

John Hus Sunday By Jim Pokorny

On every first Sunday in July, members of the Unity of the Brethren observe John Hus Sunday.

It was on July 6, 1415, that John Hus, a priest and scholar in what is now the Czech Republic, was burned at the stake because of his outspoken opposition to abuses carried out by the church.

Guided by the Word of God and his conscience, Hus leaves us with a powerful example of faith and commitment to the Kingdom of God. We remember that example on the anniversary of his death.

Hus was not Brethren, but his life inspired the those who established the Unity in 1457.

Discipline within the Church continued to degrade while Hus lived in exile. The schism remained unresolved, corruption within the clergy spread, and wickedness among the laity was on the rise. Some called for the convening of a Council as a remedy. King Sigismund supported this idea due to his official position and personal beliefs. Pope John XXIII initially opposed the idea but was eventually swayed. A call was issued October 30, 1413, to convene the Council in the city of Constance on November 1, 1414. Sigismund invited Hus to plead his case before the Council and promised Hus safe passage, a fair hearing, and a safe return home should Hus not agree with the Council's decision. Despite warnings from friends, Hus accepted the invitation, desiring

an opportunity to officially explain his views.

In Krakowec, Hus composed a letter refuting the accusations of his critics. He also wrote a letter to his pupil Martin that was to be opened only in the event of his death. He then penned a letter to the people of Bohemia. It contained a request for their prayers and a plea to God to strengthen him to glorify the Gospel even if this should cost him his life. His friends covered the expense of his journey to Constance. At the same time, members of the clergy who opposed Hus generously contributed to the cost of his prosecution.

His escort to Constance consisted of Barons John von Chlum, Wenzel von Duba, and Henry von Chlum. The escort

also included Peter of Mladenowic, and Kardinalis of Reinstein, a priest and friend of Hus. Several others also took part. On October 11, the group departed Prague with thirty horsemen and three wagons. As the caravan entered German towns, the receptions Hus received were surprisingly friendly. Hus even met with clergy and persuaded them to post invitations on church doors for any who had charges against him to present them in Constance.

Hus arrived in Constance with his party on November 3. A large crowd was on hand to meet him. Hus found lodgings on St. Paul Street. The inhabitants of Constance also beheld the pageantry that descended upon them because of the Council. As a matter of course, they witnessed the arrival of both King Sigismund and the Pope. These were also accompanied by a vast number of Cardinals,

Patriarchs, Archbishops, Bishops, and Doctors of Theology. They also witnessed the arrival of nobility that included various Princes, Dukes, Counts, and Barons. Numerous merchants, artisans and visitors also descended upon the city. Available rooms were quickly occupied, so booths were erected outside the city walls to accommodate the growing numbers.

Pope John XXIII was notified of the arrival of Hus by Barons Chlum and Lazembock, Duba reached Constance the following day and brought with him the document guaranteeing the safe passage of Hus. In response, the Pope gave his assurance that no hand would be laid upon Hus. As for the documentation, there are differing views as to whether the papers guaranteed personal safety beyond the arrival of Hus. Regardless of the legal scope of the docu-

mentation or its interpretation, Hus did have the verbal promised of King Sigismund.

Although free to move about the city, Hus preferred to remain in his lodgings where he continued to prepare his defense. Enemies of Hus, including Michael de Causis and Wenzel Tiem, went into action. Stephen Palec, John the Iron, and others arrived shortly afterward carrying with them writings of Hus from Bohemia. Signs were posted throughout Constance declaring that Hus was not simply a heretic but an extremely dangerous one. False reports were circulated stating that Hus intended to preach against the clergy and that he had already

Rev. Whitney Amos (Pastor to the Pastors) Rev. Charles Amos (Pastor to the Pastors) Rev. Tim Chaplin Rev. Dr. Jerry Terrill attempted to escape Constance by wagon. The enemies of Hus also paid calls on members of the clergy clamoring for his immediate arrest.

