



Bursting With Joy

New Creations in Christ are filled with joy.

Materials

a Bible, a facial tissue for every four kids, a teaspoon, baking soda, vinegar, and one plastic 35mm film container for each child.

Preparation

Before kids arrive, tear each facial tissue into fourths, and pour two teaspoons of vinegar into each film canister.

The Experiment

Read Psalm 98:4. On "go," I want each of you to act out Psalm 98:4. Ready, set, go! You can be really excited about God. Tell about a time when you were so excited about something that you felt like you were going to burst. Now let's try to make something else burst forth.

Show kids how to measure one teaspoon of baking soda and place it in the center of the tissue square. Have kids wrap the tissue around the baking soda. Tell kids to remove the lids of their film canisters and wait.

We need to be careful with the next step of our experiment. You're going to place the tissue inside your film canister and quickly put the lid on. Then we're going to stand back. A lot of pressure is going to build up inside – so much pressure, it just might burst!

Allow two kids at a time to conduct the experiment. Tell kids to quickly step back after they secure the lids. The lids will pop into the air, creating a lot of foam and giggles.

God wants us to be bursting with the good news of Jesus. When we have so much of God's joy built up inside, we just have to let it out! I hope that you're so excited about God that you'll be bursting all week!



New In Christ

Bible Lesson: Zacchaeus Becomes a New Person, Luke 19:1-8

Materials

Paper Towels, Lemon Juice, Plastic Cup/Bowl, Dirty/Old Copper Coins

Bible Lesson

Before sharing the story of Zacchaeus give each child or team a few dirty, old copper coins. Talk about how old the coins are and how they may have gotten so dirty. Then let them put the coins in the cups of lemon juice to soak as you tell the Bible story.

There was a man in the Bible who reminds me of these dirty coins. His name was Zacchaeus, and he was a tax collector who took money from poor people. He gave some of the money to the government, but much of it he kept for himself. Zacchaeus' life became filled with the dirtiness of sin because he lied, cheated, stole, and was unkind. Then Jesus came to visit Zacchaeus. Zacchaeus realized that Jesus loved him and was willing to forgive him for the dirty things in his life. He accepted Jesus' love and forgiveness and was cleansed (forgiven) of selfishness and unkindness. He immediately offered to return the money he had taken wrongfully. The old, sinful Zacchaeus became a brand-new person who was kind and willing to share.

Let the children remove their coins from the lemon juice and place on paper towels. What has happened to the coins? The lemon juice made the coins like brand new.

Jesus can do the same for you. Maybe your life is filled with unkindness, selfishness, and other sinful things. Jesus says that if we will admit these things, he will forgive us and cleanse us. Then He makes us brand new on the inside just as He did Zacchaeus.

A prayer:

Striving to get the Romans to pay attention to Jesus as the One True God and Savior of all the world, as opposed to the Roman pantheon of gods, must have certainly discouraged the Apostle Paul many times over. The trouble with discouragement is that it takes your eye off the "prize" - that is Jesus Himself. Discouragement leaves you in self-pity and derails vour efforts to be an overcomer. Paul expresses his frustrations with the challenges of being not just a Christian, but a Christian leader distinctly throughout the New Testament. Nonetheless, Paul always pressed on, understanding that if he placed all of his trust in God, that God would fill him with joy and peace for every single day, for every challenge that towered over him. Paul always pressed on, understanding that as

God filled him with joy and peace, his hope for the mission at hand would overflow by the power of the Holy Spirit. There is no room for discouragement while you are asking God to fill you with joy and peace as you trust in Him. You will overflow with HOPE! The beauty of this hope is that it is not of human origin. It does not depend on a flawed human effort. THIS HOPE comes by the power of God the Holy Spirit, and it will consequently overflow beyond measure!

What situation is discouraging you at present?

Succumbing to discouragement is lack of trust in God.

Rather than wrestling with what to do about the situation you are facing, wrestle with Jesus in prayer until you are only listening to His voice of truth, love, and encouragement. This is how we trust in God. Listen. Surrender. Then, receive God's joy and peace. Hope will overflow!



