


President's Column . . . James Marek Milestones in the Ministry

tion in many ways. One significant blessing and provision has been manifested in the supply of pastors. From the early days of the Unity of the Brethren in Texas, God has called pastors from within and outside the Unity to minister to our



Within the last 12 months, 5 ministers have reached the milestone of at least 50 years in the ministry. This distinguished fraternity includes: Rev. Henry Beseda, Rev. Gordon Hejl, Rev. Albert Michalik, Rev. Al Newby, and Rev. Bill Hodge. On behalf of the Unity, we want to express our gratitude for their service. We also thank God for these men (and their wives) as they have been faithful to us and responsive to God's call. (*The following information has been taken almost exclusively from our Unity history book*). **Rev. Henry Beseda** was born February 17, 1920, in Port Lavaca. He

Bro. Henry officially retired in 1987. After retirement, he has served the Pasadena and Cy Fair congregations, in addition to the Vsetin Czech Moravian Brethren Church just outside of Halletsville. Henry has also served the Unity throughout his ministry in other leadership positions, including Chairman of the Synodical Committee, President of the Mutual Aid Society, Chairman of the Hus School Board of Trustees, and Presi-

dent of *The Brethren Journal* Business Committee.

On the personal side, Bro. Henry enjoys bowling, golf, reading, and travel. He is also known for the uncommon practice of adding honey to his coffee, and is known to carry honey with him in his travels. Much of his travel around the Unity has been done in a black sedan. Bro. Henry once said that his mother believed a preacher ought to drive a black car, so that is what he tried to do. At 93, Bro. Henry now lives in Houston with his wife, the former Carolyn Filipp. Bro. Henry has been a pastor in the Unity for over 60 years, and is currently the most tenured pastor in the Unity. Bro. Henry recently celebrated his 93rd birthday.

Rev Gordon Hejl was born on February 21, 1918, just outside of Taylor. He graduated from Taylor High School in 1936. He served in the Army as a crew chief on the B-29 Bomber in World War II until 1945. In 1946, Bro. Gordon became the first Texas Brethren to attend Moravian College, where he played football and came to be known as "Tex". He graduated from Moravian College in 1950, and then received his Master's of Divinity in 1952 from Moravian Seminary. Bro. Gordon was ordained at the Wall Brethren Church on June 17, 1952. Bro. Gordon has served congregations in Granger, West, Ennis, Dallas, Wall, Anton, Rosenberg, Shiner, Alief, Placedo, Robstown, El Campo, Nelsonville, Wesley, Industry, Fayetteville, and Ocker. After officially retiring in 1983, Bro. Gordon served the Granger congregation from 1983-1994.

Bro. Gordon has always had a heart for missions. He served as chairman on the Unity Mission Board for 22 years and made a number of mission trips to various mission fields around the world. In 1997, Bro. Gordon was named Member Emeritus to the Unity Mission Board after 28 years of service. In addition to his mission work, Bro. Gordon and his late wife, Lillian, served in the camping program at conferences and Hus School. His service to the Unity also includes several leadership roles on the executive committee of the Synodical Committee.

After the death of his wife, Lillian (Barton) Hejl, in 1990, Bro. Gordon married the former Pat Marek in 1996. The Hejls live on a farm outside of

Rev. Albert Michalik was born southeast of Taylor on March 2, 1925. He graduated from San Angelo High School in 1942. Bro. Albert worked on the family farm until 1946, when he enrolled at the University of Texas, graduating in 1950. He enrolled in the Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary, where he graduated with his Masters degree in Divinity in 1953. He was ordained at the Wall Brethren Church on June 19, 1953. The congregations served by Bro. Albert during his ministry include Ocker, West, Crosby, Pasadena, Nelsonville, Industry, Wesley, Fayetteville, Temple, Caldwell, New Tabor, and Dime Box.

Bro. Albert has also served on the executive committee of the Synodical Committee multiple times in various leadership positions. He and his wife, Ann, have also served in the camping program at conferences and Hus School. The Michaliks now live in Georgetown. Bro. Albert has been a pastor for almost 60 years, rendering all of his service in the Unity. Bro. Albert recently celebrated his 88th birthday.

Rev. Al Newby was born on March 8, 1933, in Westfield, Indiana. He graduated from Union Friends High School in 1950 and Wesleyan University in 1955. He then received his Masters of Divinity from Ashbury Seminary in Lexington, Kentucky, in 1960. He was ordained in the Union Congregational Church in Hallandale,

Florida, on February 17, 1963. Bro. Al worked in several communities in Kentucky, Indiana, Ohio, Florida, and Oklahoma to advance the causes of civil rights and integration. His activities in this area were met with mixed emotions in the communities and churches in which he lived and served. On two occasions, Bro. Al's civil rights work cost him his pastoral job.