On November 28, 1414, Hus received a citation to appear before the Cardinals. Baron Chlum was with Hus when the messenger arrived. Chlum strongly protested his departure, but Hus refused to disobey the summons. Upon exiting his lodgings, Hus found the street filled with soldiers who wasted no time. They immediately surrounded Hus and conveyed both he and Chlum to the episcopal palace where the Cardinals lay waiting. After a brief exchange of words. Hus and Chlum were left to wait in the presence of a guard. In the evening, a papal officer dismissed Chlum, Hus was ordered to remain, and the King's promises began to unravel.

Chasing Pop Tarts By Rev. Vanessa Mitchell

As a child, almost nothing could stand between me and a tasty Pop Tart, or a delightful milk chocolate Hershey's bar, or even a tray of fresh peanut butter blossom cookies! I was pretty much like a Bloodhound, able to discover sweets in the most elusive of places that my mom would determine. Now I did not have, of course, the ability to follow a scent trail that was up to 300 hours old, but I studied my mom's habits and figured out where she might be hiding the treats. I never gave up! I was proud that I never gave up! "Giving up" has developed a new meaning as I move through "middle age," however. I am thankful to God that He helped me give up sweets because they were too big of a temptation for me. Consuming them was (and still is) a sin because they stirred

up in me a desire to overeat, and then became a stronghold that rendered me without self-control when around them.

I'll never forget the summer of 2003, when I was in a JC Penney fitting room, trying on jeans just days before I headed to Paris, France on a full scholarship for a summer study abroad Master's program. Tears streamed down my face. The jeans were too tight. It wasn't about being a certain size, it was the fact that I knew in my soul that I had been abusing the temple of the Holy Spirit by overeating sugary foods for way too long. At that moment, in the awful fluorescent lighting of the dressing room, after years of tears knowing that my ongoing search for Pop Tarts and more had to end, the Lord my God whispered something

to me that is sweeter than any fancy pastry could ever be:

"...do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, which you have from God, and that you are not your own? For you were bought with a price; therefore glorify God in your body."

So I waived the "white flag of surrender," finally.

BIG MINISTRY UPDATES

We bought a ministry home/discipleship center - after looking for land for a long time, we decided it was time to invest the ministry funds into something we could use right away. We were able to identify and purchase a house in the beginning of May. We will be receiving it officially in August or November. The house will serve the Discipleship program we are planning to launch this year and enable us to train and equip Jewish and Arab young adults.

We added an Arab staff member to our team - one of our main goals and prayers for the past year was to add an Arab staff member to our team. In March, a friend of mine who has been serving with the Katzir youth camps for a few years contacted me and asked if there was potential for him to join us (we didn't even have to recruit someone!). full story in this

When we can see back the all years of our ministry, we may say only one word - ADVENTURE!

In February it will be THREE years when Covid came for the first time to our country. Till that time all was so easy, quiet, smooth and everything went pretty well. You all know what we are talking about - you had been in the same situation too in US.

We started to see big changes in the society. Many lockdowns, limitations, restrictions, and all this influenced almost every family. All Christians did PRAY for the END of the Covid depression, and each spring it really came.

But none of us could even imagine that we all will see something more terrible then Covid and it was the start of the war in Ukraine! Almost immediately thousands and thousands of Ukraine refuges started to come to Czech Republic. Also, we could see the huge wave of solidarity with Ukraine people. There was a huge money collections and huge finan-

cial support for Ukraine people. Most of the Czech people were involved to give, to help.

Stania and I were involved to help to the Ukraine mothers and their kids in Olomouc. The city hall in Olomouc did open a huge refugee center for Ukraine people where they could get all care and help for staying legally in CR. We still do co-operate with one church in Olomouc to help the Ukraine mothers and kids.

There is a Christian community center where they can come and get some more information, where they as Ukraine people can have a cup of coffee with something to eat and where is a good time for some fellowship too.

Many Ukraine mothers are believers, so every time there were prayers for Ukraine, for their families, who still stay over there in the war, and for all the needs they do have. Stania and others are doing a good job when leading the kids at the workshop to make some nice things for somebody who they love.

