Ocker Brethren Church Sanctuary Dedication

Brethren Family,

My name is Brad Herridge and I am the pastor at Ocker Brethren Church.

I would like to formally invite all our fellow Brethren Churches to a special Sanctuary Dedication Service on February 21 at 3 p.m. in our newly rebuilt and remodeled building at Ocker Brethren Church. We want to celebrate with you the completion of a long journey from fire and devastation to new life and restored sanctuary.

I know that all our Brethren churches have had a challenging year due to the COVID crisis and I pray for all our churches on a regular basis.

However, Ocker Brethren Church has had a particularly difficult and unique year. I want to take this opportunity to share with you a more detailed version of what has taken place at Ocker over this past year:

The beginning of 2020 started out like any other year for us... The church and her ministries were humming along as they always had without fail. Then, the COVID pandemic hit and, like many of our fellow Brethren churches, we had to make some tough decisions.

While under a stay-at-home order issued in March by the county government and a prohibition on meeting in groups of ten or more, and presented with what we believed to be the very real threat of sick individuals overrunning our hospitals, the Board of Elders (along with myself) agreed that the most responsible decision (at that time) would be to temporarily pause in-person worship and all inperson ministries at Ocker Brethren Church. I would like to stress that this unprecedented decision was only made





after much discussion, thought and prayer.

Just as we were figuring out how to best be the church in the middle of a once-in-a-century pandemic, we were hit with another tragedy. On the evening of April 2, 2020, a strong lightning storm was illuminating the sky and dazzling onlookers in and around our community. While Ocker's sanctuary building has witnessed countless storms in its almost 100vear history and survived without major incident, it did not survive this storm. That one storm produced one lightning bolt which hit our Sunday School/Sanctuary building and ignited a devastating fire that quickly spread. In a matter of minutes our building was engulfed in either thick smoke or flaming fire.

If it were not for the quick work of local and community volunteer and city fire departments, our beloved sanctuary would have been a total loss. Thankfully, even though it suffered extensive damage, we were able to save the sanctuary structure.

The outpouring of love and support we received from around the Brethren denomination and the greater community was immense and heartwarming. Stories of how much our church meant to so many people through the years became commonplace. With each story, the true sacredness of our church was revealed and its incalculable meaning to so many was laid bare.

From that moment on, Ocker Brethren Church (I am sure) entered the Spring as being one of the only churches in America to be dealing with a pandemic and the immediate results of a devastating church fire.

After the fire, Ocker did what we all knew she would do...We banded together and started the hard work of rebuilding in a pandemic. With our motto – we love our building, but we

love the people more – we set about the overwhelming task of cleaning, remediation and remodeling.

What was the result? In relative short order, the damage to the sanctuary and affected area(s) was cleared and a construction company was hired to help us rebuild. Now, almost seven months later, we are approaching completion of what will be a beautifully restored country church. We hope to have worship services in our remodeled sanctuary by the beginning of 2021, if not sooner.

On a personal level, I believe this was a real tipping point year for our church. The tragedies of this past year offered a distinct fork in the road for us as a community of believers... and I am happy to report that I believe we took the path of grace, love and mercy... I am so proud.

Our desire is that when you walk into Ocker's remodeled sanctuary you will be taken back with its beauty...not

because of what you see with your physical eyes, but by what you see with the eyes of your heart. It is our hope that, with the eyes of your heart, you will see the walls gleaming with the fruits of the Spirit that have been given and received in that same space for so many years...we hope you see the stage filled with the Holy Spirit swirling around in the wood...and the pews packed to capacity with the spirit of our saints along with current members who strive to follow Christ in all they say and do.

We look forward to next year when we can worship in our renewed Sanctuary as a renewed church family... solid in our foundations, anchored in our rich tradition, and rebuilt (literally and physically) by love.

Our pathway towards joy:

- and women and all who were able to understand. 3 He read it aloud from daybreak till noon as he faced the square before the Water Gate in the presence of the men, women and others who could understand. And all the people listened attentively to the Book of the Law. 4 Ezra the teacher of the Law stood on a high wooden platform built for the occasion. May It Be Well With Your Soul! A Homily by Dr. Jerry Terrill

Friends,

I hope and pray that you are well. Today is the day that the Lord has given each of us to celebrate the life and the love of Jesus Christ, the power of the Holy Spirit.

In the midst of this pandemic, we truly experience the words of the apostle Paul in Romans 5:3-5. 3 Not only so, but we[a] also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; 4 perseverance, character; and character, hope. 5 And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us.

In 1871 a Christian lawyer from Chicago named Horatio Spafford lost his only son. A few months later he lost his life's savings when the Great Chicago Fire destroyed his real estate investments.

In 1873, he and his family decided to take a European vacation. But at the last minute he was delayed by business. He placed his wife and four daughters on the S.S. Ville de Havre

sailing from New York to France. He fully expected to leave on another ship to join them in about three or four days.

On the evening of November 22, 1873, the Ville de Havre was suddenly struck by an iron sailing vessel, the Lochearn, and sank in twelve minutes. 226 people were killed.

Back in the United States Horatio Spafford was waiting for news of his family. After waiting for ten days, he received a six-word telegram from his wife which read: "Saved alone. What shall I do?"

Filled with anguish, Spafford immediately left Chicago to bring his wife home. While sailing near the place where his daughters had died, he wrote the words to the hymn "It Is Well With My Soul".

"When peace like a river, attendeth my way, When sorrows like sea billows roll, Whatever my lot, thou hast taught me to say, It is well, it is well, with my soul."

In spite of the tragedy in their lives, neither Spafford nor his wife, Anna, lost faith. Instead, it sustained

Renovations of Main Building Begin at Hus Encampment





Supplies: Paper plates, yarn, construction paper, cotton balls, feathers, googly eyes, markers, crayons, or paint


Day 1: Night & Day

To illustrate night and day, color half of a paper plate black and half yellow to illustrate night and day.



Day 2: The Sky

To illustrate the sky, color the entire paper plate blue. Then add cotton ball clouds.

Color the top half the paper plate blue and the bottom half green/half blue. Use contruction paper to make flowers and trees for the land. Use a darker blue color to make waves in the lower blue portion.

Color the entire plate yellow except for a moon shape. Color the moon shape gray. Add construction paper stars.



Day 5: Creatures that live in the sea and creatures that fly


