Pandemic

As early as March 8th congregations suspended gathered community services (Sunday morning worship) to shelter at home and attempt to mitigate the corona virus, COVID-19.

The creativity of congregations to remain connected and continue worship in some form is amazing, incorporating the local gifts of members and technology at hand. The response to the pandemic has called on flexibility and adaptation to the crisis, taking us out of our comfort zones and pushing us outside the walls of buildings. The virus reminds us that the Body of Christ is not a building, but rather individuals connected as the Body of Christ for the purpose of ministry.


Initially the Executive Committee gave guidance to congregations. As the pandemic has continued, pastors in conversation with their Boards have made decisions about returning to worship given the directives of social distancing as well as the unique situations of each congregation. Over the past several weeks, it has become apparent that one size does not fit all. Each congregation is returning to worship and activity, given its the context – age of attenders, size of congregation, capacity of sanctuary, and community levels of the virus.

Ocker Brethren Church

On Thursday evening, April 2, Ocker Brethren Church was struck by lightning. Fire ensued from the strike, extensively damaging the upstairs classrooms at the rear of the 89-yearold sanctuary. There is also extensive water and smoke damage to the sanctuary and kitchen area of the Fellowship Building. Fortunately, insurance is in place. Damage is estimated to be at least \$900,000. Please keep the Ocker congregation in your prayers.

Hus Camp Schedule

With the pandemic came a juggling of the camp schedule. Initially it was thought that the camp program for this year would be cancelled. The Board of Trustees along with Camp Directors held out making a decision until the last possible moment, anticipating directives from health authori-

ties on whether or not camps would be able to operate this summer. The camping program has shifted to June 28 through July 31. Measures are being made to keep all campers and staff safe.

Clean Up

On Saturday, June 6th, 28 individuals of all ages carried out tasks tree and brush removal, painting, repairs, pressure washing - to get the camp ready for a different kind of camping season. One of the larger projects was the removal of a large tree that fell on the pavilion at the pond during a spring windstorm, damaging a corner of the roof.

Main Building Improvements

We are into year 2 of building improvements to the Main Building. Phase 2 is scheduled to begin in the Fall with a targeted date of October 1st. On behalf of the Unity and the camp, thanks to all who have donated to give the Main Building much needed renovations. Completion of this project is anticipated for the early part of 2021.

Hus Revisited - by Jim Pokorny

"Therefore, faithful Christian, seek the truth, hear the truth, learn the truth, love the truth, speak the truth, adhere to the truth, defend the truth even till death; for the truth will make you free from sin, the devil, the death... My dearest, live according to the discerned truth which prevails over everything and is powerful forever." Most of us are familiar with these words of Jan Hus. We also understand that Hus willingly died defending the truth of his teachings. He refused to recant them despite pressures from the Council of Constance. Time and again, his inquisitors demanded he recant. Time and again, Hus challenged them to show him in scripture where he was in error. They made no such attempt.

Hus was neither Brethren nor was he Protestant, but like many, I am glad we continue to celebrate the life of this faithful servant of God.

Having recently finished a personal study of Dietrich Bonhoeffer and some of his sermons, my thoughts turned to Hus as July approached. In my research I came across letters from

his final years. Some of these were written to Hus during his imprisonment. Many were written by Hus in order to pass the time as well as to answer the charges being put to him.

Particularly moving to me were references I found to Hus writing on scraps of paper. In one instance, Hawlik, the priest at Bethlehem, was about to read a letter from Hus to the congregation. Upon examining the scrap of paper itself, Hawlik stated: "Alas, alas! Hus is running out of paper." John of Chlum is reported to have received a letter from Hus written on a "tattered three-cornered bit of paper."

In a letter from April 1413 to Master Christian of Prachaticz, Rector of the University of Prague, Hus wrote the following: "It is better to die well than to live badly. We must not sin to avoid the punishment of death. To end in grace the present life is to be banished from misery. He that adds knowledge, adds labor. He that speaks the truth, is smitten on his own head. He that fears death, loses the joys of

life. Above all else, truth is conqueror."

