

# President's Column . . . James Marek Getting the Word Out

During an interview for an associate pastor position in our local congregation, our search commit-

tee was asked a very poignant question by one of the candidates. He asked, "What are you all doing to get the word out?" He was asking how we publicized the activities and ministries of the church to the



community. His question was embarrassing enough because we had to admit that we were not doing enough. After our meeting, I began to think about his question in the context of Jesus' commandment to His disciples in the "The Great Commission". In Matthew 28:19 Jesus says, "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you..."

I began to think how uncom-

fortable it would be if we are one day asked to articulate, in front of our Holy God, what we have done to help spread the Gospel and expand His Kingdom with the time we have been given on His

earth? To what degree did we participate in evangelism? Certainly one way we are involved in evangelism is through our denominational mission programs.

We currently have missionary teams deployed throughout the world ministering to those who may not know Christ yet. Our prayerful and monetary support of our missionaries' efforts are tangible responses to Jesus' Great Commission. That said, are we



being called to an even more personal role in evangelism? What impact would it have if we began to purposely seek out those in our families, our neighborhoods, and in our jobs who do not know Jesus? Statistics show that most Christians have not invited anyone to church in the last 6 months. Some of us maybe haven't invited anyone in the last 6 years.

"Evangelism" is a word that often makes us uncomfortable. especially if it means that we may have to invest ourselves beyond prayer and mission giving. What is it that makes us so reluctant to purposely share our faith in an effort to bring others to Christ? According to the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association, the most common reason Christians say that they do not share their faith with others is because they don't know what to say. Rev. Graham's organization is working to change that. They have launched a grass roots effort called "My Hope with Billy Graham" designed to teach

Christians how to evangelize those whose paths we cross every day. On November 7, 2013, the Rev. Billy Graham is scheduled to speak to the nation on this topic through national television. November 7th will be Rev. Graham's 95th birthday, and he is expected to speak to the world and encourage Christians to become involved in this grass roots evangelism effort organized and administered by the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association. He is expected to urge all Christians to seek to build relationships with unbelievers and to introduce them to Christ. Graham purportedly believes our country and our local churches can benefit greatly from this evangelism effort. The program is intended to help strengthen and expand local churches. For years, Rev. Graham has preached to the world and been very successful bringing people to Christ through powerful Gospel messages. Now he and his Evangelistic Association seek to equip Christians so that we can



also bring others to Christ.

The My Hope with Billy Graham project is modeled after the example of Matthew, the disciple and Gospel writer. Matthew 9 tells us that once Jesus called Matthew and he began to follow Christ, Matthew hosted a dinner party where other tax collectors and "sinners" came to meet Jesus. My Hope with Billy Graham encourages Christians to extend similar hospitality to their neighbors and invite them into their homes to meet Christ. The material provided is very comprehensive and well written. There are instructional videos, study guides, and a number of pamphlets for use in leading nonbelievers to Christ. The program stresses the importance of preparation of those who want to be a part of this evangelism effort. It is stressed throughout the instruction that those carrying the message must be prepared and open to the direction of the Holv Spirit. Rev. Graham has used much of the material in the My Hope program in his crusades around the world to bring millions of people to Christ. I encourage everyone to think about and pray for the My Hope with Billy Graham evangelism effort. God has

used Rev. Graham's ministry to bring millions of people to Christ over the last 50 years, and now Rev. Graham's organization is providing a very detailed step-by-step program to help us join him and God in continuation of the kingdom-building effort. The question is, what will we do with the opportunity?

As Brethren, we have largely typically relied on our pastors and missionaries to evangelize on our behalf while we have demonstrated our faith through acts done out of Christian love and concern. Is it time for us to expand and exercise our faith by exploring opportunities such as this one in which we allow God to work through us in a ministry of hospitality and personal evangelism? The decision is a very personal one. Is God calling you to such a ministry?

