

Truth be told, the only key that I am familiar with is the one that opens my Mustang and the one that opens the front door to my house. None-

theless, I have learned over the years that God not only loves to hear me praise Him with beautiful songs, hymns, and Christmas carols (good any time of year), but HE Himself sings with JOY over us!! God sings with all His heart over you each day! It may strike you as odd at first- the image of God singing with JOY over youbut it is actually something that God does with gusto, loudly, like



a proud dad! You end up with a powerful 2-person choir, where daily, it's God and you, singing to each other! Take a glance at the Jewish prophet Zephaniah's illustration of the singing relationship that God intends for every human being to have with Him:

And I will save the lame and gather the outcast, and I will change their shame into praise and renown in all the earth. 20 At that time I will bring you home, at the time when I gather you; for I will make you renowned and praised among all the peoples of the earth, when I

restore your fortunes before your eyes, says the Lord.

Zephaniah was speaking to the people of Judah of his day, who had strayed from following God and were now receiving God's promise of forgiveness and restoration. How far had they distanced themselves from God? The Book of Zephaniah, chapter 3, verses 1-3 reveals their state:

"Ah, soiled, defiled, oppressing city! It has listened to no voice; it has accepted no correction. It has not trusted in the Lord; it has not drawn near to its God. The officials within it are roaring lions; its judges are evening wolves that leave nothing until the morning."

LOOK AGAIN at Zephaniah, chapter 3, verses 14-20, AND THIS TIME, SEE GOD'S FORGIVENESS & RESTO-RATION. SEE HOW GOD BRINGS IT TO YOU & TO ME (in parentheses), OUR REASON FOR SINGING WITH ALL OUR HEART TO GOD!:

14 Sing aloud, O daughter Zion;  $\rightarrow$ 



shout, O Israel! Rejoice and **leap upward** with all your heart, O daughter Jerusalem!

(God wants you to sing shouting and leaping with all your heart, because you are His daughter/ son!)

15 The Lord has taken away the judgments against you, he has turned away your enemies. The king of Israel, the Lord, is in your midst; you shall fear disaster no more.

(God has removed all judgment from you through the forgiveness you have found in Jesus Christ! God is with you, Jesus living within your heart! Fear is no longer your master!)

16 On that day it shall be said to Jerusalem: Do not fear, O Zion; do not let your hands grow weak. 17 The Lord, your God, is in your midst, a warrior who gives victory; he will rejoice over you with gladness, he will renew you in his love; he will leap upward over you with loud singing 18 as on a day of festival. I will remove disaster from you, so that you will not bear reproach for it. (God is working all things together for good for you who love Him, who are called according to his purpose. He is giving you victory in the precise situation where you now feel weak. He is renewing you by His love, leaping over you with singing and freeing you!)

19 I will deal with all your oppressors at that time. And I will save the lame and gather the outcast, and I will change their shame into praise and renown in all the earth. (God will bring His justice in


your life and in this world.)

20 At that time I will bring you home, at the time when I gather you; for I will make you renowned and praised among all the peoples of the earth, when I restore your fortunes before your eyes, says the Lord.

(God will bring you home and restore you in ways you never imagined possible.)

# Hus: The Beginning of the End By Jim Pokorny

Although it might be difficult for us to comprehend, Hus had been deemed a 'heretic' by the authorities within the Latin Church. Merriam-Webster defines 'heretic' as "a person who differs in opinion from established religious dogma." So, in the truest sense of the word. Hus was indeed a heretic. But true 'reform,' which the same source defines as "to amend or improve by change of form or removal of faults or abuses," requires someone to speak out and act. It requires a heretic. In the case of the Czech Reformation, that heretic was Hus.

While the Church firmly clung onto its authority and demanded its members to completely submit to it in matters of both doctrine and faith, Hus held that the believer has the rights of private reflection and criticism. The Church also held that any reformation must take place through its organizational structure, whereas Hus looked to the example set by the original Christian church according to the New Testament.

External conflicts only complicated the struggle between Hus and the Church. Among these was the hatred stirred by the clergy against Hus as he exposed their vices. Compounding this was the number of personal enemies Hus made in exposing the vices for what they were. Even the various schools of philosophy became antagonistic. Adding to this was the growing sense of resentment between Germans and Bohemians. This resentment only grew as many blamed Hus for the mass exodus of German students from Prague University.