Hus wrote at least three letters on June 29, 1415, mere days before his martyrdom. One of these was to his friends in Bohemia. In it, Hus concluded with these words: "I write this in prison in fetters, which I am wearing, I trust, for the gospel of God, expecting every moment the sentence of death. For God's sake, I pray you suffer not good priests to be oppressed."

In another to Wenzel de Duba, Hus closed with these words: "God is still upholding the life of Hus by His might; yea, and will uphold it so long as He wills, against the proud, greedy, and in diverse ways unconscionable Council, wherein the Lord knoweth them that are His."

In a third to John of Chlum, Hus wrote: "The kings of this world do not act thus with their servants. They only care for them so long as they are useful and necessary to them. Not so Christ, the King of glory, Who hath today crowned the apostles Peter and Paul – Peter by crucifixion, Paul by beheading...May those glorious martyrs, thus united with the King of glory, deign to intercede for us, that, strengthened by their help, we may be partakers in their glory, by patiently suffering whatever God Almighty shall ordain in this world for our greater good."


We live in an age of fake news; an age in which the truth has become a relative concept. It has even been stated that what is true for one individual might not necessarily be true for another. Politicians on both sides of the aisle willingly abandon the truth. Our press is no longer objective. It has an agenda that panders to its target audience. It also willingly preys upon our fears.

Hus innately understood that truth, all truth, is of God. Hus never allowed fear to dominate his life. Nor should we.

I close with these words from a memorial hymn of the Moravian Church for the death day of Hus...

For all thy saints, O Lord, Who strove in thee to live, Who followed thee, obeyed, adored, Our grateful hymn receive. For all thy saints, O Lord, Accept our thankful cry, Who counted thee their great reward.

And strove in thee to die.

Bend to the Lord Jesus Christ

Our nation bends to certain ideologies

Our bodies bend to pick up something we've dropped

Our churches bend to orthodox teachings

Yet to whom does your mind bend throughout the days and moments that the Heavenly Father has given vou?

To what does your mind bend as the hours and minutes pass, as clouds come and go?

What is your propensity toward the whispers and the loud booms of the Holy Spirit?

Can you hear the Holy Spirit calling and requiring you to bend to the Lord Jesus Christ in all things, at all times, and in every way?

The most practical way to "bend to the Lord Jesus Christ," is to flip the word order of your sentences. Let the subject be "Jesus" in lieu of "I". For

instance, instead of saving: "I am weary, Lord Jesus." Sav: "Lord Jesus, strengthen my weary mind and my tired hands and feet." Like flipping a pancake, flip the pattern of your speech and consequently your thoughts and actions will shift - your entire being rather - to a state of mind that brims over with confidence and peace that nothing can shake because you are bending to the Lord Jesus Christ.

Bend to the Lord Jesus Christ. right now.

Ask the Holy Spirit to show you how to bend to the Lord Jesus Christ as you read through this portion of his letter to the Ephesian Church – a group of Christ followers dealing with great opposition, needing with much desperation to become practiced in "bending to the Lord Jesus Christ":

11...in accordance with the eternal purpose that he has carried out in Christ Jesus our Lord, 12 in whom we have access to God in boldness and confidence through faith in him.



→

13 I pray therefore that you may not lose heart over my sufferings for you; they are your glory. 14 For this reason I bow my knees before the Father, 15 from whom every family in heaven and on earth takes its name. 16 I pray that, according to the riches of his glory, he may grant that you may be strengthened in your inner being with power through his Spirit, 17 and that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith, as you are being rooted and grounded in love. 18 I pray that you may have the power to comprehend, with all the saints, what is the breadth and length and height and depth, 19 and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God. 20 Now to him who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, 21 to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen. (Ephesians 3:11-21, NRSV)

May 29, 2020 Pedagogy of the Oppressed

Dear friends,

Last fall Anne and I took a course offered by SIL (Wycliffe translators) at their center near Oaxaca City. It's title, Dialogue Education, for the uninitiated doesn't immediately conjure up what it was about. The course is based on the ideas of a (fairly famous, not widely read) 50-year-old book that has been instrumental in shaping several disciplines, not just education, where it started: *Pedagogy of the Oppressed*, written by Brazilian educator and published in English in 1970.

