

there is something more.

The true treasure that Mom left behind is her legacy of faith in Jesus Christ, her Lord and Savior, her best Friend, her Healer, her Redeemer, her Strength, her Shield, her Rock, the One Who Enabled Her to Soar on Eagle's Wings.

A life-enhancing spiritual practice for me has been to pray the words of the Holy Bible, inserting personal pronouns. In the Gospel of John, chapter 1, verse 14, we see that Jesus IS the Word of God. The verse reads:

"The Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us. We have seen His glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth."

When we pray the Word of God, we are approaching Jesus Himself and opening our minds, our hearts, and our souls to receive His teaching.

Take time right now to pray these words from the Holy Bible, from the apostle Paul's letter to the Corinthian Christians. He is reminding them what truly is treasure.

"But (I) have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from (me). (I am) afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be made visible in (my body). For while (I) live, (I am) always being given up to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus may be made visible in (my) mortal flesh... so that grace, as it extends to more and more people, may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God. So (I) do not lose heart. Even though (my) outer nature is wasting away, (my) inner nature is being renewed day by day. For this slight momentary affliction is preparing (me) for an eternal weight of glory beyond all measure, because (I) look not at what can be seen but at what cannot be seen; for what can be seen is temporary, but what cannot be seen is eternal" (2 Corinthians 4:7-11, 15-18). Amen.

Now ask the Lord Jesus to reveal to you these things:

- 1) Do I believe that anything to be treasured in me is a gift from You, Lord Jesus?
- 2) What treasures, gifts, have You given me?
- 3) Am I using these treasures for You?

- 5) Am I willing to believe the truth that the suffering that I undergo in this body is for the sake of others seeing You, Lord Jesus, in all your power shining through me?
- 6) Do I commit right this moment to not give up, to not be discouraged, to run to You for the strength and especially the JOY that I need as I move through these struggles that are temporary and momentary in view of eternity?
- 7) Teach me, Lord Jesus, to trust that You are preparing me for eternal glory. Receive this prayer from me now just as You did from a young boy's father long ago who wondered if his son could be healed:

"I do believe; help me overcome my unbelief!" (Mark 9:24)

When the Lord God calls someone home to Heaven, we often feel as if we are left with nothing of our loved one. We hold memories, but nothing compares to the ability to hear that person's voice just one more time or the opportunity to hold and be held by the one we miss so deeply. Then God steps in

and whispers to us through the words of the Apostle Paul that the one we love is with Him always. What peace! Paul shares this reality with us in his letter to the Roman Christians of his day: "For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 8:38-39)

I miss my precious mom, with her flowing blond hair, her affinity for leopard print and skills as an artist, and her heart of solid gold. Yet my grief has taken a new turn. I am healing more fully now, because my heart and my mind and my soul have caught up to what her Lord Jesus, my Lord Jesus, has been telling me since she went to be with Him:

The Treasure is the power of Jesus Christ surging within her and through her that overflowed to so many and continues even now as I embrace the truth that Mom knew well and prayed when she was well and when she was ill, with lavender scent filling the room as she sat with her Jesus in her Amish rocking chair:

Hus and the Resurgent Storm

The momentary calm that settled over Hus and the Czech Reformation did not last. The clouds of chaos and controversy returned with the Council of Pisa. Meeting in 1409, their goal was to end the schism that plagued the church. Their first act was to elect Alexander V to the papacy. Next, the Council deposed both Gregory XII and Benedict XIII. Although neither was willing to submit to the Council's decree, the newly elected pontiff was recognized by the majority of Latin Christians.

Tensions increased the following year with the sudden death of Alexander V. He was succeeded by Balthasar Cossa, a man of dubious character. Cossa assumed the title of John XXIII He was quickly driven from Rome by Ladislaus of Naples, a supporter of Gregory XII, who desired to unite all of Italy under his guidance. Formal curses between the rival popes were exchanged. These anathemas did not spare Ladislaus, who was labelled a "perjurer, schismatic, reviler, heretic, traitor, and conspirator."

During the crusade against the Turks, indulgences for sin were offered to those who participated in the conflict, provided financing, or supplied troops. A new crusade was now proclaimed against Ladislaus. The same indulgences would now be offered to those who made tangible efforts to oppose him.