Surprise Us Again

My class is currently studying the book *Surprised by Hope: Rethinking Heaven, the Resurrection, and the Mission of the Church* by N. T. Wright. It is without a doubt the most challenging class I have led despite Wright's eloquence and my Czech persistence.

What is not surprising is the fact that, broadly speaking, we have lost touch with the concept of our own resurrection. The worlds of art and literature have muddied the waters so much that many people currently think of salvation in terms of the soul only. Even a few hymns we hold dear tend to muddle our thinking, as well.

We speak of "the resurrection of the body" when we recite the Apostle's Creed. We even take comfort in the words spoken at funeral services when we are assured of the hope of the resurrection. But when it comes down to it, do we really believe the words we recite and hear? But more on that later.

Wright makes a point very early on that the mission of the church should be to show others what the world would be like if God were actually "running the show." He states that we live in an age where politicians want to live like rock stars while rock stars pretend to be politicians. Wright adds: "Sorting out this mess – which the Christian hope, despite current opinion, is well suited to do – should mean, among many other things, a renewal of genuine political discourse, which God knows we badly need."

Wright also stresses that we do not build the Kingdom; rather, we build "for" the Kingdom. In the companion video he talks about a onceabandoned building in London that has been repurposed. People with severe handicaps (both mental and physical) have been taught how to mend broken furniture. Those whom society considered badly broken now serve a purpose. They take the damaged chairs and tables brought to them and make them both beautiful and useful once more. Even the onceabandoned building now serves a purpose. Wright uses this as a metaphor for the mission of the church today.

Wright also makes us rethink what salvation really means. According to Wright: "The work of salvation, in its full sense, is (1) about whole human beings, not merely souls; (2) about the present, not simply the future; and (3) about what God does through us, not merely what God does in and for us."

Looking at each point in turn, we see that the resurrection of the body is as vital a part of salvation as that of the spirit. Salvation is not just a hope for some distant future, but an important part of the here and now. Salvation is not limited to what God does for us, but what He does through us, as well, and therein lies the mission of the church.

Throughout his book, Wright restates that God created the world with a spoken word. God then looked upon His work and considered it good. God does not merely intend to gather faithful "souls" into heaven and then discard the rest of His good creation. God will put everything right. In fact, God began putting things right through Jesus. It is now up to us to be agents of change in a fallen world, of continuing to put things right. In Wright's words, to show others what the world

would be like if God were really "running the show." When will the world be put completely right? The moment when Jesus returns.

But what of the work we do in the present?

"Every act of love, gratitude, and kindness; every work of art or music inspired by the love of God and delight in the beauty of his creation; every minute spent teaching a severely handicapped child to read or to walk; every act of care and nurture, of comfort and support, for one's fellow human beings, and for that matter one's fellow nonhuman creatures; and of course every prayer, all Spirit-led teaching, every deed that spreads the gospel, builds up the church, embraces and embodies holiness rather than corruption, and makes the name of Jesus honored in the world – all of this will find its way, through the resurrecting power of God, into the new creation that God will one day make. That is the logic of the mission of God."

Remember, God brought the entire universe into being with a spoken word. The resurrection of the body presents no challenge at all. Spring 2019 Synodical Committee Meeting Summary

The Spring 2019 Synodical Committee meeting was held Saturday, March 30th, at the Hus Encampment. There were 53 in attendance: 33 voting members (19 pastors and 14 lay representatives) and 20 others. Rev. Larry Koslovsky welcomed everyone to the meeting and gave a devotion with the Sacrament of Holy Communion.

Synodical Committee Representative changes were approved for: Caldwell, Martha Huffman; Snook, Yvonne Kovar; Temple, Deborah Schiller; and Wall, Paul Beatty.

An examination of ministerial student Ryan Volkman was held by the examining board, which consists of the Synodical Committee members present at the meeting and directed by three ordained pastors appointed by the President. Appointed were Rev. Jimmy Heil, who asked questions regarding Ryan's background, sense of call, and work that he currently does; Dr. Jerry Terrill, Theology; and Rev Mike Groseclose, Practice of ministry. Ryan has been taking online classes through Fuller Theological Seminary, an approved seminary. Ryan grew up in Ohio in the Lutheran Church (LCMS), is married to Stanislava, and they have 2 boys. He is currently serving at the Wall Brethren Church as Director of Youth and Young Families. It was approved

Temple Brethren Church requested and was given approval to change its name. Rev. Tim Chaplin gave information about this, and several items were discussed. The new name will be "Cross Church on Birdcreek."