This book is considered one of the foundational texts of and proposes a new relationship between teacher, student, and society. Dedicated to the oppressed and based on his own experience helping Brazilian adults to read and write, Freire explores the relationship between the colonizer and the colonized. Freire calls traditional pedagogy the "banking model of education" because it treats the student as an empty vessel to be filled with knowledge, like a piggy bank (the assumption that normal preaching is based on). He argues that pedagogy should instead treat the learner as a co-creator of knowledge (taken from what Mexicans call San Wiki, with an insert by me).

One of the first steps in the process is "boil it down." Condense your ideas, because it will take longer to teach in this more student-oriented way, among other reasons.

Well, last week, we taught our normal 30-hour course on Healthy New Churches (And all the Ways You Can Weaken One, Especially in Cross-Cultural Situations – that's not the written subtitle, but it is a large part of the course). This was with the nine participants in the Sin Fronteras missionary candidate training, the ones that we wrote about making up the Seventh Simple Church

And then this week we boiled it down for a six-hour teaching done by Zoom for a group of nine that the other Multiply missionaries are train-



Then, after everyone wearing red is safe on the other side of the room, the King chases everyone else. They try to run to the other side before the King catches them. If the King is able to tag someone, this child becomes the new King David and the play continues. EXAMPLE: Only BOYS, only GIRLS, only if you have SHOES WITH LACES, or only if you have LONG HAIR, etc.

DO: Edible Crowns Times Two

- Fresh Fruit Crowns: Materials: Pineapple rings, strawberries (chopped), blueberries, grapes (halved). Give each child a plate with a pineapple ring. Have them add the other fruit as jewels on the crown.
- Cookie Crowns: Materials: Cookies (round or crown shaped), chopped fruit (strawberries, blueberries, grapes, pineapple, banana), cream cheese, vanilla, sugar.

Make the cookies and icing ahead of time (8 oz. cream cheese, 1/3 cup sugar, 1/2 teaspoon vanilla).

Give each child a cookie and let them smear on some icing. Let them use fruit to create jewels on the crown.

BIBLE STORY Scripture: 2 Samuel 5:1-10 David becomes King



- 4. What do you imagine the celebration was like when the people crowned David as their new King? (Allow for answers.)

DO: *I Just Can't Wait to Be* ___: Ask kids to think about what they want to be when they grow up. Have them act it out for the others to guess. Explain there are many jobs we can do. No matter what our job is, we should be assured we are working for the Lord and honor Him with our work.

ing in Guadalajara (mid NW Mexico). We were supposed to spend a week with them in Mexico City, but of course COVID-19 is wreaking havoc on plans here, too. This group is more general discipleship (the SF group is quite specifically for long-term crosscultural missions), and with what is being called "Zoom fatigue," we all decided that three days of two-hour segments was sufficient. It forced Anne and me to dig deep into the heart of what we try to help students conclude for themselves from looking anew at the teaching of Jesus and Paul, while pointing out how much the Western Church has accumulated along our 2000 years of history.

We discovered that teaching via Zoom, while sufficient during this pandemic, greatly limits the opportunity for Dialogue Education. We will have to keep exploring how to do that better, but we're not sure how to overcome the face-to-face advantage of live teaching. I imagine that our present reality will continue to provide opportunities to refine the process.

In early June, Anne starts four weeks of linguistic and phonetics training for the SF group. She teaches one of the three areas and helps coordinate overall. This is another SIL course and it is based on the Dialogue Education model, too. Anne has been preparing extensively for months now, but still feels out of her depth (both in content and method), causing her stress. Please pray about that!

We are heading up to the US (Maybe ON) in mid July. Our visas end around then, and the SF students will be out in their village settings by

then. There is so much uncertainty in all three of our countries that we can't really make plans beyond a few weeks at a time. Pray for that, too!

One opportunity we really hope works out, in mid August there is a two-week training that Anne is signed up for in WA state about all this language learning that she is involved with, taught by the fellow that originated the ideas 20 years ago. And on August 26th we celebrate 30 years of life together. We had hoped for something special, but who knows now?

Thank you for everything, and please help us pray about trusting Jesus for tomorrow's problems.


