## Feels Like Far

December is once again upon us. As we make the transition from Thanksgiving to Christmas, I feel a certain obligation to invite you back for one final trip into that corner of my living room where I keep special reminders of my connection to my family.

This visit will not be an easy one for me, for there is one final object that I keep in that corner which I have not shared with you before.

This object stands about three feet tall, is made mostly of aluminum and has a handle. It is my mother's cane.

December 22, 2015, will mark the ten-year anniversary of Mom's passing.

Mom was 40 years my senior. Although she was mentally sharp, physically she suffered from debilitating arthritis. Pain was her constant companion.

When the weather was cold, she was in pain. When it was damp, she was in pain. When it was cold and damp she was in incredible pain.

Suffer as she might, she did not complain much. She did not have to. When you spend so many years with someone, you learn to read them like a book. Each morning I could look at her face and accurately gauge the

amount of difficulty she was going to face during the day while I was at work.

As the years went by and her condition worsened, she counted on me more and more. We found that our roles were reversing themselves. When I was young, I relied on her. Toward the end, she relied on me. She accepted this reversal of roles with both quiet dignity and remarkable grace. For my part, I was merely returning the kindness and love she once gave

I do not recall the exact point in time when that cane entered the picture. I do remember it being my idea rather than hers. Working 40 miles away, I told her I would have more peace of mind knowing she utilized it. She was not enthusiastic about the idea, but she eventually saw the wisdom in using it.

When weekends rolled around. I would take her shopping. This served two purposes. First, it would keep her mobile. I knew it was important that she stay as active as possible. Second, it would give her the opportunity to be around other people and socialize.

Ironically, people often got the wrong idea. They regularly suggested that I pull the car up to the door so she would not have to walk so far. I am certain many of them got the wrong impression of me. In their kindness they simply failed to understand that my motivation was for her to keep moving.

We certainly were not setting any speed records, and she often commented about that. I would respond by telling her that we were not in a race. I reminded her that what mattered was that we would get where we were going and that we were going to get there together.

As time went by I learned the location of every bench in every store that had one. When I felt she was tiring, I would alter our path to take us to the nearest bench. There I would suggest she have a seat while I finished the shopping.

Winter was the only thing that sometimes interfered with these plans. If it were cold and rainy I was more concerned about her slipping, so I would not take her out on those days.

If it were cold and dry I would insist on taking her out just so she could get her exercise. Many times as we walked from the car to the store in the frigid wind she would say to me in Czech, "Syn, je to dobre rozum?" which translates, "Son, does this make good sense?" To this day I recall those words every time a cold front blows in.

As the years went by, I knew it grew more likely that there might come a day when she would no longer be a part of my life, and I consciously began trying to prepare myself for that eventuality. That effort was completely futile. No matter how prepared you think you are, you discover that you are not prepared at all when the time comes.

December 21, 2005, began like any other day. Mom and I had breakfast together, and as I prepared her lunch we talked about our plans for Christmas Day.

We said our goodbyes and told each other "I love you" just before I left for work.

I had no way of realizing it at the time, but those were to be the last three words she would say to me in this world. When I came home from work that evening, I knew something was wrong as she was not there to greet me at the door. I found her lying

The following morning, after consulting with the doctor in charge of her case, I leaned on God harder than I ever had before. Around noon, I finally found the strength to make the decision to take her off life support.

It is one of life's greatest ironies that when you are at your absolute weakest, you find yourself forced to make an all-powerful and irreversible decision.

Fortunately, I had the wisdom to know that the decision was too big for me alone. Thanks to the foundation of faith this remarkable woman instilled in me, I knew it would not be too big for God.

I would have one final chance to say farewell to her. I have been told that people who are unable to respond can still hear and are aware on some level of what is going on around them. If this were true, I felt my best hope of reaching her would be saying my final farewell in the Czech language; the language she grew up speaking.

When the time came, I leaned in close and spoke directly into her ear, "Ja jsem tvuj syn, Jimmy. Miluji te.

S Panem Bohem." This translates. "I am your son, Jimmy. I love you. Go with God."

A moment later, she slipped peacefully away.

It is difficult for me to comprehend that ten years have passed since that most difficult of days.

Looking back on that day, I had absolutely no idea as to the path my journey would take without her. It is possible that she would have been a bit surprised at how my life has turned out thus far. I certainly have been.

There is one thing of which I am absolutely certain. This wonderful woman taught me throughout our years together. When I was young, she taught me with words. When I became a man, she taught me by example.

Proverbs 22:6 (NET) Train a child in the way that he should go, and when he is old he will not turn from it.

As I continue my journey, I keep her cane in that special corner. It is not as a reminder of her infirmity. I need no reminder of that. Rather, it is a daily reminder of the kind of relationship that we had.

So often she held that cane with

As for me, the journey continues. I am reminded of the 1972 movie *Jeremiah Johnson*, which starred Robert Redford. Near the end of that movie a mountain man by the name of Bear Claw commented on Jeremiah's journey, "You've come far, pilgrim." Jeremiah replied, "Feels like far."

Do you believe in miracles?

It is tough to believe sometimes... when the lab reports reveal diminished health;

when family just will not come together;

when a spouse leaves the marriage; when dreams that you have held for years turn out to not be within God's perfect and beautiful plan; when your finances have taken a downward turn;

when work is no longer fulfilling; when retirement becomes a place of isolation, or even increased helplessness.

Do you believe in miracles?

We must and we do, if the love and hope of Jesus Christ lives within us.