The sale of these indulgences was entrusted to commissioners. Two of them. Wenzel Tiem and Pace de Bononia, arrived in Prague in 1412 armed with a papal bull. This bull was read in the churches. Purveyors of these indulgences sold them in the streets granting certificates of pardon to the masses. The receipts were stored in three large chests set aside for this purpose. In some cases, indulgences were distributed wholesale to the highest bidder. In what was viewed as a scandalous abuse of power, parishes and even entire districts were absolved in this way.

Fully aware of the risks, Hus felt he had to express his disgust directly to the Pope. In doing so, Hus realized

that he was placing himself in jeopardy. Although the church had lost a tremendous amount of prestige, appealing directly to the Pope would have consequences. Friends and colleagues would likely desert him. But Hus stood by his convictions. Believing that his objection to the sales of indulgences was correct and that God approved of his personal stance, Hus went on the offensive. He boldly denounced the sales from the pulpit. Drawing on his knowledge of Scripture. Hus preached on forgiveness – "From all this it appears, dear Christian, that a man can receive the pardon of his sins only through the power of God and by the merits of Christ. Let who will proclaim the contrary, let the Pope, or a bishop, or a priest say: 'I forgive thee thy sins, I absolve thee from their penalty, I free thee from the pains of hell' – it is all vain and helps thee nothing. God alone, I repeat, can forgive sins through Christ, and He pardons the penitent only."

Addressing the University on June 7, 1412, Hus testified that the sales were in violation of Scripture. Just three days later, priests encouraged their sales in their preaching. Three young men protested: "Priest, thou liest! We have heard better things from Master Hus; the indulgences are a fraud!" The three were quickly arrested and immediately sentenced to death. Hus, with over 2,000 students in tow, presented himself to their judge and pleaded that they be spared as their outburst resulted directly from his teachings. As these proceedings went on, a growing percentage of the city grew agitated. Officials grew increasingly concerned as the crowd around the place continued to swell. In fear, they begged Hus to pacify the crowd and promised to grant his request. Hus complied and the crowd dispersed. These same officials then demanded that the executions take place without delay. As news of this treachery spread, the **~**

mob returned. As their numbers grew, soldiers beheaded the three in the street. Their bodies were carried to Bethlehem Chapel. On the following day, Hus delivered the funeral service with all rites. In his sermon, Hus declared that they were martyrs.

Hus, like the Czech Reformation, was now well past the tipping point. As he had long surmised, his friends began deserting him. Some even became outspoken enemies. At the same time, he garnered additional support from the people and even some members of the nobility.

The storm had resumed with a vengeance, but Hus had already set his course.

When they see it, they can say: What do I need to grow in God? I need to read my Bible and say my prayers. Watch me grow! (This can also be sung to Frere Jacques.) Dear Jesus, please help me grow in you. Amen.

Make Some Dirt

Materials: milk, instant chocolate pudding, whipped topping, crushed Oreos, small silk flowers, gummy worms, one cup per child.

Directions:

- Beforehand, make the pudding according to the package directions. Stir in whipped topping and some of the crushed Oreos
- Give each child a cup. Help them spoon some of the pudding mix in the cup. Let them sprinkle some additional crushed Oreos on top. Tell them this is the dirt.
- Let them add a few gummy worms to their "dirt", then "plant" a fake flower. Another option is to glue the fake flower to the handle of the spoon and "plant the spoon".
- Talk about how plants grow and how God takes care of the plants as they enjoy their snack.

Grow in God

Object Lesson

Materials: a bouquet of real flowers, a potted flowering plant.



Directions: Show two sets of flowers. Begin with the bouquet. Ask them what they see. (Pretty flowers, lots of colors.) Allow children to smell the flowers. You can refer to Ephesians 5:2 (...and walk in the way of love, just as Christ

loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God). Repeat with the potted flower. Ask what is the difference between these two flowers. (One will continue to grow; the others will wither and die.) Share Isaiah 40:8 (The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever.) Remind children the word of God is unchanging). Tell children that we want to grow. We want to always learn more about God. Ask how we can grow in God. (Coming to church and Sunday School, reading the Bible, etc.) We don't want to be like the bouquet of cut flowers that will wither away, but like the potted plant that will continue to grow. Give each child a flower from the bouquet to take home.

Watch Me Grow

Materials: small flower pots, potting soil, seeds or small plants, paint markers.

Directions: On the flower pot, write Grow in God. Allow children to decorate their pot with paint markers. Once dry, plant seeds or a small plant in the pot. Tell children to set the pot in a place where they will see it every day.