After the hearing of Hus officially concluded, his sentencing was delayed for a month. Hus was returned to the Franciscan Monastery for continued incarceration. Hus entertained no illusions. He understood that his death was approaching. He faced that certainty with the strength shown by earlier martyrs as he calmly wrote letters of fare-

These and other final letters give us insight into both his character and internal strength. Two weeks prior to his execution, Hus wrote to his friends: "Oh holy Christ! Draw us after Thee. We are weak, and if Thou dost not draw us. we cannot follow Thee. Give us a strong and willing spirit, and when the weakness of the flesh appears, let Thy grace go on before us, accompany and follow us. For without Thee we can do nothing, least of all suffer a cruel death for Thy sake. Grant a willing spirit, a fearless heart, true faith, steadfast hope, perfect love, that for Thy sake we may, with patience and joy, surrender our life. Amen."

This period of waiting was granted to Hus as both King and Council hoped that he would recant, thus granting them victory. Many attempted to persuade Hus to recant during this period. In a final attempt, the King sent a final emissary in his name to Hus on July 5, 1415. Through it all, Hus refused to recant.

The following day, July 6, 1415, the punishment of Hus would be carried out. The Council met with all the ceremony it could muster. Hus was brought under guard and forced to wait while the Council finished mass without his presence. Upon being brought in, Hus was given the vestments of a priest and

immediately knelt in silent prayer. Even though the eyes of the nobility and those of the vast array of the clergy were upon him, he never flinched. As the first article was read, Hus was silenced. The readings, liberally sprinkled with false accusations continued, and Hus once more tried to speak.

The formal sentence was pronounced. The writings of Hus were to be publicly burned, he was to be degraded from the priesthood, and he was to be punished as a heretic. Hus pleaded, "Lord Jesus, forgive mine enemies! Thou knowest they have borne false witness against me. Forgive them for Thy great mercy's sake!" His ceremony of degradation was conducted by six Bishops who concluded with: "Now we see how hardened he is in his wickedness and obstinate in his heresy! We take from thee, thou cursed Judas, who has forsaken the council of peace... this cup of salvation!"

Hus replied, "But I confide in the Lord God Almighty, for whose name I patiently bear this blasphemy, and who will not take from me the cup of salvation, but will permit me, I am firmly persuaded, to drink it, this day, in His Kingdom."

But this was only the beginning of the ordeal that the Council had in store for Hus.

#### **NOVEMBER 28, 2022**

Dear friends,

We've already had our first big(ish) snowstorm, a week ago. All melted now, with temperatures a few degrees above freezing. Anne's a bit worried that her 35-minute trip twice a day might get complicated with winter weather, so pray for her. It is an AWD car with good tires, so that's what we can do about it. The rest is in God's hands.

This is Anne's first fulltime job (leaves the house at 7:15, gets back at 5) in forever. She is an educational assistant, helping mostly in grades 5-8. She finds it much more difficult to discipline

and maintain order, whether because the culture here is different, or she's not the "real" teacher, who knows.

I'm busy learning more about the indigenous (First Nations, the term in Canada) people and ministry possibilities. The situation is very complex with layers of experiences, conflicting histories, and hidden agendas. Anne and I are attending a book review for this whole month that explores, from the author's indigenous perspective, the foundational ideas that sustain the European colonization of Turtle Island (the term I keep hearing for North America). Look it up if you want an



idea of what this is about: The Land Is Not Empty – Following Jesus In Dismantling the Doctrine of Discovery, Sarah Augustine.

Last weekend we attended an event that gave space to indigenous leaders to express their views about colonization and the possibilities for collaboration and partnering going forward. The ideas seem to



center on building relationships and Becoming Kin (the title of another book I'm reading, by Patty Krawec).

That event started with a tactile exercise where we all (50ish people) stood on blankets of various sizes and colours spread out close to each other. As some leaders talked us through the history of Turtle Island from before the 1500s up to the present, others wandered throughout our area, pushing our blankets against our feet (reducing our lands), assigning death cards to others (representing sickness), and pulling some completely away and putting them outside the communities (for the residential schools). Finally, there were only about a tenth of us still on our blankets but ravaged by many ills and troubles. As the hour-long reading of injustice, marginalization and outright evil unfolded some people were weeping, others shame-faced, some unmoved.

