#### The Blind General

Wenzel was dead. Sophia had been appointed regent. But the defenestration at Prague was the point of no return. Sigismund was determined to crush all resistance in Bohemia by brute force. Calling on papal assistance, a crusade would now be waged against the Hussites. This was easier said than done. Even with the powers of virtually all Europe united, the Hussite movement in Bohemia withstood all who opposed it through almost sixteen years of bloody conflict which began in 1419, just four years after the martyrdom of Jan Hus.

The study of history reveals that when a movement finds itself in crisis, one individual arises that creates an impact on the balance of power. The Hussite wars were no exception, and the individual was a general by the name of Jan Zizka von Troconow. He was born around 1354 at Troconow about ten miles southeast of Budweis and amassed several estates.

His rank was of lower nobility and, according to some sources, he served under the King of Poland. He eventually found favor with the court of Wenzel. In time, he departed the court and adopted the Hussite cause.

As a general, he quickly established a reputation as both a leader and a tactician. Zizka was a man who could create armies and empower them through tactics the military world had not seen before. While he lived, he never lost a battle. His energy inspired peasants, mechanics, and artisans to arm themselves and join the cause. Sufficiently motivated and armed with lances, clubs, and slings, they began dispatching the better trained and armorclad knights of Europe who were called upon to oppose them.

The use of wagons became a hallmark tactic of Zizka. When not in motion, the general would utilize them as im-

promptu fortifications. Then, when the moment called for it, they would be set quickly into motion, circling the battlefield, and perplexing the opposition.

By today's standards, Zizka would be considered both fanatical and intolerant. He often made use of religion to arouse his men's courage on the eve of battle. Every coin has two sides. Zizka also had two sides to his nature. He saw himself as a patriot who sought to live a godly life. But during battle, he perceived himself as the avenger of the divine.

In July 1420, in a place now known as Zizka Hill, he and his men faced none other than Sigismund himself and his imperial army. Zizka's army was vastly outnumbered, but despite the

Sigismund fled Bohemia and the Archbishop of Prague came over to the Hussite cause. It was about this time that the Hussites established the Four Articles of Prague:

- I. The Word of God is to be freely examined by Christian priests throughout the Kingdom of Bohemia and the Margravate of Moravia.
- II. The venerable Sacrament of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ is to be given in two kinds to adults as well as to children, as Jesus Christ has instituted.

III. The priests and monks, of whom many meddle with the affairs of the State, are to be deprived of the worldly goods which they possess in great quantities and which make them neglect their sacred office; and their goods shall be restored to us, in order that, in accordance with the doctrine of the Gospel, and the practice of the Apostles, the clergy shall be subject to us, and,

living in poverty, serve as a pattern of humility to others.

IV. All the public sins which are called mortal, and all other trespasses contrary to the law of God, are to be punished according to the laws of the country, by those in charge of them, in order to wipe from the Kingdom of Bohemia and the Margravate of Moravia the bad reputation of tolerating disorders.

Zizka is said to have lost one eye in his youth and the other in battle. Even completely blind, he consistently proved himself to be a better general and tactician than any who opposed him. He remained undefeated until his death of the plague in 1424. According to legend, Zizka wanted his skin turned into a drumhead so he could continue leading men into battle. He is still considered one of the greatest heroes of the

Czech Republic. But, as a friend who helped spark my interest in church history once reminded me, there is nothing sadder than a war fought in the name of religion.



#### From the Thiessen's

#### **June 2023**

Dear friends,

It seems that part of conducting ministry in Canada instead of Mexico means I write more sporadically. But I realize that I should probably write more frequently, since it's harder for you to understand what we're doing. I know it can be hard to think I'm "doing missions" when people see me most Sundays at church service, or whatever the equivalent is for those who aren't here in the Niagara Region.

First, I want to write about the trip I took to Oaxaca in March. I visited the Sin Fronteras group and helped our protegees teach a week-long Acculturation and Disciple Making (Church Planting) seminar for five missionary candidates. I also got to see most of our closer friends and several sets of other missionaries we have mentored. And, of course, eat real Mexican food.

One time from that trip that most stood out to me was when Margaret, one of the students, took me aside at the bonfire party on the last day of class. She's Mixtec, about fifty, an abandoned pastor's wife (he ran off with a younger lady after twenty years of leading the church), short and stout, and with some really hard stories to tell. With sobs and tears she shared her reaction to an essay that had been assigned reading the day before. It was an article that Anne wrote six years ago, first in English, at the request of the editor of EMQ (missions journal associated with the BG Foundation).

She wept as she compared how much hope she received, in her mind straight from God, as she read the ideas contained there. It had a lot to do with that she could understand what was written, since it was in normal Spanish. She compared that to reading her Bible, which, as most "good" evangelicals in Mexico insist on, is in an antiquated (pre-King James) European version of Spanish, and how

little she gets out of it. The article is about God sending the Church to the Samaritans and how that relates to today's situation with the indigenous in Mexico.

Anne closes the essay with this line: "It is a day of Pentecost, with people laying down their possessions and picking up the languages of strangers to share good news." That is particularly poignant as I think about this coming Sunday (Pentecost) and the struggle (or the lack of it) to deal with our abundance and relative reluctance to share the Gospel.

Margaret was deeply moved because of her own circumstances and story, and like so much that is written, it may not affect anyone else that way.

That trip was a blessing to me in many ways and my friends down there indicated their thankfulness that I could be with them too. The fact that I am supported both by you all, and that Multiply encourages it, to make this kind of trip

speaks volumes to the "last and the least" about their place in the global Church, about how they are no longer a despised outcast group like the Samaritans. You may not readily understand how powerful that can be, so please allow Margarita's tears to speak to your spirit.

That is part of my present role as a missionary. I will try to make two visits a year, and I am in contact with many of my friends down there through emails and phone calls. I will write soon with more details of some of the rest of what I do currently. That will motivate me to write in far less than two months.



# God's Word is Sweeter Than Honey

**Scripture:** Psalm 119: 97-104

Materials: candy, Bible

Greet children with a mouthful of candy. Say: I just love candy, don't you? What's your favorite kind? Sometimes, if I eat too much, I get a tummy ache. What else can happen if you eat too much candy? (cavities). Do you want to know something that is really sweet but won't give you cavities?

Bring out the Bible Say: Now you can't eat a Bible! But you can read it. And as we read God's Word, The Bible, we can digest Scripture. (it loses its flavor) Sooner or later, no matter how good it started out, gum is going to lose its flavor. And all you are left with is a wad of flavorless gum and a sore jaw! Gum is a good reminder that nothing in this world will satisfy you for very long. We want something new! Think about when you get a new toy. What happens? How does that gum taste now? Is it starting to lose its flavor? There is one person who can give us joy forever—Jesus. He can satisfy the emptiness we all have insidé. He can give us contentment, pease and real joy. Joy that never goes away.



#### I'm a Dud!

Who had ever had Milk Duds? What do you think when you hear the word dud? Milk Bubds were named because they were a disappointment. The man you invented the milk chocolate covered candy wanted them to come out round, but they kept coming out with odd shapes, so he named them duds.
