The State of the Unity

The months since the last convention have passed quickly with a sig-

nificant level of activity throughout the Unity. Some happy times, some challenging, but both are signs of life and passion within the denomination.

The synodical committee and executive committee have been actively working on a number of

issues since the convention. We have worked to fill some critical leadership positions in various Unity organizations. Most recently Mark Olsen (Taylor) has accepted the position of Chairman of the Hus School Board of Trustees and Rick Weise (Wall) has also joined the Hus School Board as a trustee. Additionally, Ron Krueger (Taylor) has accepted the position of treasurer on the Hus School Board of Trustees. Mark succeeds Rev. Whitney Amos who previously led the board. Rick Weise assumes the position previously held by Mark Olsen, while Ron Krueger takes over for Marvin

Chlapek as treasurer on the Hus School Board of Trustees.



Connie Janac (Snook) will move from the President of The Friends of the Hus School Encampment to the treasurer's position previously held by Anna Wotipka (Caldwell). The search for a new president of The Friends of the Hus School Encampment

continues at the writing of this article. We extend our thanks and appreciation to all of these individuals for the willingness to serve the Unity through the Hus School Board of Trustees and the Friends of the Hus School Encampment.

The mission at Cade Lake led by Rev. Jim Heckman and his wife, Diane, continues to gain momentum. Currently, the mission offers 2 Sunday school classes for children, 1 for middle school aged students and 1 for high school students and adults. The Sunday school atten-





dance has consumed virtually all of the available space. The highest single Sunday attendance at a worship service has been 43 people, all of whom were from the Cade Lake Community. A total of 113 people have attended at least 1 time. Bro. Jim and his family provide a noon meal each Sunday for those in attendance and continue to find new ways to serve the Cade Lake Community. Currently, the mission plays host to those in Cade Lake for a movie night 2 times a month as well as weekly Alcoholics Anonymous meetings. 11 of the young people from Cade Lake also recently attended the Fall Youth Rally held at the Hus School Encampment. Bro. Jim and Diane, along with their family, appear to be making a real difference in the lives of the people in Cade Lake as they continue to serve the people and draw them into a closer relationship with Jesus Christ. As of the end of the first quarter of 2012, the Unity finances are holding up fairly well, but need our continued attention to ensure the work of the Unity can continue. The Ministerial Student Fund currently is in the red due to the educational expenses associated with the blessing of several ministerial students. This has been money well spent. Since the first of this year, 3 of our ministerial students have been ordained and are now actively serving Brethren congregations across the state. Rev. Denise Mikeska at Seaton, Rev. Larry Zabcik at Temple, and Rev. Mark Sebek at Bryan/College Station.

Donations are also still needed in both Foreign and Home Missions. The Unity is sponsoring significant and necessary work in both of our mission efforts and remains dependent on personal donations to continue. Please remember these and all Unity projects in your financial stewardship as well as your prayers.





(Note from the Editor: The following brief article appeared in the Brethren Journal Supplement to the Bratrské Listv, Volume 40, Number 12, December 1943. Redaktor (Editor) Rev. Josef Hegar stated in that issue how a decision was made against opposition of others to include four pages of English under the heading "Brethren Journal". This was the result of yielding to the many requests for "something in English" from the boys in the service. This issue, along with many others, was found in archive storage at the Hus School Encampment.)

Home Missions Board Report

The Home Missions Board met March 31, 2012. The primary goal of the Home Missions Board is to serve the Unity through the education about and coordination of Home Mission Projects throughout the Unity.

The primary project of the Home Missions Board is the Cade Lake Community Chapel and In God's Hands Food Ministry. Currently, Cade Lake Community Chapel receives \$1,000 per month and In God's Hands Food Ministry receives \$500 per month. God uses this money in powerful ways. For example, last year In God's Hands provided 150 families with 66,000 pounds of food for only \$5000!

However, it is important to note

that this is not the only project that falls under the description of "Home Missions". Individual churches also participate in projects that can be considered Home Missions. Members of the Home Missions Board will be visiting churches to educate the members of the Unity on the missions supported by the Unity. An update on Eunice.