In break-out groups afterwards, the commonest observation was "we never knew" and "no one told us this." I struggle with that since the information is readily available and constantly in the news. What is keeping us of European descent from seeing what is right in front of our eyes? That is my work for the next while, to understand better how people who love God and care about justice can be woken to the reality that is normal for many of the descendants of the first dwell-

ers of this beautiful land. Then, what comes next? That will be even harder, since good intentions and money (the go-to patterns of the past) haven't the best track record for fixing historical faults.

Thank you for your prayers for Anne and myself and the many layers of ministry and life (what's the difference?). We are thankful for your support and trust in us. Happy Thanksgiving to all our American friends, and an early Merry Christmas to everyone!

# Sunday School Helper

"and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The Mighty God, The Everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace" (Isaiah 9:6).



Names. We all have names. Some of us also have nicknames. We find many names for Jesus in the Bible. This month we will learn some of the names for Jesus. This year, each month will include a cut and tell Bible story! All you will need is a large sheet of paper and a pair of scissors!

# The Names of Jesus

**Materials:** scissors, 18in square of paper **Preparation:** Prefold paper figures 1 to 5. Unfold to fig. 6 and refold to 7.

**Procedure:** 1. During the lesson, fold on exact lines to figure 7 and cut on line FG making figure 8. 2. Cut out the shape of a heart (figure 9). This is best done by bisecting figure 8 vertically down the center. When unfolded it will be flower shaped (figure 10). 3. Refold figure 10 on exact lines and cut on line HJ of Figure 11 to make a star. 4. Fold star on line KL making a crown (figure 13). 5. Fold corners KL to center, making figure 14. Then fold figure 14 down center on line MN and cut on line OP to make a cross. **Lesson:** Jesus had some nicknames I am going to show them to you with this piece of paper!

1. THE GOOD SHEPHERD Jesus said, "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd giveth his life for the sheep." (John 10: 11) This square shape of paper reminds me of the sheepfolds of Palestine. 2. THE DOOR OF THE SHEEP FOLD THE (Fold figure 1 down the center and swing it like a door.) This is the kind of door you will find in your home, but it is not the kind found on a Palestinian sheepfold. Jesus said, "I am the door: by me if any man enter in, he shall be saved, and shall go in and out and find pasture." (John 10:9) You see, after the shepherd had all the sheep in the fold, he stretched himself across and became the door.

3. THE LAMB OF GOD John the Baptist introduced Jesus by saying, "Behold the Lamb of God that taketh away the sin of the world." (John 1:29). A lamb was often used as a sacrifice. Jesus became a sacrifice, so he was called by John "the lamb of God" because he became the sacrifice for our sins, (Cut out the heart) Jesus loved




us with all his heart.

4. THE ROSE OF SHARON Solomon called Jesus "The Rose of Sharon" and "The Lily of the Valley." (Song of Solomon 2:1) What wonderful nicknames Jesus had! (Unfold to flower shape.)
5. THE BRIGHT AND MORNING STAR (Cut and show star.) In the last book of the Bible, Revelation, Jesus is called "The Bright and Morning Star." (Revelation 22: 16).

6. THE KING OF KINGS (Fold on line KL of star and show the crown (Figure 13). Once they placed a crown of thorns on the head of Jesus because he said he was the King of the Jews. 7. THE SAVIOUR OF THE WORLD (Complete the folds of the crown and cut out a cross). Of all the nicknames, this is the sweetest of all. The angels said on that first Christmas night, "For unto you is born this day in the city of David, a Savior, which is Christ the Lord." (Luke 2:11). A savior is one who saves, and Jesus said, "The Son of Man is come to seek and to save that which was lost." (Luke 19:10). God said "The wages of sin is death," (Rom. 6:23). sau "The gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." (Show the cross.) YOU SHOULD HAVE A NICKNAME The name "Christian" is a nickname for all those who follow Christ. The Bible says, "The disciples were called Christians first in Antioch." (Acts 11:16).
