Eyes on Me, NOT on the Cookie Jar!

"Eyes on Me," says the Lord.

God tells me this almost nonstop. I am grateful that His patience and love are perfect. Growing up, Mom kept a bright-blue ceramic cookie jar in the kitchen that was actually in the shape of the Cookie Monster character from the Sesame Street children's television series. He had a little sign that he held that read: "Cookies". For a child whose mother was always baking some sort of cookies or other desert from scratch, the blue Cookie Monster jar was like a childhood friend. It didn't take much once I walked into the kitchen to put my eyes on the Cookie Monster jar. Especially at Christmas, Mom would have a vast assortment of sugary delights: peanut butter blossom cookies, traditional chocolate chip cookies, Snickerdoodle cookies, ... the list goes on. Mom, however, was not always patient with my affinity for her baking. Regardless of the time of day, whether breakfast was served or as an evening snack, I was always ready for one of Momma's cookies with a little glass of milk. Most days, my strategy was to sneak a cookie, and I rejoiced as my techniques went unnoticed - or so I thought. In her great love and compassion. Mom would often play along as if she knew nothing about my cookie stunts. Every now and again she'd openly "catch me" with a couple of chocolate chip cookies in my pocket and a mouthful of Snickerdoodles.

It never dawned on me until decades later that my focus as a child



was entirely upon whatever was directly in front of me.

Nowadays, although I am no longer an aficionado of cookies and have no clue whatever of what became of the Cookie Monster jar, it occurs to me that I have not changed much regarding that to which I fix my attention. We all do this as human beings, as God's people. Our eyes are on whatever we aim to obtain at any given moment: attention from an individual. more sleep, dropping a few pounds, overcoming a health condition, buying something we've had our eye on for a while, or even just having some time of quiet, alone. God has designed us to have our eye on something – on Him! When you and I put our eyes on God, on the Lord Jesus Christ, we become instantly transformed in our perspective. Suddenly, instead of eyeing an array of things,

circumstances or relationships, you FIX YOUR EYES ON CHRIST ALONE! The result? *Stress is subdued and "needs" are realigned to God's paradigm rather than your own or someone else's.* You become a person who is not ruled by impulses of the sin nature. You become a person who steadily – not perfectly – increases in peacefulness given by God's grace by the Holy Spirit. You become a person who chooses to seek Jesus' presence over a cookie feast!

What do you "put your eyes on" daily?

Tasks that are piling up?

Problems you cannot solve easily?

A new drill or home renovation plan?

Anything in your kitchen with sugar in it?

A fresh batch of bacon?

Jesus is calling on you to keep your eye on Him. He will take care of everything. He will clearly direct you so that you know what to do next and how to do it. "Eyes on me," He is saying. Can you hear Him? "Eyes on me. I will help you see that I am literally with you. I am the 'Hope of Glory' within you. Come. Come and keep your eyes on me." How do you keep your "eyes on Jesus"?

The Book of Colossians in the Holy Bible, chapter 3, explains how to come to this less stressful existence. As you read the excerpt below, keep your eyes on 3 things:

1) What does Jesus teach you about Himself?

2) What does Jesus teach you about yourself?

3) What similarities might exist between you and the Christians in Colossae that the Apostle Paul was seeking to encourage many centuries ago, as they were starting out and struggling to follow Jesus Christ?

"So if you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with Him in glory. Put to death, therefore, whatever in you is earthly: fornication, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed (which is idolatry). On account of these the wrath of God is coming on those who are disobedi-

ent. These are the ways you also once followed, when you were living that life. But now you must get rid of all such things – anger, wrath, malice, slander, and abusive language from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have stripped off the old self with its practices and have clothed yourselves with the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge according to the image of its creator. In that renewal there is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave and free; but Christ is all and in all! As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. Above all, clothe vourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms,

hymns, and spiritual songs to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him."

The Arrival of Hus

The village of Husinec is situated in the southern part of Bohemia near the Bavarian border. The Barons of Janowic built the Castle of Hus there in 1341. It was in this village that Jan Hus was born around the year 1372. Although from peasant stock, his parents' circumstances were favorable. Unfortunately, details of his early years have fallen through the cracks of time.

Hus studied at the University of Prague. Modeled after the university in Paris, it soon surpassed it and was considered the finest in Europe. There, Hus obtained his first degree in 1393 and obtained his Master of Arts in 1396. Hus was diligent in his studies and was granted a professorship there in 1398. Hus flourished and was elected Dean of the Philosophical Faculty in 1401 and Rector of the University in 1402.

This same period witnessed considerable confusion. A schism had torn the Latin Church in two. Two popes, one in Rome and the other in Avignon, each claimed to be the head of the church while accosting each other. The University of Paris protested and saw the need for reform. The University of Oxford also protested. Although Wycliffe had died, his writings were growing more influ-

ential. These writings made their way into Bohemia and were influencing the country. Adding to the turmoil was the death of Charles IV in 1378. His eldest son Wenzel proved to be a weak leader. Political power was exercised by those who ruled in his name.