Prior to coming to the Unity, Bro. Al served in the Methodist and United Church of Christ denominations. Bro. Al was called by the Crosby/Pasadena Brethren parish in 1979, and has since served the Seaton and Caldwell congregations, as well. Bro. Al and his wife, Jean, now live in Temple and enjoy traveling. Bro. Al remains active ministering to the elderly. Bro. Al has been a pastor for over 50 years, 33 of these in the Unity, and recently celebrated his 80th birthday.

Rev Bill Hodge was born in 1920 in Kansas City, Missouri, along with his twin brother. Bro. Bill graduated from North Kansas City High School in 1938 and the University of Kansas in 1942. Bro. Bill served in the Marine Reserves from 1941 to 1945 during World War II. He returned home and felt a call to the ministry. He enrolled in Perkins School of Theology at SMU and graduated with a Divinity Degree in 1950. He served in the Methodist church for 36 years, retiring in 1986.

Bro. Bill was invited to preach at the Houston Brethren Church on July 6, 1986. His sermon title was "The Life and Witness of John Hus: Martyred July 6, 1415. Bro. Bill later accepted a call from the Houston Brethren Church and remained as part-time pastor at Houston Brethren Church for 20 years. Bro. Bill has been a pastor for more than 60 years, serving 20 of these years in the Unity.

What a blessing God has provided to the Unity through these faithful ministers. They have been and continue to be illustrations of Matthew 5:16, where Jesus said, "Let your light so shine before men that they may see your good works and may praise your Father in heaven." We as a unity have seen the example and good works of these men, and now we are called to praise God for their lives, work, ministry and example.

Unity Information – Constitution Changes

The Unity Constitution and By-Laws Committee has concluded its review and update of the Constitution and By-Laws. Proposed updates and changes were sent by email (a few were mailed) to all pastors, Synodical Committee members, and members and Congregations of the Unity of the Brethren so that everyone can review them prior to the Spring Synodical Committee meeting in April.

Three files were sent: 2009 Constitution and By-Laws, 2013 Proposed Constitution and By-Laws Publication Copy (copy that is ready to be published), and a 2013 Proposed Constitution and By-Laws strike-through edition. (This edition is the same as the "publication ready" document except that it includes the proposed updates and changes in the body of the document. The "strike-through" is colored red. Publishing this edition in color will greatly aid in the reading of the document.) These documents should be printed for the members in your congregation as needed to review and discuss.

All comments and questions should be sent to the committee Chairman,

Rev. Tommy Tallas (rev.tjt@verizon.net) as soon as possible so the Committee can review them prior to the Spring meeting. The three files are also on the Unity website main page, see "NEW" or go to the calendar and see April 2013.

Other committee members are: Rev Whitney Amos, Dawn Marie Baletka, Marvin Chlapek, Jean Blaha Davis, Peggy Hejl, Kent Laza, Rev. Nello Strickland, and serving ex officio, James Marek. This committee was formed at the October 22, 2011, Synodical Committee meeting with approval from the July 2011 Convention to consider any and all changes to the Constitution and By-Laws of the Unity of the Brethren. Consideration could also be given to call for a Special Convention regarding the changes to the Constitution and By-Laws if prudent.

Per Article VII., Sec. F of the 2009 Constitution and By-Laws, the following are proposed changes to the Constitution (changes are printed in **bold italic** text [in the Brethren Journal only] and may be additions and/ or changes/additions) from the com-

mittee for general study by the membership of the church:

1. Article I. Name – "...It merged in 1919 with the Independent Unity of the Brethren of the Bohemian and Moravian Brethren (1915) into the Evangelical Unity of the *Brethren of the* Czech-Moravian Brethren in North America, and is now desirous to be known only by the original name."

2. Article IV. Membership, Sec. B, 2. a. – "It establishes an accurate roll of its membership;. Local congregations have sole authority to develop the criteria for determining its active communicant members.

3. Article IV. Membership, Sec B. 7 – take out the word "See": "(*See* By-Laws Article XXII.)


4. Article IV. Membership, Sec B. 9 – "Only *active* communicant members *in good and regular standing* shall be selected to represent the congregation at Unity of the Brethren conventions and functions, subject to the Constitution and By-Laws of the congregation.