# **Bro. Henry Beseda** (February 17, 1920 - September 16, 2013)

Reverend Henry Earnest Beseda, Jr., was born in Port Lavaca, Texas, on February 17, 1920, and dedicated his entire life to the ministry of the Lord Jesus Christ. His parents, the late Reverend and Mrs. Henry E. Beseda, Sr., inculcated Henry the tenets of the Christian faith through the Presbyterian Church and the Unity of the Brethren. Henry's father pastored in Texas rural community churches for both denominations. His mother, the late Mrs. Julia Rose Chernosky Beseda, studied to be a missionary at a Methodist seminary in Pennsylvania, prior to marriage as a pastor's wife and mother of nine children. Reverend Beseda was married to Mrs. Carolyn Filipp Beseda, a retired public school teacher and professional musician/ part-time insurance agent.

Reverend Beseda's education included studies in Alice, Texas, and Holdenville, Oklahoma, culminating with a high school diploma earned from West High School in West, Texas,

where the family had later moved. His extra-curricular activities included playing halfback for three years on the West Varsity Football Team, as well as active participation in the West Czech Club. During his lifetime, he was an avid sportsman, being competitive in both golf as well as bowling. He often caused much younger players to gaze in awe at his skill s in these sports.

Advanced education included studies at the Schreiner Institute, Texas Tech University, University of Texas, and the Austin Presbyterian Seminary. This culminated in the following earned degrees: Associate Degree-Schreiner Institute, 1939; Bachelor of Business Administration-University of Texas, 1947; and the Bachelor of Divinity-Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary, 1951. The Certificate of Ordination was bestowed upon Henry Beseda in June 1951 in Caldwell, Texas, of Burleson County.

A past, proud U.S. Veteran, Henry served courageously with the United

States Navy during World War II as Yeoman-First Class on the U.S.S. Oakland in the Pacific Theatre. He served from October 1941 until October 1945. He returned to his home state of Texas via the U.S.S. Texas from Honolulu, Hawaii. It was during Henry's service to his country that he heard God's call to pursue the ministry.

Reverend Beseda's travels have included two trips to the Holy Land, missionary work in Honduras and shorter excursions to destinations here in the United States. He has always enjoyed travel and learning about new and exciting things. An avid reader, he read the newspaper from front to back in one sitting with his favorite cup of coffee and maybe a kolache. Years ago, Henry served as the "Kolache King" of the Caldwell Kolache Festival, a Czech festival held every fall in central Texas. His wife honored his private time of reading, knowing that this was one of his joys of life, as well as a few favorite shows watched on television. Regarding cuisine, seafood prepared by his wife, Carolyn, was one of his favorites.

Henry's faithfulness to his God had always been evident as he served first as the Beseda's family pastor, officiating at baptisms, marriages, and family funerals and reunions. He pastored the Brethren at the Westheimer and Cy-Fair Community Churches until his recent hospitalization following a major stroke with complications.

Regarding the Unity of the Brethren at large, he again served families throughout the state regarding baptisms, confirmation classes, vacation bible schools, Sunday schools, church meetings, church conventions, and other activities.

Awarded a plaque in July of this year on the 62nd anniversary of his ordination, he was honored at the Unity of the Brethren Church Convention held in Taylor, Texas, on July 19, 2013. He had previously served as President of the Synodical Board of the Unity of the Brethren, President of the Mutual Aid Society, and held many off ices, including President, on the Hus School Board of Trustees for vears: 1957-1965, 1969-1977, and 1986-1995. In earlier years during the 1950's -1980's, he was a lead instructor with Rev. and Mrs. John Baletka at the Hus

School Encampment, Caldwell, Texas. Many Brethren fondly remember Henry as their inspiring pastor/counselor during their camping experiences, which included Christian learning and Christcentered activities.

Besides his church membership, Reverend Beseda was affiliated and served with the following organizations: American Legion, Chapter 451-Chaplain; VFW, Chapter 4458 - Chaplain; SPJST-Czech Choir; R.V.O.S. Lodge #108; Germania Insurance; Burleson County Hospital Auxiliary -Chaplain; Caldwell Senior Citizens -Chairman of the Board; Habitat for Humanity; Copperas Hollow Country Club, and Warren Lodge No. 56, A.F. & A.M. - Chaplain. On January 21, 2012, Henry was awarded the coveted Golden Trowel Award from this chapter of the Masons.

