### From the President . . . Rev. Larry Koslovsky

#### **COVID**

To say the least, COVID has challenged all of us in so many ways – how we worked, how we bought groceries, how we received health care, how we did family, and yes, how we worshipped, and even at this writing still does. Certainly, it changed the way we worshipped. Some of the changes may be long lasting; others will fall by the wayside, just because they were appropriate at the time and for a season.

At this point, however, it is good to know that all our congregations are meeting again in person. Some congregations did not meet in person for the past year but resumed by Resurrection Sunday, 2021. Others have been able to meet for the past year, following protocols that worked in light of their local setting and size of the congregation.

What is to be celebrated is the fact that while we have been challenged, there has been great and wonderful creativity to meet spiritual needs during this time. #### Convention

### **Respect for the Past**

There are times in life when you feel like you just need something good to happen. God provides such moments, and He involves special people in the process. But often, it is just that, a process. In my case, the process began in September 2019 when I spoke to members of the Texas Czech Genealogical Society in Caldwell, Texas, on the history and development of Brethren Churches within the state. Along with my presentation, I was delighted to speak informally with both small groups and individuals. Only a year and a half has gone by, but the pandemic almost makes this feel like ancient history.

On a recent Sunday morning, just prior to the start of our worship service, I was approached by two dear friends bearing a gift bag. This gift was from someone at the event with whom I had a most delightful conversation regarding Brethren history. Inside the bag were two incredibly old books from his personal library that he wanted me to have.

One of these is *The Moravian Manual Containing an Account of*

The other is *The History of the Church* Known as The Unitas Fratrum or The Unity of the Brethren, Founded by the Followers of John Hus, the Bohemian Reformer and Martyr by Edmund De Schweintz, S. T. D. (1885). Considering these treasures, I knew I would have to read them with care. Each is more than a century old; their pages have vellowed with the passage of time and their bindings are not as secure as they once were.

I decided to read the older of the two first as it was the longest at 658 pages contained within its 56 chapters and 3 appendices. As I write this at the close of April, I have digested 140 pages which make up the first 15 chapters. Thus far, I have found De Schweintz not only to be very thorough in his historical account but also very meticulous in matters regarding sources as is evidenced by his abundant footnotes.

De Schweintz begins with the his-

He then devotes some 40 pages to an incredibly detailed account of John Hus (1369-1415), from the beginning of the Bohemian Reformation as inaugurated by Hus to his opposition to Papal Indulgences, from his voluntary exile to his arrival at the Council of Constance and his subsequent condemnation and martyrdom.

A history of the Hussites follows (1415-1457), beginning with the Hussite Wars and various factions, from Rokycana and the Utraquist Church, from Peter Chelcicky to those who founded the Ancient Unity. He proceeds from the founding to the earliest development of the church (1457-1460), the first persecution of the Brethren (1461-1463), the Synod of Reichenau and the Brethren's separation from the Utraquist Church (1464-1466), the Synod of Lhota and the institution of an independent ministry (1467).

I still have hundreds of pages and several centuries of history yet to study in this one book alone. Although it is a journey that I have undertaken with other authors serving as my guides, it is always one I enjoy taking. God has blessed each of us with both a rich history and a remarkable heritage. It does not matter whether you grew up Brethren or are its newest member. Each of us has an equal share in that blessing.

As stated at the outset, the receipt of these books was that "something good" that I felt I needed to have happen. I also know that God provided this and involved some incredibly special people in the process. This, of course, applies to the one from whose library these books originated and whose conversation I enjoyed those many months ago. It also includes my dear friends who delivered these into my hands and whom I have asked to relay my gratitude.

I am also aware that the collecting of books and the amassing of knowledge are not to be considered goals. Knowledge kept is the mental equivalent of hoarding. Knowledge gained should be shared. This is especially true in matters of history and heritage. As Maya Angelou once said: "I have great respect for the past. If you don't know where you've come from, you don't know where you're going."



#### From Joel & Teresa Jelski... Missionaries in Israel

#### The Valley of Tears

As you may know, last year Teresa and I started the process of doing fertility treatments. After almost 6-7 months round of treatment, we found out Teresa was pregnant in early February. It seemed like things were going well. Then 2 days before Passover, in late March, we found out the pregnancy had stopped, probably around 6-7 weeks. We were crushed. She was told she would need to have medical intervention since her body was not dealing with the failed pregnancy, but we decided to wait 2 weeks, praying for a miracle, but also giving her body a chance to deal with it on its own before seeking medical intervention. Early last week we finally went to the hospital, got confirmation that the pregnancy indeed ended, and got medication for her.

The 2 weeks in between, in the waiting, not knowing, hoping, grieving, and dealing with crushed hopes,

was one of the most difficult emotional experiences in recent memory personally, but also for both of us – Teresa was going through another miscarriage (her 4th failed pregnancy).

During those 2 weeks, the Lord really encouraged me from Psalm 84 and 23 – walking through the valley of tears and the valley of death, and from John chapter 11 – the story of Lazarus. Somehow, we find God (or Yeshua) as someone who is comfortable with our brokenness, pain, grief, and disappointment. He doesn't shy away from it, and is deeply emotionally involved in our suffering – as seen is Yeshua's own emotional state revealed to us in the story in chapter 11, when Mary weeps at His feet, pouring her grief and pain out to Him. We can go through seasons of vallevs of tears and still hold on to the truth – that He is faithful, good, and His presence is our comfort through the grief. There is hope in the journey through the valley, and there is light at end of the tunnel.

"Those who dwelt in the land of the shadow of death, upon them a light has shined." (Isaiah 9:2)

"The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." (John 1:5)

Thank you for walking with us through this journey and keeping us in your prayers.

#### **Prayer Requests**

• Family – pray for us as we continue the fertility treatments (we are



on a break for reasons stated above for 4-6 weeks). We are believing ultimately that life is in His hands, not ours. We will continue doing what we can, but ultimately trust in His will for our family. We are hoping to get some medical insight into why Teresa keeps having miscarriages right around 6-8 weeks, if there could be a medical reason for it.

- Katzir Please pray for us as we pray and decide how to proceed with Katzir. At this point, in order to hold youth camps, we would need to do it through the green passport program which means only vaccinated youth (or negative test for under 16) which we are not excited about, so we need to pray about our direction. We don't like the idea of having youth camps under those kinds of restrictions.
- Property We are currently in negotiation for a small hospitality-type property in the Golan Heights for Fields of Wheat. Please pray for wisdom for our team, as the next few weeks will be critical to whether we will be able to purchase said property. We would also need some financial miracles, but we trust the Lord if He wants us to purchase it. I can't publicly share details at this point, but as

soon as we proceed and can make things public, I will share all the details with you.

Materials: 2 paper plates per child, wiggly eyes, blue construction paper, stapler, cutout figure of Jonah




- 1. Color the outside of two plates blue. Color the inside red.


