The First Years of the Unity By Jim Pokorny

In 1457, the ancient Unity of the Brethren was founded by Gregory the Patriarch in Kunwald. With the arrival of priest Michael Bradacius, Gregory and Michael worked in tandem. Looking to the Bible and the Articles of Prague, the pair drew up the initial guidelines by which the community would live. The name chosen for the community was "Brethren of the Law of Christ." In time, a new name was chosen, Jednota Bratrska, or Unity of the Brethren.

This community still relied on ministers of the na-

tional churches who shared their views. A new priesthood composed of men from within their own ranks was still some years away. That said, their next step was to elect twenty-eight Elders to function as the community's spiritual guides. Their names and backgrounds were covered in the previous article.

By 1458, the community began to develop at an accelerated pace. According to one source: "friend longed for friend and brother for brother, so that more persons continually joined the

Gregory's uncle, archbishop elect Rokycana, looked favorably upon the community. In his view, the inhabitants of Kunwald were simply trying to reproduce the ideal of the original apostolic church without severing ties with the National Church. This satisfied Rokycana as he also saw this as a means of maintaining his personal influence. This, and the fact that his close friend George Podiebrad occupied the Bohemian throne, added fuel to his personal ambition.

But by 1459, friction began to develop within the Brethren themselves. Ironically, this friction involved

the Lord's Supper. Some held to the Utraquist and Catholic view. Still others clung to the Taborite viewpoint. Disagreement over the sacrament turned bitter. Tempers began to flare and even led to outbreaks of violence within the community. As a result, the Elders convened an emergency Synod to settle the matter. The elders adopted, in substance, the teachings of Chelcicky: "All who receive the sacrament in truth, through faith, believe and confess that it is the true body and blood of Christ, according to His word and mind, without adding anything, or taking away anything, and rejecting all human explanations." This

Church Office Secretary Roxie Holik M-Th-7:45 a.m.-12:45 p.m. is according to a defense of the faith originally submitted by the Brethren to the Elector of Brandenburg in 1528 that cited the Synod of 1459. In other words, this meant accepting, in faith, the words of Christ without any need of explanation.

The Lord's Supper was not the sole focus of the Synod. Disagreement over the sacrament had been fueled by controversial works of the times. The Tracts of the Taborites being chief among these. The Synod deemed such writings to be unproffriction itable. The caused proved them to be damaging. According to one historical document, a formal declaration was adopted that stated the Brethren "should be satisfied with God's Word and simply believe what it taught, avoiding all Tracts; and that even such as seemed to approximate Truth ought not to be read until they had been examined by the Elders." This was formally adopted. Some eight years later, a letter was sent from the Brethren to Rokycana in 1468. In this letter, the Brethren claim to have set aside all such writings.

From these decisions, it

can be said that from early on, the Brethren chose to regulate their lives according to Scripture. They also made a determined effort to eliminate confusion and friction. More importantly, such moves would keep fanaticism at bay.

With the conclusion of the Synod, Michael Bradacius took two particularly important steps. He simplified both public worship and the sacrament of the Lord's Supper. These steps were also indicative of the Brethren leaning in a more Protestant direction where worship was concerned. Meanwhile, the Taborites have been facing harsh persecution in Bohe-

"Thoughtful Service --A Payne Family Tradition" West, Texas 254/826-5321 mia and Moravia. In 1460, a large group of Taborites were visited by Gregory near Kattau. Gregory was welcomed as "an angel of God" to unite with the Brethren.

And so, the initial years of the Brethren came to a successful conclusion. Their community was firmly established. Gregory and Michael established guidelines life in the community based on Scripture and the Articles of Prague. Twenty-eight Elders were elected from diverse backgrounds to guide the people spiritually. With their help, the Brethren managed to successfully navigate the waters of friction and contention that could ultimately destroyed them. But unknown to them was the fact that their First Persecution loomed just over the horizon.





SUNDAY SCHOOL HELPER





Focus: God makes a way where things seem impossible, He can do

big things.

Materials: The Parting the Red Sea Storyteller

Craft: Sea Sensory Bags

Directions: Put the gel/sand/rice in the freezer bag. Add in fish shapes. Tape the opening with duct tape for extra security. Lay the bag flat. Children can use their fingers to "divide" the


