and to reproduce the church, and this makes joining them again restful.

Thank God for volunteers! Thank God for Nicole's service teaching Peter and Hazel. She continues to do a wonderful job. Thank God for Brian, who has been changing dressings for Juan. Thank God for David, who is diligently filing a pile of old x-rays.

Thank God for the many who contributed in time and money to make the solar energy collection system function. We have cut energy use by 80% on typical days. On most days, we can use the operating room without starting the generator.

These are some pressing current needs:

- First, the local church leadership has come into conflict. May God lead and guide them.
- Second, we continue the search for a teacher to teach Peter and Hazel at the junior high level for the 2011-2012 school year.
- Third, our ultrasound machine is not working, leaving us handicapped in assessing patients with abdominal problems or pregnancy.

We continue to find ways to help people in obstetrics and gynecology, such as:

- "Matilda's" ruptured ectopic pregnancy.
- C-sections for breech and transverse lie on the same day.
- Coaching and encouraging a mother through her first vaginal delivery.

From Beyond Borders...

Sunday, May 1, 2011 Greetings from Oaxaca,

First off, a lot of things have been going on down here, but I would first like to say that I have been watching the news and it seems there has been a lot of bad weather up there and I hope and pray not too many of you have been seriously affected. Here the weather has been normal, a few showers, but overall just very hot.


Lately Eunice and I have been planning a national conference for young people here in Oaxaca. Last week was the event, and it was a huge success. People came to Oaxaca from over eight states and met for four days to learn about missions, meet other christians, and have some fun. We had a famous Latin American speaker come down to teach about cross cultural missions, who shared



home with me to share about our lives and experiences over the last few years. The conference took many



months of planning, and when it ended we felt good about what we accomplished, and also like, wow, it ended



accommodating over 120 people is a very difficult task.

Here in Mexico we are trying to get



many stories about living with indigenous people from Peru to Morocco. I wasn't able to listen to much of what

he said because I was running around organizing activities, but what I did hear was a lot of my own experience living with the Mixtecs in Yolo. I hope to take some of his teaching methods



people to stay in country and work with the many villages without churches instead of having to go half way across the world to be missionaries. I talked to quite a few people at the conference about the struggle between their jobs and finishing college and missions. One guy in particular has been doing many things in his community while going to college, but feels like it doesn't really count because he doesn't have the title of missionary.

I told him about all of the opportunities he will have finishing his degree, because his future job will include going to villages to build roads and bridges (civil engineer). I told him about all the missionaries who struggle to get into a village, and how he will have a free ticket to these places for the rest of his life. He said, "Well, I never thought of it like that." Here in Mexico the struggle is to get people and their church leaders to see the opportunities before them every day in their own country, and that God didn't make a mistake by putting them in college. As Zinzendorf said "every heart without Christ is a mission field and every heart with Christ is a missionary." We need to learn how to take what we have and use it to serve God, and that we are all equals.

Our long-term plans for going to the Mixe village are still going strong and has taken a very exciting turn. A few days ago I received a call from a fellow missionary whom I had briefly met last year. He told me that he is working with a group that helps coffee growers grow and sell coffee at fair prices. He has been working with the Mixe and Zapotec people in coffee country, and has been trying to work with the people from the village where we want to live. So tomorrow we are going on a trip to meet the board of directors of this organization in a Zapotec village, then we will be going to the Mixe village to scope things out. Eunice has always had a reason to be in the village as a doctor. now I can be there not just as her husband, but as a partner in coffee exportation. This is great news, after many months of trying to go and having things go wrong at the last minute, we are finally going in. Please pray for our trip, and that we have a good first impression with the leaders there. The name of the village is San Juan Juquila de los Mixes, and we

Please be aware that the camp's policy is as follows: 1st offense: Conference with camper, write out agreement for rest of stay. 2nd offense: Conference with camper and parents, review agreement from 1st conference, write out agreement for rest of stay. 3rd offense: Conference with student reviewing actions and previous agreements, call parents to pick up camper, conference with parents.

Cell Phone Policy

Campers are asked to leave **ALL** electronic devices (radios, iPods, cell phones, etc.) at home. We realize some parents may prefer that their child have his/her cell phone in transit. Therefore, when phones are brought to the encampment, they will be collected at check-in by the directors, locked up for the week, and returned to the camper at dismissal.

What to Bring to Camp

Bedding: 2 or 3 sheets, a blanket, a pillow, a pillow case, and an old rug or quilt to sit on outdoors.

Personal Items: Toilet articles, towels, wash cloths →

Clothes: Regular "school type" clothes and sports wear such as jeans and shorts (modest), swimwear, if requested, should be one-piece or covered.

Other Items: Bible, notebook, pencils, flashlight, raincoat or umbrella. Please Note: (1) All items brought to the camp should be clearly marked with the camper's name, and (2) No radios, CD/tape players, Gameboys, DS, iPods, cell phones or other electronic devices will be allowed.

Turn left at the Hus School Encampment directional sign (across the road from the SPJST Lodge Hall). Continue another 1 mile to the Hus School Encampment.