5. Article IV. Membership, Sec C. 4–"...The *president President* shall furnish the pastor with a letter of dismissal duly provided with the seal of the Unity of the Brethren on it.

6. Article V. Administration, Sec A. 2 – ".....accepted by the appropriate referendum vote of the brethren in the local congregations. (*See* Constitution *Art.Article* VII, *Sec. G Section F* and By-Laws *Art. XXIII Article XXIV*.)

7. Article V. Administration, Sec B. 1 "...By-Laws *Art.Article* VI. (Effective 1995 Convention)

8. Article V. Administration, Sec B. 2 "To execute its decisions and for the purpose of administering current matters of the Unity of the Brethren between regular biennial Conventions, the Convention shall elect: (1) the executive officers of the Synodical Committee (See By-Laws Art. Article VI, Sec. Section A); (2) a Chairperson of the Board of Christian Education; (3) a Chairperson of the Board of Home Missions; (4) a Chairperson of the Board of Foreign Missions; (5) a Chairperson of the Pastoral Relations Committee; (6) a Chairperson of the Hus School Encampment Board of Trustees; (7) a Chairperson of the Board of Grants and Bequests; (8) an Editor and a Business Manager of The Brethren Journal, and a Business Manager; (5; (9) a Board for Grants and Bequests as outlined

in the By-Laws; (610) a Pastoral Relations Committee as outlined in the By-Laws; and (711) lay and ministerial alternates. The officers of the Synodical Committee and other personnel may be elected from the membership of the Convention or from the membership of the denomination at large. (See By-Laws Art.Article VI, Sec.Section B.) (Effective 1995 Convention)

 9. Article VI. Organizations, Sec C
 & D – "C. The *women's work of the Church is programmed through the* Christian Sisters' Union

D. The youth program of the Church is formulated by young people in their is a recognized organization the Brethren Youth Fellowship. of the Unity of the Brethren comprised primarily of women who have joined together to share their faith through fellowship, prayer, and acts of charity.

D. The Brethren Youth Fellowship is the officially recognized organization of youth throughout the denomination who join together for the purpose of worship, service, study, and fellowship.

10. Article VII. Concluding Paragraphs, Sec A. "The office of the Unity of the Brethren shall be the residence of the *presidentPresident*.

11. Article VII. Concluding Paragraphs, Sec F. "If there is a need to change or amend this Constitution of the Unity of the Brethren, the Synodical Committee or a special committee appointed by them for that purpose, shall propose such changes to the Convention, publish the proposals in the official publication of the Unity of the Brethren, *The Brethren Journal*, at least two (2) months before the Convention, and present them to that

Convention for approval. In the event that the above mentioned criteria are not fulfilled, the Convention may not take action on the changes or amendments..."

Please note that the changes noted above only pertain to proposed changes to the Constitution and do not include proposed changes to the By-Laws. Proposed changes to the By-Laws will be discussed at the April 13 Synodical Committee meeting.


After glaring at me, she picked up her purse and stormed away without an additional word. I looked at the manager who simply shook his head, laughed, and returned to his office.



Dear Partners,

We are still in Boston and having fun with the mounds of snow from last week's blizzard. We wanted to give you a quick update and praise. Here are some praises and some up and coming hurdles we have, but nothing is impossible with God! Thank you for your prayers and love.

We are at 97% financially supported, and we thank the Lord and you for that. We are also thankful that yesterday we received financial clearance from OMF International to go back to China. We leave here on February 26 for Thailand. We will stay there one week, get some shots and medical checkups, and apply for our China visa in Thailand. Then on back into China the first week of March. Lord, thank you for financially supporting this ministry. Please raise up that last few percent for the Woos. www.omf.org/us/partner apply for an F visa to go into China. It is for 3 months or longer. It is a 'looking for business' visa. Please pray for favor and that when we go to the Chinese Consulate in Thailand all would go well. *Lord, give the Woos favor and bless them with the best and longest visa possible.*

Moving House – Immediately when we get back to Target City we will need to find a new apartment. Finding apartments in China has never been an easy or good experience for us. It's hard work. Our teammates are already going to start looking around for us. Why do we need a new apartment? The apartment we live in is very small and the rent has skyrocketed, and it seems our landlady is cheating us. In 4 years it went from 7,000 Chinese dollars per year to 18,000, and now 24,000 per year. Our city is booming, inflation is huge, and our apartment is in a good location and in high demand. We think we can find a bigger place for the same or cheaper price. Lord, help the Woos find just the right place for them. Help them to move all their stuff and for it →

to be not so time or energy consuming as there are other things needed to be done.

