Non-Voting (12): and 8 guests. Welcome and prayer given by Rev Larry Koslovsky.

Worship

Music led by Rev. Joe Emerson. Introduction of all Synodical Members. Meditation given by Pastor Tim Chaplin – Facing those "moment's" that scare us. How do we move forward as a denomination? We are afraid of the bridge before us and it's scary. God keeps calling us to the other side of the bridge, but we stop along the way because we are scared. We need to let God take the lead instead of trying to do it ourselves. All partook of Holy Communion.

Referendum Results (Attachment B)

All referendum items passed by the required majority. 4 congregations did not return so they were recorded as an automatic yes vote.

Motion by Rev. Mike Groseclose to accept the referendum results.

Second by Sharon Nelson. Motion passed.

Ministerial Requests

Wall – Rev. Robbie Price – Wall has issued a call to Rev. Robbie Price of Albuquerque, New Mexico, and requests that the Unity review process begin. Wall used Vanderbloemen of Houston as a search service. Rev. Koslovsky informed that Rev. Mike Groseclose, Rev. Joe Emerson, Rev. Larry Ko-



slovsky and Rev. James Hejl would serve as the credentials and examining committee and Wall would be asked to give a congregational response.

Rev. Price introduced himself: He was born in Bryan, TX but grew up in Albuquerque, New Mexico. He attended and was confirmed in the Methodist church. He went to TAMU but moved back to Albuquerque due to a family emergency. He completed his degree at the University of New Mexico and was accepted to Denver Seminary. He completed a master's degree in California from Talbot School of Theology. He served as a youth pastor in Albuquerque for about 4 years, then started a church in Albuquerque that grew to around He completed a doctorate 100. from Talbot School of Theology. His wife is teaching 4th grade in Wall, and they have 4 children. He was drawn to the Brethren Church motto as being unified in Jesus. He believes that infant Baptism lines up with scripture. He believes that the spirit calls and distributes gifts and does not distinguish between

men and women, so he is in agreement on ordination of women.

Examination by Credentials committee and Questioning by the Synodical Committee proceeded. This section was edited because of publication space constraints. For a detailed account of this examination, please contact Loree Lewis, Unity Synodical Executive Committee Secretary. Examination complete.

Bro. Larry clarified that the vote is to approve for six months of getting acquainted and then continue the process in six months.

Motion by Rev. Gerry Davis to approve the calling of Rev. Robbie Price to Wall and allow the sixmonth process to begin.

Second by Rev. Tim Chaplin. Motion passed. Noted that Brady is licensed to do communion.

West – Terry Crawford is retiring from education and wishes to be considered as a ministerial student. The West congregation is of full agreement for Terry to be received as a ministerial student. Terry will join the March Synodical meeting.

Terry needs to apply to seminary and the Credentials committee needs to meet.

Congregational Needs Discussion:

The Unity has financial resources at this time to look at ways we can do to build up the body of Christ. It's not a one size fits all for all congregations for the needs to grow. Taylor and Crosby are prime for a new church plant as the areas are exploding in growth. Caldwell, Dimebox, Westheimer are all needing a pastor and leadership as immediate needs. Rev. Groseclose serves 4 congregations. We need to plan for succession and emergencies.

Rev. Koslovsky suggested we ask congregations to submit proposals for matching funds supporting endeavors for growth. Finances that we received from Austin should not be used for buildings but rather for building the church in growth and spirituality. We might consider bringing in a consultant or trainer for pastors or lay leaders.

Broke into small groups for 30 minutes to discuss what God is

calling our congregation to do. Noted that Unity membership is 1462 for the entire denomination.

Thoughts from small group:

Rev. Emerson: Churches that can't afford to pay a livable wage to a pastor due to dwindling congregation. If unity could help support a pastor for every church that wants a pastor, we should.

Alan Haisler: Use existing facilities for reboot. Church is rebuilt off young families. If you supplement a congregation that's dwindling, you are just extending the end. Use facilities to start a second congregation or service. Where does unity think we have the best chance of getting new congregations started in existing facilities?

Jeff Garbs: Church members get burned out trying to do it all. Growth is through young families.

Sanda Stepan: Does the name Brethren Church discourage attendance? Do we need more education on who we are?

Alice Kocurek – We need to pursue technology more. Afterschool

The Emergence of Petr Chelcicky By Jim Pokorny

Unable to come to terms with Rome or unite the Utraquist Church with the Greek, Rokycana directed his sermons against Rome and its corruption and vices. Disregarding the Compacta, Pope Nicholas V sent Nicholas of Causa and John Capistran to bring Bohemia and Moravia back to the fold. Pope Nicholas V refused to sanction the Compacta and viewed it as a byproduct of a Council in schism. At this, Rokycana's sermons grew even more fiery.

But Rome was not Rokycana's only concern. In his eyes, sin flourished in Bohemia and Moravia. This, he concluded, was an unintended consequence of the Hussite wars. He concluded that these lands had lost the morality of Jan Zizka and the early Taborites. True, thoughts and discussions concerning scripture, the Papacy, the Church, the Lord's Supper, and the Cup remained

prevalent. But at the same time, sins and vices were on the rise and not all were performed in secret.