Since Eunice and I have been back in Oaxaca, Eunice has been working and training at a school for midwives called Casa Compasiva (house of compassion). It is a Christian group of women working with pregnant women who want to have a normal birth. They do consults, prenatal care, give advice and prayer, carry out the births and give post birth care. Last month they celebrated their one-year anni-






versary. Eunice has enjoyed working alongside these women and interacting with the patients. A few weeks ago Eunice went to another group of midwives to give a class on fetal circulation. This group, called Nueva Luna (new moon), is the only other group of midwives in the entire state of Oaxaca. This group has been around for a number of years, and she found out that the Lamaze class we took a few years ago is run by these women. The two groups try to work together as much as possible to create awareness of the benefits of natural births.

Last week Eunice got a call from one of the leaders at Nueva Luna to go out for coffee and talk about a possible job opportunity. Eunice went

and met with Araceli from Nueva Luna at a local coffee shop. The two talked about the struggle for women in Oaxaca and around the country, and what Nueva Luna was doing. Araceli then asked Eunice if she was interested in joining their team. They were impressed with her presentation and her enthusiasm on the issues. They wanted another person to join their team, and for Eunice to be a part of the future. Nueva Luna is working on making home births legal and legitimate in Mexico. Right now in Mexico it is illegal to have a clinic that only

the state and federal governments to legalize home birth clinics, and last week held a conference with guests from all over the country here in Oaxaca to discuss the law and its impact on doctors and women. Eunice was invited to the conference where there were speakers from the government, doctors, and to Eunice's delight, Julieta Venegas. Julieta is a major pop star here in Mexico who is the national spokesperson for in-home births after having her daughter at home two years ago. Eunice was able to meet her and talk about the future for women in Mexico (she was majorly star struck). The debate went well and many local doctors who want to see the laws changed were very encouraged.

As many of you know, Eunice is very passionate about her work, and it makes me so proud that she is being recognized for it. People are truly amazed by her story and her dedication to doing what is right, not making money off sick people. Her participation in Nueva Luna has excited her to new levels, now that she will see her dreams put into action. As a woman who grew up indigenous, and poor; to be a doctor and to be a part of the change is what she dreamed of when she chose the profession. Meeting all of you this summer/fall was a major influence, she has been encouraged by your friendship. She may not have talked a whole lot, but she was listening.

Our plans have not changed with the new developments. We are still planning on being in Juquila part time over the next few months. Meanwhile, Eunice will be studying and working alongside these groups. Nueva Luna also has three midwives in the MIxe area where we are headed. They don't live in the same village, but will be great contacts in the area.

Please continue to pray for our entrance into Juquila; also for Eunice's new opportunities in Casa Compasiva and Nueva Luna. Later this month we are going on a trip for a medical brigade into a few indigenous villages. As for myself, there are always lots of opportunities for ministry here in Oaxaca. The local church keeps me busy, along with my budding relationships with new friends in the city.

Thanks again to all of you, and we hope to have good news about Juquila in the next letter.

From the Theissens . . . March 22, 2012

Hello friends,

You're probably aware that we had a real strong earthquake down here; but really, even though everything was shaking, nothing much happened. Praise God for that!

The last time I wrote I mentioned that we were hosting a group of about ten young adults going to Guerrero (where we used to live) from northern Mexico to live among the urban indigenous for three weeks. They come from the other MBMission work up in Guadalajara, and this is our second year of collaboration. Together we want to help Mexicans (and others!) understand what God is doing among different people, and how we can join in with that.

Here is an excerpt from the blog of one of the participants, Jackie:

"Over a month ago we set out into the unknown. We knew the name of the destination, we knew how long it would take to get there, but we knew little else. We were set to commit the next three weeks of our lives to living and learning in a small city called Tlapa in one of the poorest areas of the country in the state of Guerrero. We were sent off with this commission: show these people love, show them value, and as a child of Abraham, be a blessing to them. With this our leaders left us with nothing but a small backpack.

I was welcomed by a smiling face, Yuri. She would be my adoptive mother for my time in Tlapa. I found myself suddenly thrust into this family's life and met with many challenges. I had to re-think and re-learn how to do simple things. A much poorer household, there were different ways of doing

almost everything. Not only was I forced to learn how to live, I also made an effort to learn about their culture, about their history as a people, and even parts of their language. The family I lived with is Mixteco. Yuri was open about sharing many of her life experiences. At times I rejoiced with her, and at times I found myself mourning... stories about the brokenness in her husband's family. But beneath all of these things there was a joy in her voice and a confidence in Christ. However, I continued to pray that God would show me how I could best bless the family. Sounds simple. In reality it is a difficult task when one enters a culture and really doesn't know what it is they need, either physically or spiritually. I began to realize that there is no possible way that I will be able to understand their culture and way of life enough within three weeks to know how to effectively bless them. I prayed God to reveal to me how I can show them love.