Transition – It takes us about 3 months for us to finally feel comfortable and back into life in China. It is such a drastic change of environment for us all. Please pray for the transition back into speaking Dai and Chinese, moving house, getting kids back into local school, starting up homeschool, being with May again, reconnection with our teammates and our Dai friends, writing up a business plan, starting back with ministry, etc. Lord, help the Woos with all these transitions.

Business – We have an idea of doing a business in China that would provide us a visa, but also help the Dai. The Dai are mostly farmers with rice and sugar cane. They are trying to do new and creative things to make more money so they can keep up with the growing economy. There is also a growing fear among the middle class Chinese that the vegetables in China have too many chemicals on them. The local people have a fear of eating their own food. So our idea is to do a worm composting project and possibly expanding into other agricultural green

technologies. The idea is that the Dai could group more natural vegetables with less chemicals using our composting and other products. Then they could sell their vegetables to the richer Chinese that are concerned and want a more organic product. There is a lot of paperwork we must do with OMF (from here on out we will call OMF 'our company') and with the Chinese government. We are hoping to get this business started this year some time. Lord, help the Woos with this idea. Give them vision, and favor with the government, and show them what you want them to do.

May – Our helper May, as you know, has been having trouble with her husband. We hope we can help them and minister to them when we go back. He is Chinese and a very nominal Christian, if that. They have a 1-1/2-year-old son. We also will have May come back and work in our home. She works as a house helper. This is where she gets her income from, but half of her time with us is in helping us make short Bible stories in Dai, studying the Bible with us, praying and worshipping with us. We encourage her to go out and share these reproducible stories in her own free

time. It will be a time of transition working with her again. Her son will be in our house, too, and it may be too much for us to all be together. So we ask the Lord to help us, and keep us open for changes and what needs to be done and how to minister to her and her family.

Lisa has been working with our teammates. Lord, we continue to prav for Lisa and her two children. Grow her up in Christ and give her a heart to take care of her own kids and to proclaim you as Lord wherever she goes.

Brad, May's cousin, has had a baby and is trying to decide if he should come back to China to work and leave his wife and baby in Burma. Give Him direction Lord.

Timothy and Philip are two young Dai pastors from Burma. When I think of them I think of the story in Acts when Stephen is selected to care for the widows so the Apostles can go out and share more. Timothy and Philip are so busy taking care of the needs of the widows and kindergarteners that they actually have only a few hours Saturday morning that are free. Here are two energetic men who

love God. They are Dai, they are a part of this unreached people group of over 7 million people, and yet they are too busy with the church's programs to go out. Lord, break their heart for their own people. Send them and others out as evangelists. Raise up workers for the harvest, Lord.

Mary and her friend work at the local factory. They are older Dai women. Both of these women love the Lord, but they are like many of us in that they love to come to church every week and listen, but they are not going out to share with others. We pray, Lord, for Mary's heart problem. Heal her Lord. Give both of these women Your heart for their own people. Raise them up and send them out for Your Name's sake.

Go forth – We pray that the power, love, and Word of God would go forth among the Dai, sweeping through China, Burma, and Thailand. 

This month's collection of ideas plays off of last month's. Sunday School songs are a powerful way to teach beloved Bible stories to children. They are also a wonderful way to introduce children to the practice of Scripture memory. This is a way to build a Biblical foundation for children. While they may not completely understand the meaning of the words, one day, when they need that message most, God will bring those words to their mind to provide guidance, aide, or comfort. So this month I have included a list of ideas to incorporate Scripture memory into your Sunday School Lessons.

Scripture Memory Games

1) Post-it Cover Up

Display the verse. Practice reading it once together and then use post-it notes to cover up one of the words. Then practice reading the verse again, followed by covering up a second word with postit notes. Continue this pattern until the entire verse is covered and the children are saying the verse from memory.

2) Move it or Lose It

Many children learn best by moving. Brainstorm motions with the students to match their memory verse.

3) Sparkle

The children will stand in a circle facing one another. The teacher says a reference for a recent memory verse. The game travels around the circle with each child saying the next word to come in the verse. If the child says an incorrect word or does not know the next word, they sit down. The verse continues around the circle until the final word is said, and then the next child says "Sparkle!" to finish the verse. The child who says "Sparkle!" also sits down. The children continue to play with a variety of verses until there is only one child standing, who is the winner.

4) Word Card Scramble

Write each word of the verse on separate index cards and mix them up. Each child is given a set of cards which holds one complete verse. The children spread their cards out on the table or floor face-up and try to unscramble the words to put the verse in the correct order.