We cherish this time of year as we hang wreaths and put up Christmas trees. Great delight comes from giving gifts to those we love and to those in need. Is there anything that we cannot endure with a love so wide, so deep, and so full, as that of the One and Only Jesus Christ? Believe in the miracle of the Presence of Jesus Christ with you and within you.

Just believe.

That is the miracle that changes how you endure everything you are facing.

Faith is the greatest miracle to possess.

So go move some mountains this Christmas season!

## Fall Synodical Committee Meeting Minutes

The Fall Synodical Committee Meeting was held Saturday, October 24, 2015, at the Hus School Encampment. There were 49 people in attendance.

The meeting was called to order by President James Marek. Rev. Ron Winsman provided a devotional from John 20:24-31. The Treasurer reported a balance of \$194,144.06. A report was also given by the Audit Committee. It was approved by the Committee to spend \$25/month for on-going website maintenance. Dr. Larry Koslovsky provided information on possible changes in tax reporting for congregations.

Ministerial student Ben Kruse was examined. After a successful examination, he was granted a license beginning 10/24/2015 for one-year for the Rosenberg Church. The Committee asked that the educational requirements be completed in six months. The Referendum Vote results were accepted and the new Executive Committee Officers were installed by Dr. Larry Koslovsky.

Under New Business, the Granger Brethren Church requested funds (approximately \$60,000) to repair the church bell tower. After much discussion, no action was taken, but individuals were encouraged to help on their own and support the fundraising efforts of Granger.

Pastor Tim Chaplin (Temple Brethren Church) was granted a one-year license. Pastor David Johnson (New Tabor Brethren Church) was granted a five-year license. Appointments to all committees were approved, with the Executive Committee given the approval to fill any vacant positions as needed. The definition of a parttime pastor was approved. This was necessary for determining retirement benefits. It was approved that the *Brethren Journal* Treasurer would receive monthly remuneration of \$100.

The Foreign Mission Budget (\$68,000) and the Home Mission Budget (\$67,000) were approved. The Home Mission Board was also authorized to perform oversight and advisory functions for the Cade Lake Mission Project. Pastor David Johnson shared a revised Marriage Certificate that can be used by Unity Pastors. Dr. Larry

# In Christ's Love . . . From the Foreign Mission Fields

## From the Thiessen's...

November 9, 2015

Dear friends.

Anne is half way through her radiation treatments (30 altogether – she'll be done the 27th) and holding up pretty well. She's not sure if she's more tired from the daily doses or from worrying about how Elai's wedding is going to work out. We're refining details about the wedding, every week two steps ahead and one back. It's still on December 22nd, a Tuesday, and you're all still invited. We'll send a copy of the invite in a few weeks.

We travelled to Oaxaca for two weeks in late September, visiting teammates and catching up on different parts of our life there. We weren't able to renew our residency papers, so when we finally are ready to go back to live in Mexico (early summer), we will have one extra layer of paperwork to process, but it shouldn't be too difficult.

One part of our team was up in the US, and so for Canadian Thanksgiv-

ing we drove to eastern Pennsylvania to visit with Phil and Eunice and Ian, catching them on part of their tour around the NE. So in the beauty of fall in the Poconos amid old and new friends we celebrated and gave thanks, for another taste of glory divine.

We've been going to the hospital daily since then for Anne's treatment. Just a few seconds, not even two minutes, of actual "beaming" happens, but there is the waiting, and then the positioning (don't want to hit any wrong parts). We sometimes follow the session up with a walk through the gorgeous hillsides that the escarpment makes around here, taking in the changing colours and gradually revealed contours of the land as the leaves and underbrush fall and lend it sharpness. Sometimes we follow that with a small scoop of Italian chocolate gelato (for Anne).

Lastly, **RESOLVE**. Resolving means to let the person know that you won't be able to trust the person if they keep attacking you with their words.



- 3. Model responding with Kindness.


A friend runs up to you and yells: Why do you always have to do everything better than me! I'm sick of you always showing off.

On another note, my father has been in the hospital for over a week now. He fell 4 weeks ago and must have hit his head. This caused a slow bleed, and last week he was dizzy and couldn't walk. We took him to the hospital, where they drilled holes in his head to relieve the pressure.

# Industry & Fayetteville Brethren Churches "Honor Our Veterans" Service

The Industry and Fayetteville Brethren Churches held their sixth annual "Honor Our Veterans" service at the Industry Fireman's Hall on Sunday, November 8, 2015. The site of the service was changed from the Industry Brethren Church to the Industry Fireman's Hall due to a water pipe break and water leak in the church.

The hall was decorated with a large religious military banner hung from the ceiling in front of the stage. The podium had a wooden U.S.A. flag in front of it. Vases with large US flags were sitting on either side of the podium. On one side of the stage was a large tripod with a U.S. flag drape that held large wide red ribbon streamers that had each honored veteran's name on white labels. A ribbon that had the U.S. flag replicated made into a large bow was on the top of this. On the other side in front of the stage was a large grapevine round wreath with red, blue, and white flowers on it

(one for each deceased veteran) and had 5 flags on the top for the 5 military branches. A white dove was in the center above the flowers. In the center of the wreath was a brown wooden cross. On the bottom was a wide red ribbon that had "Thanks Vets" on it with white doves to each side and stars above it. The tables holding the memento U.S. small flags that were given to each honored person had a large arrangement of red, white, and blue flowers and flags in it. A table held the triangles that held small candles that each deceased veteran had lit in his/her honor. Tables had red, white, and blue bunting and large flag bows decorating the front of them. Flags lined the path to the front of the doors at the entry of the building. Additional red, white and blue decorations were throughout the hall with patriotic arrangements on all the tables. The honored veterans had