Reverend Henry Beseda, Jr., is preceded in death by his parents, Reverend and Mrs. Henry E. Beseda, Sr.; 3 brothers: Woodrow, Joseph Maitland, and Robert Beseda; 4 sisters: Maravene Beseda, Orbin Vance, Julia Bradshaw, and Effie Howell. Survivors include: Wife, Carolyn Filipp Beseda; Sister, Florene; husband, Jerome Mrazek, and 14 nieces and nephews.

A memorial service celebrating the life of Bro. Henry was held at 2 p.m. Saturday, October 5, 2013, at the Caldwell High School Auditorium. Members of Unity of the Brethren, Caldwell Area Ministerial Alliance,

# Czech Republic Mission Trip 2013 - by Dan Jakubik

This past summer I had the privilege to go on a mission trip to the Czech Republic with members of the Fields of Faith group from Dallas, Texas. It was a journey of a lifetime, one filled with joy and excitement upon seeing the homeland where my Czech ancestors lived before they immigrated to Texas.

To my surprise, however, this joy quickly disappeared when I realized that my beloved homeland is very dark spiritually. Why? Because the light of our blessed Lord does not shine as brightly as it should. This revelation has prompted my testimony through this article and my future efforts to return the Christian faith to the homeland from where it was founded grew, and then was eventually destroyed through the years by multiple social and political events.

Shortly, after my arrival in Prague, I realized that there was no real large Christian work in the Czech Republic. Yes, organized religion is alive and well, but not the Christian faith. Yes, there are some gatherings such as church services, bible studies, etc. Biblical Christian faith is not practiced on a large scale. In fact, very few people I spoke with practiced a religion or the Christian faith, own a Bible. They did not have someone to tell them why it was so important that they should each experience a personal relationship with Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior. Out of the 450-plus individual contacts, we estimated that only a very small percentage knew how to be saved.

Reread I Peter 3:15, "Be ready always to give an answer to every man that asketh you for reason of the hope that is in you." You will recall how important it is to establish a common ground so that you can share your Christian faith. The Holy Spirit always provides the words and picture stories that will help develop this con-nection. We can only present our personal testimony, and we must remember it is only God that can do the saving. →





There I stood in an Eastern European country – an odd kind of foreigner – not from there, but yet from there; maybe even related to some of them. I had to find a way to bridge the gap and share the gospel.

As I visited with the Czech people, I recalled these words of Peter, and I began my contact with them on a personal level. I told them that I was a full-blooded Czech from Texas, visiting my homeland for the first time to find the homes and villages of my ancestors, but more importantly to make contact with the Czech people themselves. I reminded them that my ancestors left for socio-economic reasons, but more so to have freedom from religion as they best understood at that time according to the teachings of John Hus. I shared with them that my ancestors took their deep abiding Christian faith and left all they had for hope in a new land, The United States, eventually to settle in the blackland belt of Texas. They built Czech communities, continuing all their homeland traditions and Christian faith.

With a connection established, I then would ask permission to ask them a question. With their consent, I asked them, where is the Christian faith in the Czech Republic today that John Hus died for? Where are the churches with doors opened wide that teach the truth that John Hus was willing to die for? Why don't Czechs have a relationship with Christ?

To my surprise, after I shared the gospel with them, they asked: "Jesus died from what? What sin? What is sin?" They had no concept of the word "sin." They did not know that they were lost and destined for an eternity in hell already condemned by God. I shared scripture with them so that they would see where God's word states, that "all" people have fallen short of the will and purpose of

God. Now with each person I shared the good news with, the fallen human state - a sinful state - emerged. In response to hearing the word of God, they responded with all types of excuses why they do not need to believe. Some seemed to think that it was a new age and they had no need for the old ideas like following the Biblical teachings. Like it's a new age, the old is left behind for the new. We don't need God. We are not accountable to God. Some even blamed the former destructive Communist rule destroying all that was known about God through the true preaching of the word of God.

Don't misunderstand me. Today's Czech people are smart, well aware of world events, educated with philosophies of the new age. All of them believe that they are living a good moral life, treating others well and through their lives contributing to the social good and order of the Czech Republic.

Here in the US, we send missionaries all over the world to share the good news about Jesus Christ. Our list includes the Congo, Costa Rica, the American Indian Reservations, Panama, China, and others. Rarely do we see Europe on the list. I am here to challenge individuals to help send their Christian faith back to their homeland. It's time for us to take our Christian faith back to the Czech Republic. Don't just send it; take it yourself!