These were the circumstances when Hus began his public career. Hus became convinced that there was dire corruption within the Church and that reforms were necessary. He searched for truth and understood that truth was to be found in the Bible. When Hus found no discrepancy between the Scriptures and Church dogma, he upheld the dogma. But when he found disagreement between the two, Hus rejected dogma and followed the Scriptures. Hus wrote: "I have made it a rule, whenever I meet a sounder opinion, to joyfully and humbly give up the one I previously entertained."

Hus now occupied a commanding position and a distinguished circle gathered around him. His most intimate friend and colleague was Jerome of Prague. Jerome was logical, an excellent speaker, and had studied at several prominent European universities. They and their other associates typically met in the home of John Protzwa of St. Michael's. These men not only shared a common philoso-

phy, but they were also distinctly Czech and looked unfavorably upon German Czechs.

On March 4, 1402, Hus, having been ordained, was installed as the incumbent of Bethlehem Chapel at Prague. As incumbent, Hus glimpsed the desire of the human soul. The position allowed Hus to search Scripture for truth that sanctified his heart more than it increased his knowledge. It paved the way for reformation. It was said that Hus "sacrificed everything, he sacrificed himself, in order to save souls." His favorite saying was borrowed from St. Ambrose -"Prayer and tears are the weapons of a priest." Hus was confessor for Queen Sophia, welcomed by the nobility, and loved by the common people.

In 1403 Zybnek Zajic von Hasenburg was elevated to the see. He appointed Hus synodical preacher and charged him to report any abuses. On May 28, 1403, Walter Harasser (Hus's successor as rector) called an academical meeting and presented 45 articles extracted from Wycliffe's writings. The articles were condemned, and the University was forbidden to teach them. This act, combined with Hus's new commission could be considered the start of the Bohemian Reformation. The first development was the correction of an abuse involving Communion. A report, spread by priests, claimed that their observance cured all manner of diseases. Pilgrims from surrounding nations poured in. Hus insisted that a commission be formed to investigate. The claims proved to be fraudulent and further pilgrimages were forbidden.

Hus next sought to purify both the life and doctrine of the Church. In the University, Hus brought forth an unprecedented love for Scripture. In Bethlehem Chapel, he discussed the essentials of Christianity. Hus carefully distinguished between the biblical and the dogmatic. In the synod, Hus exposed the vices of the clergy and gave every sin its proper name. Anti-scriptural practices, although timehonored, were finally being disclosed. Innovative ideas emerged. Man's responsibility to God began to outweigh his obligation to Church Hierarchy. Hearts within Prague, indeed all of Bohemia, were moved. Through Hus, the gears of Reformation were beginning to turn.



Granger Brethren Church Thanksgiving Community Service



God's Love is Math

Scripture: Romans 5:8, JEremiah 32:3, Romans 8:38-39

What is 100%? What does it mean to give more than 100%? Here's some fun math. Think about each letter of the alphabet having a value, with A=1 to Z=26. Using this

HARDWORK = 98 (8+1+18+4+23+15+18+11) KNOWLEDGE = 96 ATTITUDE = 100 BUT the **LOVE OF GOD = 101**

Hard work and knowledge will get you close, attitude will get you there, but the Love of God will put you over the top!

Love to Pieces

Materials: Paper, scissors

Write **God's Love** on the paper. Discuss how God's love is something we can all have, and we can also give it away. Show that the paper (God's Love) has 4 corners. If I give you one of my corners of God's Love, how many do I have left? Children will most likely say 3. Take the scissors and cut off a corner and give it to someone. Now count the corners. Say: I gave one away and not I've got FIVE! Continue cutting the initial 4 corners. Explain that you end up with MORE corners, not less, every time you give one away. The more of God's love you give away the bigger it gets!

The Science of Love

Scripture: John 3:16, I John 4:19, Romans 5:8, John 14:23, John 7:38, Matthew 22:37-39

Materials: Paper towel, red marker, ball point pen, water

Draw a heart on a paper towel using a ball point pen (not a marker) near the bottom of the paper towel.

Talk about how the heart looks empty and this is our heart before we accept God's love for us. Read John 3:16. Talk about what it means to demonstrate or show love. Read Romans 5:8. God's love doesn't depend on something we do first. God loves us so much. He doesn't want us to be without him.

Say: When we believe and trust in God's love, he fills our heart. Read John 14:23. Fill in the heart with the red marker. But we can't stop there. Draw a few more hearts above the first heart with the pen. Say, there are lots of empty hearts of people all around us. God wants us to share his love. Place the paper towel edge in the water. Read John 7:38. Talk about how God's love spreads to others through us as the red marker seeps to the empty hearts.

(Science facts: Absorption is seen in diffusion and osmosis as substances are transferred through cell membranes. In Biology, the absorption of nutrients into the blood is an example. In Physics, it is the light that is absorbed by an object and changed to heat.)



West Brethren Church Covered Entrance Dedication

A covered drive-up entrance has been added to West Brethren Church to make the building more accessible for all to worship, study, and serve. 
