

Unity - A Prayer for Us

The closer we get to Easter, the more likely we are to reread the Pas-

sion of Christ, culminating in his death on the cross. In the 17th chapter of the Gospel of John we read Jesus' prayers that he prayed just before his arrest, suffering and death. Jesus prayed for himself, then for his disciples, and then for the



Jesus' relationship with our heavenly Father was based on always seeking and doing the will of the Father. Lent and Easter are great times to reflect on Jesus' prayer for us as the church and also a great time for us to reflect on the job we are doing seeking and doing the will of God personally.

Several months ago I came across a DVD series containing several sermons of Dr. Charles Stanley, Senior Pastor at First Baptist Church in Atlanta, Georgia. The series was entitled "Strong". The series included messages on the components of a strong life, a strong family, and a strong church. In this series dedicated to a strong church, it was noted that we do not often pray specifically for the church, per se. Even though we know

> from scripture that the church is precious to the Godhead because the church is described as the "bride of Christ", the church often does not make many of our prayer lists. What would happen if we added the church to our everyday prayers

for ourselves, our families and friends?

Dr. Stanley offered 4 suggestions for praying for the church:

1. That the Church would have a vision for the purpose to reach people for Christ and meet their needs.

2. That we would have a unity of Spirit through a total dependence on God.

3. That the church would have a spirit of obedience to God and his plan.

4. That the church would depend on the Holy Spirit to accomplish his purpose for the church.

Dr Stanley's suggestions have a common theme and implication. That is that we make a concerted effort to build our personal relationship with Christ. Jesus maintained his relationship with God by frequently spending time alone with God. Jesus often withdrew from the stresses of his earthly journey to spend time alone with God. Jesus gave us an example

of how to build our relationship with God by seeking God's presence and his voice through personal time of communion with God. Spending personal and quiet time with God daily is a discipline and a privilege that many Christians are neglecting.


I remember being exposed to this discipline of personal time with God as a camper in our denominational camping program. A quiet time with God was one of the first things we did - usually just before breakfast. We were given a Bible verse and sometimes a short devotional to read in a quiet place on the camp grounds. This time usually lasted about 15 minutes. Even at a young age, there was something very personal and special about that time. To spend a few minutes in the quiet of a summer morning in the midst of God's creation was unique and meaningful. The directors of those camping programs must have known how important it was to expose young people to the discipline and privilege of meditation and study alone with God, and I am grateful for this early exposure.

As adults, we can easily become so engrossed in our daily activities

that we fail to schedule time with God at the beginning of each day. We miss the opportunity to sit with God and talk to him and listen to him in silence, and build our relationship with Him and Christ.

This Easter, my prayer for the Unity of the Brethren is similar to Dr. Stanley's suggested prayer topics. My hope and prayer for us as a denomination is that the Holy Spirit would give us an insatiable appetite for the scriptures that we may come to know God more personally and intimately by spending time with him in study and prayer. Additionally, that the Holy Spirit would inspire more Brethren to respond to the call to take up our personal crosses and follow Christ through service to God and our fellow man. Over the past 7 years I have seen a number of examples of new ministries and service efforts around the Unity. These ministries are led by clergy and lay people alike. We heard about several of these ministries at the last convention, so we know momentum is being gained.

What could happen if we began to pray collectively for the church and became more unified with God and each other?

The King's Table - by Jim Pokorny

A Sunday school teacher once told me that things in the Old Testament point toward things in the New Testament. That is a lesson I have come to appreciate more and more.

The account of King David and Mephibosheth in the 9th Chapter of 2 Samuel is one of those Old Testament accounts that point toward a New Testament promise. The chapter begins with David asking if there is anyone left of the line of Saul because he wishes to extend kindness to him for the sake of Jonathan. Jonathan was Saul's son, whom David loved like a brother. A servant is then summoned who has knowledge of Saul's lineage. We learn of this son earlier in the 4th chapter.


When news of the deaths of both Saul and Jonathan came, Mephibosheth was a still a child. His nurse picked him up and fled, but in her haste to get away Mephibosheth fell and was injured. When the servant tells David about this remaining son of Jonathan he adds "both of his feet are crippled." David then sends for Mephibosheth. At this point, I have to wonder what was going through Mephibosheth's mind as he made the journey to meet the King that summoned him. After all, his grandfather the former king once hunted David intending to kill him. It is in the realm of possibility that Mephibosheth may have thought David wanted to extinguish Saul's line permanently.

When Mephibosheth is brought before David, he bows low with his face toward the ground in reverence. When David mentions his name, Mephibosheth replies, "Behold thy servant!"

David tells Mephibosheth not to fear and adds that he wants to show him kindness for the sake of Jonathan, his father. David then tells him that the family land will be restored to him. David then makes a promise. He promises that Mephibosheth will dine at his table continually.

This overwhelms the son of Jonathan.

2 Samuel 9:8 (KJV) – And he bowed himself, and said, "What is thy servant, that thou shouldest look



upon such a dead dog as I am?"

David is true to his word and the chapter ends with the fulfilled promise.

2 Samuel 9:13 (KJV) – So Mephibosheth dwelt in Jerusalem: for he did eat continually at the king's table and was lame on both his feet.

As Easter approaches, I find myself comparing my state to that of Mephibosheth.

One day, I will be summoned into the presence of God, who is perfectly holy and righteous. I, on the other hand, am not. I am crippled by a different and far more serious kind of fall and can by no means stand on my own merits as they are painfully insufficient. Like Mephibosheth, I would do well to approach with reverence.

God, however, will show me kindness. He will do so for the sake of His Son who did His will and died in my place. Just as the family land was restored to Mephibosheth, my access to heaven is restored to me. I, like Mephibosheth, will have a place at God's table continually.

I wish you a happy and blessed Easter season.



Next week





Easter Activities

Palm Sunday




