The First Persecution of the Unity By Jim Pokorny

The ancient Unity of the Brethren was still in its infancy. The community had been blessed with leaders like Gregory and Michael. There were guidelines for life in the community based on Scripture and the Articles of Prague. Twenty-eight Elders had been elected to guide the people spiritually. The Brethren even successfully navigated the waters of contention that could have ultimately destroyed them. But unknown to them, their troubles had just begun.

Although King Gorge Podiebrad of Bohemia had a reputation as a just ruler, it was he that would become the first persecutor of the Brethren. Podiebrad ascended the throne as the result of the Diet whose members were Utraquist and Catholic. He took a solemn oath to uphold the Roman Catholic Church, obey the Pope and put an end to all sects and heresies. Upon his coronation, he took another oath to uphold the Compacta. On a personal level, he was determined to crush anarchy such as those brought about by the Hussite Wars. Podiebrad found himself in a difficult position. He had to obey two oaths while observing developments in religious and political affairs.

This opened the door to personal ambition. The German empire was in a state of confusion due to the weak leadership of Frederick. Podiebrad now set his sights upon being elected Roman King and, with that, Regent of the Empire. His councilor, Martin Mayr, suggested this. But for this to succeed, help

from Rome was required where Pius the Second was Pope. The Pope had visited Bohemia and was impressed enough by Podiebrad to see this as a means of bringing all under the Papal Hierarchy. In February 1461, Podiebrad returned to Prague after meeting with German Princes and Electors. He had not yet made his ambition known but he saw the prospect grow more possible even though he was not of noble blood.

It was also at this time that he received complaints from the Utraquist Consistory about these Brethren whom he allowed to settle in Kunwald. For one thing, they had changed the ceremonies of The Lord's Supper. They would not admit everyone to the sacrament because of their strict discipline. Moreover, they held secret assemblies. Neighboring parishes willingly confirmed these reports. Now, just as Podiebrad's aspirations seemed to be within reach, here were reports of new heresies

trying to gain a foothold within his kingdom. This outraged Podiebrad. He was further riled by additional reports concerning some students at the University of Prague and several fanatical sects wandering through the country.

Podiebrad determined that he must quickly convince Pius the Second that he meant to honor his oaths and that he would not permit either sects or heresies to exist in Bohemia. He immediately issued an edict commanding every one of his subjects to join either the Utraquist or the Roman Catholic Churches. Furthermore, Taborites and Picards had to leave the country, and many considered the Brethren to be Picards. According to the Czech historian Palacky, an investigation at the University began on March 15, 1461. This resulted in the arrest, imprisonment, and banishment of several students, professors, and Masters.

About this time, Gregory trave-

led to Prague to visit the Brethren. A meeting was to take place at a house of the Neustadt. Two Elders, Augustin Halar and George of Funfkirchen, and two students, George of Sussic and Peter of Ledec were to attend. The King was informed of the meeting and ordered that all were to be arrested and examined "under the cruel usage of the age." A friendly magistrate warned Gregory who advised the Brethren to scatter. Some heeded his advice. Others, mostly students, did not. They boasted, "The torture shall be our breakfast and the stake our dinner!" Gregory felt it was his duty to remain. Soon, the same magistrate entered with two bailiffs. He announced, "All that live godly shall

suffer persecution. You, therefore, who have gathered will follow me to prison!"

It was the rack that awaited their arrival. The previously boastful students began to recant quickly under torture. According to Plitt, "After having tasted of their breakfast, they had no appetite for their dinner." Gregory did not recant and remained firm. When his torture ceased, he fell from the rack in an almost lifeless state. His Uncle Rokycana rushed to the chamber upon hearing this and burst into tears and laments. Gregory was alive but he was in tremendous pain. The first persecution of the Brethren had begun.

Seaton Christian Sisters Supports the Bell County Rainbow Room





SUNDAY SCHOOL HELPER



Just like last month, this month is all about size. While we learned about the largest animal in the ocean, the whale, this month we learn about one of the smallest animals in the ocean—The Shrimp. Even though they are small, they play a big part in the ecosystem of the ocean. **Bible Story:** David is Anointed as King **Scripture:** 1 Samuel 16: 1–13 **Focus:** God makes a way where things seem impossible, He can do big things. **Materials:**

Have everyone line up from shortest to tallest. Explain that when looking for a king, everyone expects the biggest, tallest and strongest person to be picked. But God had a different choice. God cares about the inside, not how we look on the outside.

Open your Bible to 1 Samuel 16:1–13. Read or retell the story in your own words. Ask: Who did everyone expect Samuel would choose to be the next king? Who was chosen? Why was this a surprise? What did Samuel say about God's choice for King?

Game: Are You the King Materials: Small Crown

Have everyone sit in a straight line. Choose 1 child to be "it". Give the crown to another child to hide. They will be the King. "It" asks children in the line "Are you the king?". They can keep guessing until they find the King. Then the King gets to be it and choose another child to be the King. Continue until everyone has a turn.

Game: Gather the Sheep **Materials:** White balloons, fan, tape **Preparation:** Create a circle on the floor with tape. Blow up the balloons. They will be the sheep.

Tell the children, before David was king he was a shepherd. That means he took care of the sheep for his Dad. It wasn't an easy

job! Now you get to be a shepherd. Try to keep the sheep in the circle. Turn on the fan to gently blow the balloons around the room. Children try to keep the balloons in the circle. Play as long as children are interested.

Facts about Shrimp:

1. Shrimp is a decapod crustacean that is consumed by humans.

2. Shrimp are sometimes called prawns.

3. It's estimated that humans have been catching and eating shrimp as far back as 600 AD.

4. There are over 2,000 species of shrimp live worldwide.

5. Shrimps have diverse dietary habits. They use various feeding techniques to obtain their food. Filtering the water is a common method, where they extract microscopic plant and animal matter from the surrounding environment. They also scavenge for food by sifting through the ocean floor.

Game: Move Like an Ocean Creature

- Shrimp: moving back and forth with quick, twitching movements
- Clam: 'arms straight out in front opening and closing like a clam shell
- Crab: crawling sideways
- Jellyfish: bobbing up and down
- Turtle: using hands as flippers to swim
- Octopus: twisting arms around as if crawling along a rock
- Shark: moving steadily around with arms over head, head bent, and palms flat against each other
- Squid: moving in short spurts backwards and forwards




