Bonhoeffer Revisited

We are still practicing self-isolation and social distancing as I write these words. Exactly when things "return to normal" remains to be seen. More importantly, what exactly "the new normal" might be like is equally elusive. For the past several years it has been my privilege to lead the Adult VBS class, and I continue to prepare for it knowing it could very well be postponed or perhaps even cancelled. Hoping for the best, my preparations continue.

For this year's class I have selected a recent addition to my DVD library: Bonhoeffer – Pastor, Pacifist, Nazi Resister. This 2003 documentary was produced by Martin Doblmeier and features the voice of Klaus Maria Brandauer reading quotes by Dietrich Bonhoeffer. The documentary relates Bonhoeffer's personal journey and includes photographs and some extremely rare film footage. Also included are interviews with family members, associates, friends, and students of Bonhoeffer.

It provides yet another glimpse

into the life of a man of God who played a significant role in the plots to assassinate Adolf Hitler. For many people, that inevitably appears to be a contradiction. How, they ask themselves, can a man of God consciously involve himself in the taking of a life? Even when the life in question is that of a ruthless dictator who tried to commit systematic genocide of Jewish, Slav, and other peoples. This presents us with a moral dilemma with which to struggle. This is completely understandable as Bonhoeffer agonized over it himself.

Books have been devoted to the question of why the German Church embraced Hitler and the Nazi party, so I will not address that aspect here. It must be stated that Bonhoeffer was German, a pacifist and deeply religious. Although Bonhoeffer's family was not particularly religious, it must have come as a surprise when Bonhoeffer's mother told him that the church must do something about what came to be known as The Jewish

Question. Bonhoeffer's personal convictions were revealed in stark clarity in a talk he gave to fellow pastors in 1933 entitled *The Church and the Jewish Question*. In it, he stated the following.

"The church has three possible ways it can act against the state. First, it can ask the state if its actions are legitimate. Second, it can aid the victims of state action. The church has an unconditional obligation to the victims of any ordering society, even if they do not belong to the Christian society. The third possibility is not just to bandage the victim under the wheel, but to jam a spoke in the wheel itself."

Bonhoeffer understood that the church had both a moral and ethical obligation to stand up to an evil regime including the man at its head. He also understood that he, as an individual Christian, had the same moral and ethical obligation. One he pursued even though it resulted in his own death. Bonhoeffer was hanged along with fellow conspirators for high treason just days before Germany's surrender at the end of World War II.

Among the many interviewed for this documentary, I found Archbishop Desmond Tutu's remarks perhaps the most insightful. Tutu is best known for his role in South Africa's struggle against apartheid. While Nelson Mandela was imprisoned, Archbishop Tutu continued to speak out against the evils of South Africa's regime and was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1984.

Doblmeier must have seen parallels between Tutu and Bonhoeffer. That said, Tutu's admiration for Bonhoeffer was quite evident as in the statement: "He could have such a great deal of faith in God even in the midst of incredible darkness."

Tutu's own personal struggles allowed him to give insight into Bonhoeffer's personal struggles as well.

"It's so easy to be sucked in by the structures and to be sucked in by a false kind of loyalty, and maybe ending up with a false church. When God grabs you by the scruff of the neck, then although theologically you have a freedom to say 'No', in another sense, actually you can't say 'No'. Because... it's like Jeremiah. 'God, you called me to be a prophet against the people I love. And all I proclaim is words of doom and judgement. And yet, If I say I will shut up... I can't!""

"There's no shaft of light that comes from heaven and says to you 'Okay, my son (or my daughter), you are right!' You have to hold on by the skin of your teeth and hope there is vindication on the other side!"

The Brethren Journal (Bratrské Listy)

The first issue of the *Bratrské Listy*, now known as *The Brethren Journal*, was published in January 1902. It has been continuously published since that time, except for one year during WWI.