I am already planning to return to the Czech Republic next year. Look around the world today; we only have a short time to share Christ before great tribulation and persecution comes upon the Church in America. Long ago Amos Comenius' famous prayer was...

... As they bade farewell to their native land they did so in the firm conviction that they themselves should see the day when the Church of the Brethren should stand once more in her ancient home; and as they stood on a spur of the giant mountains, and saw the old loved hills and dales the towns and hamlets, the nestling churches, Comenius raised his eyes to heaven and uttered that historic prayer which was to have so marvelous an answer. He prayed that in the old home God would preserve a "Hidden Seed," which would one day grow into a tree. (Source)

I can tell you that, yes, absolutely that small seed is still there; it's hidden; it has not grown into a tree. It will not grow until you and I pray about the work needed in the Czech Republic. That seed will not grow into a tree until people like you and I care about the lost souls in the Czech Republic. If you don't share the Word, how will they ever hear?

Cornelius lifted a prayer that the Church of the Brethren should stand once again in its homeland. Come and help us work so that Cornelius' prayer will be fully answered.

Mike Groseclose, *President* (Synodical Committee 3rd VP); Dorothy Milberger, *Treasurer*; Rev. Kay Polasek, *Secretary*.

Many thanks and appreciation go to Rev. Tommy Tallas, *President*, and Alice Kocurek, *Treasurer*, for their hard work and dedication to ensure that *The Brethren Journal* continues to be an important part of the Unity of the Brethren.

The new committee has met since the convention to discuss the future of the Brethren Journal. Discussions centered primarily on the solvency of the Journal in regard to advertising and subscription rates.

In light of the increases in the cost to produce the Journal over the past 7 or more years since the last increase, and in the spirit of good stewardship, the committee decided that it was appropriate at this time to increase the rates for both subscriptions and advertising.

Effective with the expiration of the current subscriptions on December 31, 2013, and beginning on January 1, 2014, the cost of all subscriptions will be \$15 per year for 10 issues. The special discounted rate for churches will be discontinued.

At the same time, advertising costs for religious ads will increase from \$15 to \$30 per column inch. Commercial rates will remain the same for now, and the committee will be looking to solicit additional ads to help cover costs.

In addition, the committee has resolved to work on increasing the readability of the Journal by researching other options available in print and digital formats.

The committee would like to encourage our readers to provide input on what they would like to see more...or less of in the Journal. Ideas are wel-



Fairy tales are often read as bedtime stories or as videos children enjoy on the big screen or at home. At times, we may be reluctant to draw comparisons between the Bible and these stories from popular culture. We know the Bible is Truth and these are merely made up stories. Yet throughout his ministry, Jesus used parables — fictitious stories — to explain in ways humans could understand the incomprehensible logic of heaven and the kingdom of God. While our human nature causes us to identify with the jealous older brother, Jesus' parable about the prodigal son calls us to open our arms as the father did...and come home with humility as the son did. Different from fairy tales, Jesus began or ended the parables he told with a statement that said, "This is the point. If you get anything out of the story, get this." So next time we read that fairy tale or watch that movie, let's add the lesson.

# The Three Little Pigs & The Big Bad Wolf

- 1. Review the story of The Three Little Pigs. You can read the story, watch a movie, or simply retell the story.
- 2. Explain the Biblical Lessons that can be found in the story of the three little pigs.
  - a. The first two pigs didn't send much time making their houses. They hurried and cut corners.
  - b. When the wolf showed up, he easily blew down the houses of straw and sticks.
  - c. He even dressed as a sheep in some versions of the story. This is an important lesson. Sometimes things are not as they seem. Jesus even warns of false prophets which come in sheep's clothing (Matt 7:15).
  - d. The third pig worked much harder and stayed at it much longer as he built his house out of bricks. He knew that building his house of something strong would provide him protection. Jesus wants us to build our house on the rock (Luke 6:48).
  - e. When the wolf showed up at the third house, he huffed and puffed, but couldn't blow the house down. This is just like the man who built his house upon the rock. Even though rains and floods came, his house stood firm.
  - f. We need to build our lives on the Rock and then we can survive the wolves, storms, and floods that life brings.