Rev. James Heil, Chair of the Ministers Benefits Committee, presented a report. The committee is asking the congregations to give a minimum of \$3000 a year (no maximum) to the retirement program that would be for their own pastors' retirement account. This is based on the definition of a pastor who qualifies for the program – "licensed or ordained who are under call to a congregation or parish, and who fill the pulpit of that congregation or parish at least 30 Sundays a year." If congregations can't contribute \$3K or if the pastor is considered part-time, a written, signed agreement will need to be submitted to the Ministers Benefits Committee. The proposal was approved, and will begin as of January 2019.

Kent Laza, Chair of the Hus Board gave an update on the Hus Encampment renovation project. Currently there are no construction projects underway. The next phase of fundraising is \$350,000; they have \$172,000. They are

receiving money from the oil well, and that goes into the building fund. The camp dates are in The Brethren Jour*nal* and on the website. This year they have an online process for registration. They need to be able to fund a Facilities Manager. In the past, a stipend of \$2-3K was paid, but no one has stepped forward to do this for free. It could be around \$20K a year for parttime work to keep the camp in order. A proposal will be presented at the convention on how to fund this position. A king-size quilt has been donated by Ruth Dusek from Wall to help raise funds for the camp. The quilt will be raffled off at the convention. A mailer will be sent to the members of the Unity asking for donations to the camp building fund.

Rev. Mark Sebek presented the Foreign Mission report and reported on the Hurricane Relief Effort. They have a balance in the account, and he stressed that the money will not sit, it will be used. It was announced that

the Israel missionaries, Joel and Teresa Jelski, will be at the convention, as well as others, and everyone will have an opportunity to meet with them. The amount contributed to Foreign Missions for 2018 was \$80,334.13; the budget was exceeded by \$7,334.13. They hope to finish the water well project in Honduras this fall. David Miller went to North Carolina for a World Missions meeting with the Moravians.

Martha Dove gave an update on the Cade Lake Community Chapel Building program. They were able to purchase a 24 x 64 foot building. It was moved by Shulz Moving Company. The Building Committee members are: Rev. Heckman, Rev. Kay Polasek, Ben Polasek, Martha & Jerry Dove, and Bro. Mark. Rodney Brosette is the acting contractor to oversee all the work, and he is doing it without compensation. They will have an audit of the books this year. Ben Polasek is the treasurer. They know exactly

how much money is going in and out. The Synodical Committee needs a copy of this report. A drawing of the building was presented. The amount contributed to Home Missions for 2018 was \$64,100.39; the 2018 \$58,000 budget was exceeded by \$6,100.39.

Bro. Mark said that Lamar Urbanovsky has been a blessing in getting this all done with the remodeling, and hope to have it complete with a deck built by Easter Sunday. They will be spending about \$85,000. The balance in the building fund as of March 29, 2019, is \$52,223.47. Pastor Kay gave a brief report. Getting out into the community is one of the most important things they can do. Bro. Jim & Diane Heckman do a great job with the ministry and the people. They have plans to have a re-dedication service soon.

The delegate fee for the 2019 Unity Convention was set at \$400 for each delegate. These fees cover administration costs, meals, and mileage of all convention members (Synodical Com-

mittee members – pastors & lay – and the delegates); meals for guests; room accommodations for the Executive Committee members, and for foreign missionaries' travel expenses. There was discussion on why the Foreign Mission Board is asking the missionaries to attend the convention and did not set in their budget for their travel accommodations. It was agreed that money can be taken from their Special Projects budget (\$10K) to help pay these expenses. Rev. Tommy Tallas reported that invitation letters will be sent out with hotel information. A meet & greet will be held on Wednesday evening at the hotel. A special program will be presented on Thursday night with Billy Riggs, a pastor/motivational speaker.

Rev. Whitney Amos, Third Vice-President and Chair of Constitution & By-Laws Committee, reported on the proposed changes regarding the Board of Grants and Bequests that were ratified from the last convention. They