Mostly a private project of Rev. Adolph Chlumsky, it was declared the official publication of the Unity of the Brethren at the first convention in 1903. The purpose of the Journal was to publish information concerning the activities of the Unity of the Brethren and articles of interest and inspiration to all of its subscribers.

Rev. Chlumsky donated *The Brethren Journal* to the Unity in 1912. In 1944 the Journal became bilingual with both English and Czech language sections. Eventually, by the 1960s, the Journal was exclusively English with some exceptions such as Czech Sunday School lessons and Bible texts.

The format of the Journal has changed little since it was changed to its present book size with 28 to 36 pages. It is now published monthly, 10 times per year with January and February, and July and August combined into one month each.

The Journal is asking for articles to publish about activities that may be taking place in the churches of the Unity of the Brethren.

How is your church helping your members and community during this time of the COVID-19 Pandemic? What are some of the virtual activities the church is conducting? How are you supporting one another during this time of quarantine? What is your church planning for the future?

These are just a sampling of ideas that can be used for articles to be submitted to *The Brethren Journal* for publication. Also, photographs are welcome in addition to an article.

Fields of Wheat Ministry

We have some big news to share with you!

As you may know, I shared some very specific prayer points in our last update. Over the past few months we have been praying a lot about what are our next steps given some of the changes that were taking place in our ministry. The Lord showed up big time and answered our prayers.

Property for Fields of Wheat Training Center

Over the past year, we have been looking for different properties, and about 6 months ago came across a large property in the Golan Heights, which we initially dismissed since it was empty and would require extensive development. But the more we searched, the more we realized this might actually be our best course of action. As we began to investigate the potential of purchasing it, we began to realize that if we indeed purchased this property we would need to move to the Golan Heights to help spearhead its development (you may be aware that Trump recognized the Golan Heights recently as a legitimate part of Israel). One condition I put before the Lord and that I shared with the spiritual father of Fields of Wheat, Eitan Shishkoff, was that we could not move there by ourselves. We would need a few families to form a small community to be a part of. The Golan is not very populated, is mostly small villages far from central loca-

Explain that some people try to depend on their own strength or the things that they have made to protect them, but these things never last very long. Explain that this stone will be a reminder to them, that the Lord is our fortress, our deliverer, our shield, the strength of our salvation, and the one in whom we can take refuge. It is wise to trust in the Lord because His help lasts forever and cannot be destroyed.



Discipleship Program

David, who is the founder of the discipleship program, with whom I served closely these past 2 years, decided earlier this year it was time to step away. We began praying about the continuation of this very effective program. My heart was to continue investing in young adult disciples, usually at a crossroads in their life. We prayed that God would send people who have a heart for discipleship to work with us. We knew we couldn't continue on our own. Little did we know that God was already speaking to someone...

After a few weeks of prayer, I suddenly got a call from a friend with whom I had worked closely for a few years in Jerusalem. They had been on a sabbatical, and sensed the Lord was calling them to move to the north, to be a part of a believing community, be a part of discipling young people, and to be involved in future Fields of Wheat development, and they asked if we were willing to move to the Golan Heights this summer with them. Their names are Cody and Liat, and

they have 3 children. We have a lot of wonderful history with them - Cody and I worked together at Succat Hallel house of prayer in 2012, and from 2014-2017 he helped me lead the youth group of our congregation in Jerusalem. Cody was my accountability partner for a few years, and we were neighbors in the same building in Jerusalem for 2+ years. They have a passion for discipleship, and both have extensive experience in ministry and media. In essence, God couldn't have answered our prayers with better people! So after some time to pray, and knowing that this family and another couple were planning to move there, we decided this summer was the right time to move again and plant our family in the Golan Heights! This was emotionally a really difficult decision, even though it's the right one, because we have established such a good relationship with the families in the community we are in now. It's very hard to say goodbye, but we are excited about doing the same in a new area with new families.

Moving to the Golan will cost about \$2000. If the Lord puts it on your heart, would you consider giv-




About the property we are looking