In Rokycana's view, the Hussite wars had not elevated the peasantry. Instead, they bound them to a heavier burden. Oppression of the poor, violence and theft grew more commonplace. Rokycana was critical of the upper classes, calling out their greed, pride, and vanity. Rokycana called out the clergy whose morals had degenerated and whose responsibilities became mired in confusion. The Utraquist Church existed, but it was not thriving. Disharmony existed. There were conflicting opinions regarding doctrine. Factions arose with each one claiming its views were correct.

False teachers emerged. Among these were the Nikolaites who claimed to have received direct revelations from God. There

Several secret societies also sprang up and organized in places like Wilemow, Diwisow, Saaz, Kolin, Konnigratz, Leitomysl and Reichenau to name but a few.

It must be stated that these unintended consequences came about because of the Hussite movement, conflict, and aftermath. They were not a result of the bold witness of Jan Hus. The Utraquist Church is but a chapter in the story. Those who were moved by Hus would find a new voice. This voice belonged to Petr Chelcicky and was to be found primarily on the written page.

Petr Chelcicky ranks among the most prominent of the Bohemian authors of the fifteenth century. Here was a man who possessed neither theological nor classical education. He was a layman from Chelcic who owned a bit of property. As events unfolded around him, Chelcicky observed them closely. Acknowledging scripture as the authority, he pondered current events with an inquisi-

tive mind and remarkable criticism. Here was an independent thinker with a talent for the written word. His skills were envied by the educated and sought out by those without higher education. His date of birth remains unknown, but scholars believe it to be around 1390. His personal history, by and large, is equally unknown.

Perhaps the earliest known fact about Chelcicky, places him at Bethlehem Chapel in Prague in 1420. There, he debated with Jacobellus of Mies on the inappropriateness of religion to appeal to arms. His writing career is believed to have begun between 1433 and 1443 through the encouragement of friends. Once upon this road, he never turned back. Among his greatest works were The Net of Faith, Postil (expositions on Gospel lessons), and The Picture of the Antichrist.

According to J. E. Hutton, Chelcicky explained the title of The Net of Faith himself. "Through His disciples," said Petr, "Christ

caught the world in the net of His faith, but the bigger fishes, breaking the net, escaped. Then others followed through these same holes made by the big fishes, and the net was left almost empty." His meaning was clear to all. The net was the true Church of Christ; the two whales who broke it were the Emperor and the Pope; the big fishes were the mighty "learned"

"Thoughtful Service --A Payne Family Tradition" West, Texas 254/826-5321 persons, heretics and offenders"; and the little fishes were the true followers of Christ.

His words leave no doubt that Chelcicky was a pacifist. "What is war?" he asked. "It is a breach of the laws of God! All soldiers are violent men, murderers, a godless mob!" he regarded the Hussite Wars as a disgrace to both sides. "Where," he asked, in his Reply to Rokycana, "has God recalled His commands, 'Thou shalt not kill,' 'Thou shalt not steal,' 'Thou shalt not take thy neighbor's goods'?"

In time, Chelcicky would have a profound impact on the eventual founder of the Brethren.

SUNDAY SCHOOL HELPER

You are the light of the world.
A town built on a hill cannot be hidden Matthew 5:14

We are called to be a light in a dark world. This month's activities focus on LIGHT. Whether we are talking Christmas lights, fireworks on New Year's or a candle when the lights go out, light is a wonderful analogy for Christians.

Are you a candle or a sparkler?

Scripture: Matthew 5:14

NOTE: This activity is best done outside at night!

Light the candle. Ask children if they can see the light. Talk about how Jesus said that we are the light of the world. Discuss what that means. As the candle burns, mention how it steady it shines and how it lights up the surrounding area.

Now light the sparkler. Talk about how pretty the light from the sparkler is. Play with it (draw shapes, etc.) When it burns out, ask what do we do now? Try to light it again. Explain why it won't work (we have burned up all the fuel). Point out that the candle is still burning.

Jesus wants us to be like the candle, a steady light for those around us.

Missing a Light

Scripture: Matthew 5:15

Preparation: You will need a strand of Christmas lights with 1 bulb removed. It needs to be a strand that stops working when a bulb is missing.)

Show the strand of lights to the group. Ask what you have? Talk about what Christmas lights look like. What do we do with them? Where can we see Christmas lights? Who likes to look at them?



Plug in the strand of lights. Discuss how the lights are not working. Point out the one missing bulb.

Read Matthew 5:15. Explain that this verse tells us that when Jesus lives in our heart, we have a light inside. We have to let this Jesus-light shine, not be hidden. Explain that when we hide our light, we break the chain, just like this string of Christmas lights. Ask what is brighter, one light or an entire strand?

Plug in the missing light. When we allow Jesus to shine through us, we make the world a brighter place! Have children list ways they can "shine".

GLOW

Scripture: John 8:12

Materials: Glow stick necklace, glass of tonic water covered with

a towel

Show children your glowstick necklace. Read John 8:12. Tell children that no matter how dark it is, Jesus' light glows, even if you can't see it! As believers, we also have this Jesus-light. Turn off the lights. Tell students that you couldn't really see the necklace glowing with the lights on, but now it is much brighter. Uncover the tonic water. Show that it is glowing too! Ask what would happen if I drank the water? Say: now God's light is inside me. Not really. You don't have to drink God's light! Jesus promised that his followers would be light in a dark world. When God looks at you, do you glow? Give each child a glow stick necklace.