Dear Sisters and Brothers, today I would like to share with you some words and stories about Peter and his wife Ilona. I remember the time about 20 years ago, when Peter before he opened his heart to Lord Jesus was the

boss of the mafia in North Bohemia. He was involved to abusing and selling drugs, money cheating, beating people, gambling, etc. He did the ugliest things a young man could do.

In those days, the bad lifestyle really did press and pushed him down. He did visit all psychiatric clinics in that region, but nobody could help him. His wife did suffer terribly under him, because of his bad life and violence. One day he decided to commit suicide he cut his veins in both hands and wanted to jump down from the 10th floor of his apartments building. Before that he set the apartment on fire!

Because the main doors of his apartment were NOT fully locked, somebody came in and hold him not to jump down. The ambulance took him and put him to the psychiatric clinic. To make the LONG STORY short, he came one day to our church, a totally broken man. We all knew that he IS VERY DANGER-OUS PERSON; the Police department did watch him carefully.

BUT – a MIRACLE happened, and Peter did open his heart to Lord Jesus in trust! His apartment was burned out, his family - wife and kids were in the shelter and he was not allowed to meet them. He lost everything! But Peter was faithfully attending the Church meetings which we did have on the daily basis! Prayers, teaching, reading, encouraging,

Back to school with Jesus! There is a lot of excitement for each first day of school—new supplies, new clothes, new teachers... Every new school year is not only exciting, but it can also be scary. However, for some children (and adults), starting a new school year is also filled with some apprehension. Here are some activities to prepare the kids in your life for an awesome year! Each year is an opportunity to grow academically, emotionally, and spiritually. Also, let's all remember to pray diligently for our schools, teachers, administrators, staff, and children this school year!

Back to School with Jesus!

Game: Reaching Out To Others

Scripture: Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely, I am with you always, to the very end of the age. Matthew 28:19-20 Directions: Make two Xs (home base) on the floor, 20 feet apart. Form 2 teams. Each team forms a line 20 feet from their home base (X). Choose a disciple maker from each team to stand on home base, facing their team. Read the scripture. Say: Disciple makers, on go, run to your team and make disciples. Tell them about Jesus! On go, the disciple makers run to their team, grab the and of the first person and say: Jesus loves you. Be Jesus' disciple! They both run back to home base. This continues until all the team is at home base.

Discuss: School is a place we can tell others about Jesus. How did it feel to be a disciple maker? How can we tell others about Jesus at school this year?

Object Lesson: Containers

Scripture: But the Lord said to Samuel, Do not consider his appearance or his height, for I have rejected him. The Lord does not look at the things people look at. People look at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart. 1 Samuel 16:7

Lesson: Show a plain opaque container (filled with candy) and a beautifully decorated opaque container (filled with rice or rocks). Ask the children which one they want. Discuss their choice and why they made that choice. Ask: Why do we often judge people by the way they look on the outside? When you only look at someone's outward appearance, what do you really know about the person? What does God look at?

What's important to God-the way we look on the outside or the way we are in our hearts? Explain. Ask again which container they prefer. Look inside each container. Containers are important, but they're not as important as what they hold inside. Ask: How is that like or unlike us? Have you ever judged a person by how he or she looked on the outside? Explain. How can we learn to see a person's heart and not just the outside?

Lesson: Slumber Party With Lions

Say: Daniel had a slumber party with lions! Let's see what happens. (Read the story of Daniel in the lion's den.) That was a pretty scary slumber party! But Daniel prayed and God helped him through the scary time. God wants us to pray when we get scared, like the first day of school. And He will help us get through! Here's a song you can sing to help you remember to pray when you get scared. Object Lesson: M&M Prayer

As you eat your M&Ms, pray for the school year!

Green: Pray for the parents—to make time each day to ask their child about their day and for patience with homework.

Red: Pray for the school staff and volunteers—coaches, janitors, cafeteria workers, counselors, principals, librarians, administrators, etc.