And then something happened that broke my heart. Yuri's mother-in-law, Ale, walks in, stops about 2 meters in front of me and simply stares. She came over to me and began to stroke my hair and my skin while saying

"how beautiful" with an expression of near adoration. Then she ran my fingers through her greying hair and over her creamy, golden brown skin while muttering about how ugly she was. This shot through my heart as I realized I was experiencing an expression of a deep feeling inside her... a feeling of inferiority... an utter lie that she believed. With my best attempts at saying otherwise, she merely shook her head and left the room.

It was in that moment that God gave me a glimpse into the inner beliefs of these people. He had given me his eyes and an impulse that told me to show them that they are wrong... they are so incredibly valuable in the sight of their creator. I didn't know what to do. With this on my mind I continued to show interest, to learn, to help out around the house, to learn to make tortillas and salsa, to eat a lot of chile, and to initiate conversation where I could. Yet the whole time I continued to think... was there not more I could do? I began to wonder. I began to criticize myself, feeling like I haven't been doing enough, I began to lose hope.

But one morning, while making tortillas with Yuri's mother-in-law, I was

proved wrong when she began to cry as we talked about how once I leave I may never return. Although sad, it was in this moment that God encouraged me to continue to persevere, for solely my presence, and my story, was enough to show them blessing, value, and love. This speaks to the truth that we must walk forward when God is leading us, and we must have faith in Him. Only He knows what is truly happening in the hearts and minds of those around us. By the end I found much joy being in their culture. I came out of it craving the taste of chile, accustomed to midday bucket showers and eating without any cutlery.

We also got a chance to spend time in some of the mountain villages, where God has been at work and has now established two indigenous churches among the Mixteco people. What an amazing picture of the diversity of God's promise as thousands of

years after Abraham I was able to see the extension of his family as far as the small mountain villages of southern Mexico, where people are being healed and experiencing God's presence in their own language and culture. What an amazing God we have!"

Well, her story sums up many aspects of what we wanted the group to experience. Please pray for them as they continue in their training, and consider where God is leading them. One of the group, Isai, has committed to serving a multi-year apprenticeship with us with a goal of ministry among unreached indigenous groups in southern Mexico. So praise God for that!



Silly Bands

You will need the following silly bands: Bible, cross, heart, foot, fish

Lesson:

Today we are going to use these silly bands to learn some very important things. (Show the Bible band.) What is this shape? This is the Bible. It is God's Word – His message to us. It's kind of like this cell phone. You can use it to send text messages. God has sent each of you a text message - the Bible is God's word written down for you. It's like a big text message from God to you. One of His messages is Romans 3:23 (Everyone has sinned). Sin is disobeying God. Another message is Romans 6:23 (The payment for sin is death). God says we owe a payment or a bill for your sin. The payment for that sin is death. The good news is that God knew we were going to sin, so He made a way for us to be forgiven. That brings us to our next band: (Show the cross band). This band represents Jesus dying on the cross for our sins. God sent His one and only Son, Jesus, down to earth to die for us and pay the bill we owe for our sin. Another message from the Bible is John 3:16 (For God loved the world so much, that He gave His one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him will not perish, but have everlasting life). Jesus, God's Son, came down to earth. He was born in Bethlehem to a virgin named Mary. And Jesus never sinned. He was perfect. He never sinned because He was God's Son. He never life, stole or cheated. He was perfect. When Jesus grew up, He died on the cross in our place. He wasn't dying for His sins because He didn't have any. He was dying for our sins. You have to accept the gift.



That leads to our next band: the heart. You accept God's gift of eternal life by praying and asking Jesus to be your forgiver. You tell Him you are sorry for your sins and that you believe in Him. You ask him to forgive you of your sins and come into your heart. He makes it all clean. The next band is the foot. This foot represents following Jesus, letting Him be the boss of your life. This doesn't mean you will be perfect, but He will always love you. Our last band is the fish. The fish represents asking Jesus to be your friend. Jesus cooked fish for his friends, the disciples. He loved His friends and spent time with them. When Jesus comes into your life, He becomes you best friend. He will always be there for you. (Review the meaning of each band and lead the group in prayer.)




