The Mutual Aid Society Benevolence to Brethren

The upcoming month of May has been traditionally designated as Mu-

tual Aid month within the Unity of the Brethren. Although the Mutual Aid Society has been in existence within the Unity for over 100 years, its mission has not changed. The Mutual Aid exists to provide "Benevolence to Brethren". The word "be-

nevolence" is one that we don't hear used very often anymore and may be somewhat unfamiliar to even we Brethren. Webster's dictionary defines "benevolence" as "a disposition to do good, an act of kindness or generous gift". The original constitution of the Mutual Aid Society listed three purposes for the creation of the organization which are still very closely aligned with Webster's definition. Those purposes included.

1. To give to the survivors of deceased members a certain sum of money.

2. To support charitable and benevolent enterprises and undertakings for mutual self protection. 3. To perform deeds of love and charity in general and especially among

its own membership.

More than 100 years later the Mutual Aid Society is still providing a monetary expression of love and sympathy to the families of its deceased members. Additionally, building projects of Unity churches are still being

advanced through building loans provided by the Mutual Aid Society and most recently the Mutual Aid has begun providing educational scholarships to its most active college student members. All of these benevolences are directed exclusively towards Brethren. As a member of the Mutual Aid Society, Brethren can be assured that they are part of something greater than any individual. They are a part of an effort to ensure the continuation of the Unity of the Brethren for future generations while fulfilling of the scriptural directive to "Bear ve one another's burdens and thus fulfill the laws of Christ" found in Galatians 6:2. ->





head. Then the Rev. Linda Chandler shared a message entitled "The Call".







May's Baby

Thank you for praying for May. About a week ago her 7-month-old returned home to her. Her brother-inlaw went home for Chinese New Year to visit his mother and brought May's baby back to her. We praise the Lord for this as we all have prayed and prayed over this situation. Now life will change for all of us as we add another baby boy to our home, May's baby, Jonathon.

Healings

One young man, married to May's cousin, had breathing trouble and heart trouble. May prayed for physical healing and shared God's love with them. His body is better now, if not completely healed. May is now going to their house once every two weeks to lead them in prayer and worship and stories. Our hope is that they can really learn these stories and then immediately pass them on to their friends and family. Things like this are happening weekly here. May comes and tells us who she prayed for and how they were healed and how they want to know more about Jesus. She actually has about 5-6 places around the area where she goes and teaches, just like we asked you to pray for. His Kingdom is coming in love and word and power!

Lord we ask that you would continue to bring your Kingdom among the Shan Dai. Let them know you are more powerful than their fears, than their sickness, than the local witch doctor, and their household idols.

Teammates

The Kingdom came at the beginning of January when our teammate Rachel came down with eclampsia, pregnancy-induced high blood pressure. This is a very serious condition that can cause death to mother and baby. Many of you know the story as we sent out tons of emails to you asking you to pray. And pray you did as we saw miracle after miracle. Rachel was moved to Misty City, two hours away, and had an emergency C-section. Baby Anne came out 9 weeks too early. The local doctors were amazed when baby Anne didn't die. The entire hospital was talking about the American woman that just woke up and started breathing on her own after her friends came and prayed to their God for her. Rachel and Anne were air-evacuated to Bangkok.

Currently Rachel is out of the hospital and has been completely healed of any problem. Anne is doing great and is drinking milk and breathing on her own. We praise the Lord for He is so good and full of tons and tons of grace and mercy and love to give. He is not stingy with these things. He, Himself, is making His Name known in that hospital and among the doctors and patients.

Lord, thank you for saving Rachel and Baby Anne. Thank you, Lord, for all of those that prayed and prayed for this family. Thank you for making Your name known among the local doctors and patients at this hospital. Continue to have Your hand on Anne causing her to grow strong and fat and happy. We pray for Anne as she will have a surgery soon on her gut. Continue to stir up talk about You in that hospital and bring many into Your kingdom.

Next Door

As many of you know, there is war right next to us in the country beside us. We may have about 30-40,000 refugees in our area because of it. Recently our city has been targeted to be the western gate into Chi, so all the import and export from Africa, India, and the Middle East will come straight up into our city. But first it must go through the country to the west of us, thus one of the reasons for the war. This area is not under control by the government and they need it to be if the trade is to come.

Lord, we pray for peace in Bur. Lord, stop the war and bring peace and communication. Help the refugees.

Home Coming

We are coming home for 7 months. We have not visited with many of you for almost four years. We will be in the States from June until January 2013. We look forward to spending time with you, catching up, and hearing about what is new in your lives.
